Child Safety Seat Distribution

The Wheeler County Extension office is providing Car Seat Safety classes for low-income families. Participants will be required to watch a video and receive detailed instructions on how to install their child's car seat. After completing the class and signing the Child Restraint Agreement and Release of Liability, the participant will receive a free car seat appropriate for their child's age and size. Classes will be held November 15, December 6, and December 20. Please contact the Extension office 826-5243 if you would like to attend. The classes are limited on size so you must call to reserve a seat in the class. Classes will be offered throughout the year each month. If you cannot attend at this time, call the Extension office to see if other arrangements can be made.

The new law states that all children younger than 5 years of age (old law was younger than 4) and less than 36 inches tall are required to be in a child safety seat system. It also classifies safety seat infractions as moving violations for the first time.

Booster seats are considered to be child safety seat systems, as long as the seat is appropriate for that child—he or she should fit within the weight range stated on

the seat. The law became effective Sept. 1, 2005.

Campaign For The Twenty-First Century

Fayetteville, AR
The University of Arkansas celebrated the Campaign for the Twenty-First Century and its impact on academia during a graduate-style event Friday. More than 72,000 people and groups contributed gifts to the campaign, which raised \$1.046 billion in seven years.

The tangible proof of the campaign—132 endowed chairs for professors, the endowed chair professorships, 1738 scholarships and fellowships have been made available to students, along with \$296 million in infrastructure and \$191 million for campus programs. Dr. Robert J. Hogan Jr. of Mobeetie, TX holds the Harold F. Ohlendorf professorship in agricultural economics. The Ohlendorf endowed chair was made available for an extension and research program focusing on production economics, marketing, and farm management. Dr. Hogan works with individual producers, as well as leading economists from around United States, Canada, and Mexico.

E. C. 'Dick' Maddox Services At Sayre

Earnest Clifford (Dick) Maddox was born in Ringling, Oklahoma on January 20, 1919 to William Washington and Veda-Genevray Maddox. Clifford moved with his family to Doxey, Oklahoma. After graduating from Doxey High School, he served in the Civilian Conservation Corps. In November of 1940, Clifford volunteered for the U. S. Army when the first call was made for volunteers. He attained the rank of Staff Sergeant and served in the capacity of Acting First Sergeant during the last phases of the war. He was trained to be a canon mechanic but functioned in combat in the roles of combat infantryman and forward observer for the division artillery in Europe. Clifford, a veteran of the Battle of the Bulge and of other heavy combat, received various honors and was recommended for the Bronze Star Medal for his heroic actions while under heavy enemy fire. Clifford was a member of the American Legion.

While in the army, Clifford married Wilma Nell Walkup, also from Doxey, Oklahoma on September 4, 1943. Although Clifford worked in California and Missouri for a short time after WW II, the Doxey-Sayre area was his home. He worked most of his remaining years as a homebuilder and mechanical contractor. After retiring Clifford enjoyed several years of traveling and fishing. He especially enjoyed his and Wilma's travel trailer. Clifford was a faithful member of the First Baptist Church of Sayre and attended regularly until he was no longer physically able to attend.

Clifford Maddox passed away on Tuesday, November 1, 2005 at the age of eighty-six years, nine months, and twelve days.

He was preceded in death by his parents; three sister, Jettie Halford, Alice Duke, and Thelma Tucker; one brother, Austin Maddox; and one infant child, Judy Lynn Maddox.

Clifford is survived by his beloved wife, Wilma; two sisters, Margie Robertson and Francis Pounds both of Las Vegas, Nevada; two children, Susan Wood and husband, Buddy, of Wheeler, Texas and Roger Maddox and wife, Judith, of Fort Worth, Texas; three grandchildren, Deirda Ford of Fort Worth, Brandi Wood of Oklahoma City, and Cy Wood of Sayre; five great-grandchildren, Britannia Ford, Scotland Ford, Holland Ford, Madylin Hernandez, Katelyn Wood; and esteemed family and friends.

