

Have A Haunting Safe Halloween

A dark Halloween night can be a dangerous place for trick-or-treaters who roam the streets looking for goodies. By following a few tips from the Department of Public Safety, little ghosts and goblins can return to their haunts safely and with a full bag of treats.

"Many children and adults go out to enjoy Halloween without thinking about the dangers they face," said Col. Thomas A. Davis Jr., director of the DPS. "Drivers need to slow down in neighborhoods and watch for trick-or-treaters, and everyone should pay attention to their surroundings."

By following a few safety guidelines, trick-or-treaters will have a hauntingly good evening. Have a safe costume:

Avoid toy guns and knives - they could be mistaken for the real thing. Wear costumes that are light in color and short enough to avoid tripping.

Wear shoes that fit. Place reflective material on the

costume, so drivers can see you. Avoid masks - use face paint instead for better visibility and peripheral vision. Carry a flashlight.

Keep these tips in mind: Look both ways before crossing roadways. Always walk, don't

 Cross the roadway at intersections and crosswalks when pos-

training to help them become more competitive by attending the Texas Beef Quality Producer Program in Wheeler, Texas, on Tuesday, No-

vember 15. The Texas Beef Quality Producer Program teaches the principles of Beef Quality Assurance, a proven system of sensible management practices that help improve the quality and safety of beet, explains Dick Sherron, president of Texas and Southwestern

Cattle Raisers Association. "In addition, the program updates ranchers on changes occurring in the industry and what we must do to increase demand for our cattle. It clearly demonstrates how a producer's actions on the ranch have a huge impact on the final beef product," emphasizes Sherron.

Each session involves an intensive eight hours of training, divided into two levels. Level I covers BQA principles, industry update, marketing strategies, record keeping, environmental stewardship and proper management practices associated with genetic selection, cattle handling, culling, vaccine and drug use.

Level II provides a detailed explanation of the requirements needed to receive and maintain full certification as a Texas Beef Quality Producer.

"Certification recognizes an elite group of cattle producers who do things right," asserts Sherron. Cattle producers must embrace BQA methods if they plan on staying in business.

"Consumers-the people who buy our beef to eat-are telling us they want their food, not only delicious, but safe, wholesome and raised responsibly. We must respond if we want a place for our beef to go."

Leglislation On Gun Industry

Thornberry Supports Bill Preventing Abusive Lawsuits Against Gun Industry

With the support of Congressman Mac Thomberry (TX-13), Congress today acted to stop use of the courts to circumvent the legislative process and the U.S. Constitution on the right to keep and bear arms.

By a vote of 283-144, the U.S. House of Representatives approved S. 397, the "Protection of Lawful Commerce in Arms Act." The bill prevents the use of lawsuits against the firearms industry for harm caused by the criminal or unlawful misuse of their products.

"There has been a serious effort to bypass Congress and the Second Amendment of the U.S. Constitution through lawsuits against manufacturers and businesses. This practice is an abuse of our legal system and an abuse of the right to keep and bear arms." said Thornberry.

S. 397 prevents gun and ammunition manufacturers, distributors, dealers and importers from being sued over acts that involve the criminal or unlawful use of a firearm. The bill would also require that civil liability actions currently pending in state or federal courts be dismissed.