Services were held November 5, 2005 at 10:30 am at Sayre First Baptist Church officiated by Gary Bair. Burial was at Sayre-Doxey Cemetery under the direction of Rose Chapel Funeral Service.

Wheeler County Sheriff's Office Receives Grant

The Wheeler County Sheriff's Office was recently awarded a Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) Wave grant.

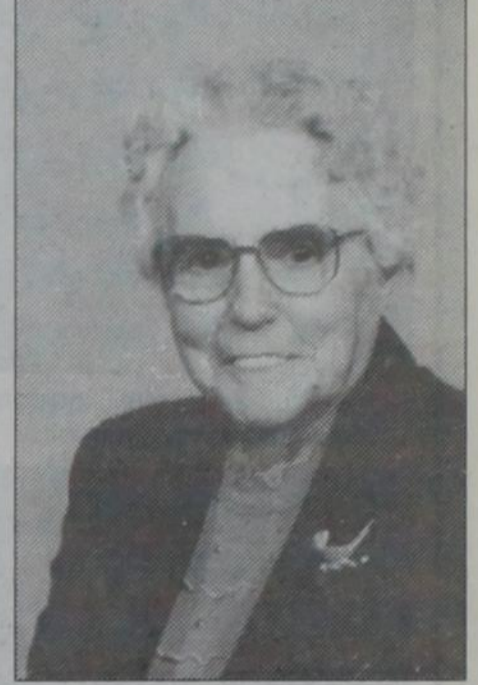
Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) is a grant provided by the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) to law enforcement agencies to enforce traffic safety laws, such as speeding. In these grants, Texas peace officers work primarily overtime to issue citations in order to enforce traffic safety laws.

"Drivers who routinely speed are responsible for their behavior behind the wheel", said Sgt. Jon Burrell, Wheeler County Deputy in charge of the STEP Wave grant. "The Wheeler County Sheriff's Department are not out to harass the citizens of Wheeler County, our goal is to increase public awareness of the dangers and penalties of a speed violation", continued Burrell.

The STEP wave will be conducted in six (6) Waves. The first Wave enforcement will begin during the Thanksgiving Holiday (November 21-27, 2005). The remaining STEP Wave enforcement periods will be during Christmas and New Year's Day (December 22, 2005-January 2, 2006), Spring Break Week (March 11-20, 2006), Memorial Day (May 22-June 4, 2006), Independence Day (June

30-July 4, 2006) and Labor Day (August 18-September 4, 2006).

"Even though our main focus will be on speeding, we will be issuing citations for all traffic law violations during the enforcement period", said Burrell. By consistently enforcing traffic laws, the Wheeler County Sheriff's Office hopes to impress upon all Wheeler County drivers the importance of safe driving habits".

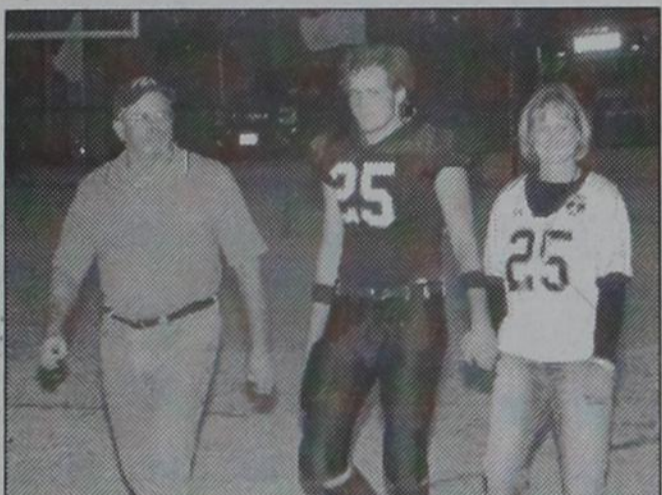

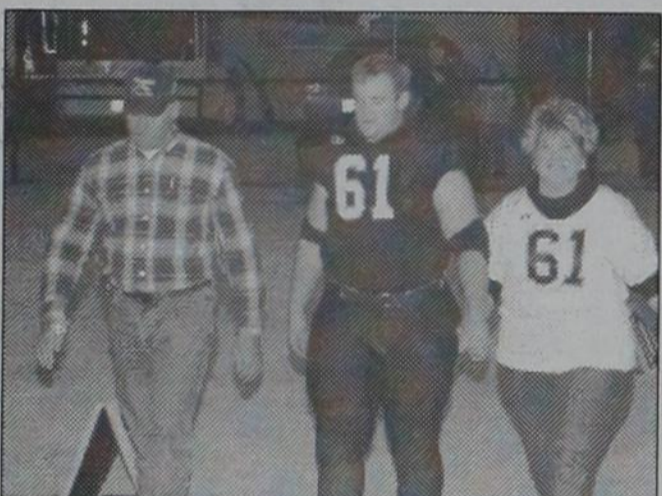

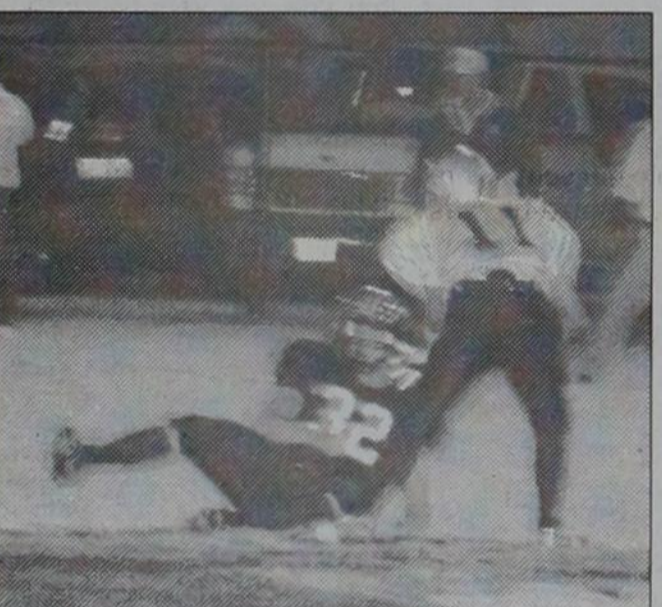

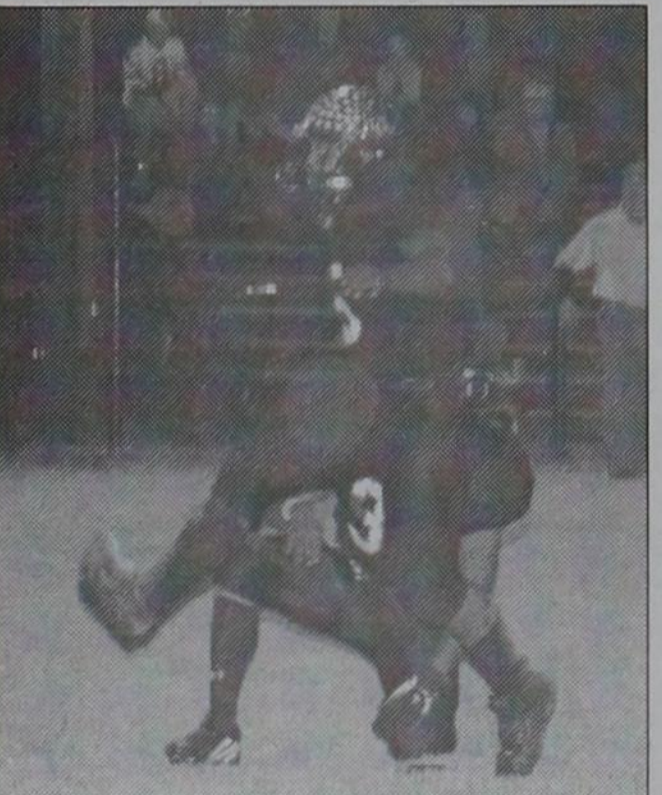

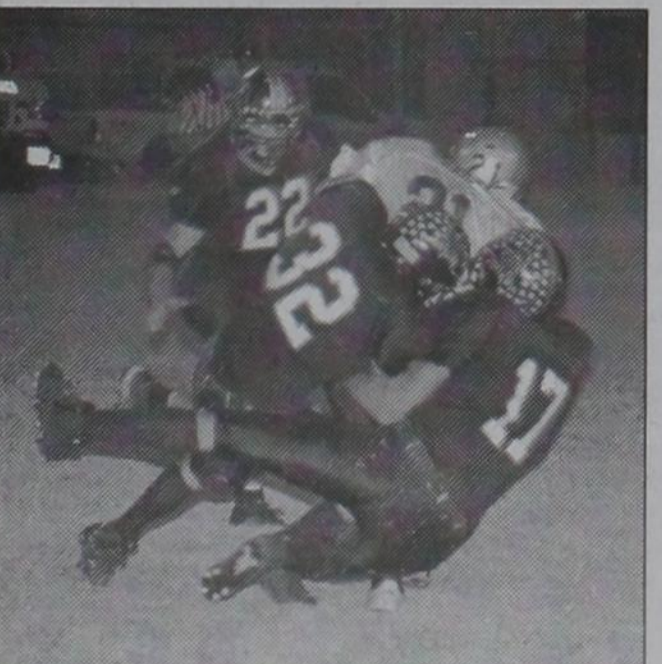

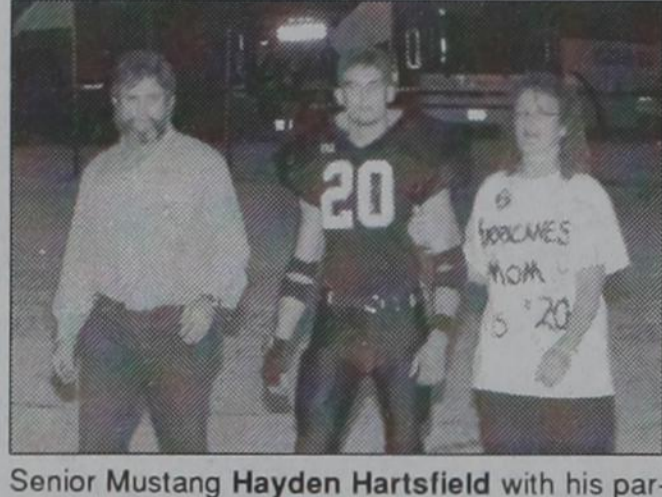
Ricky Salas, #5, kicks the extra point.



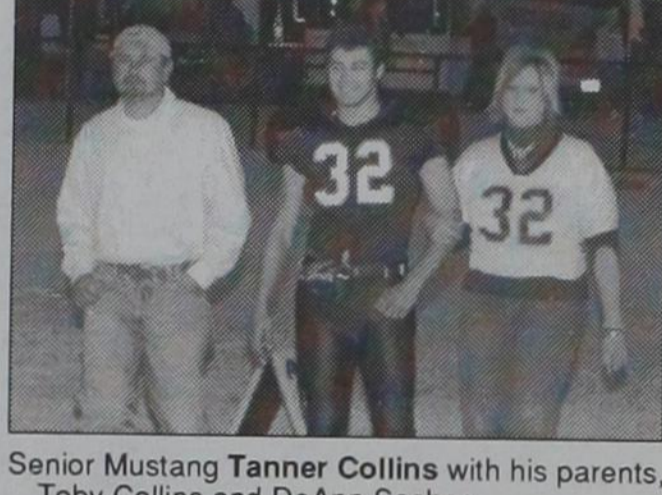

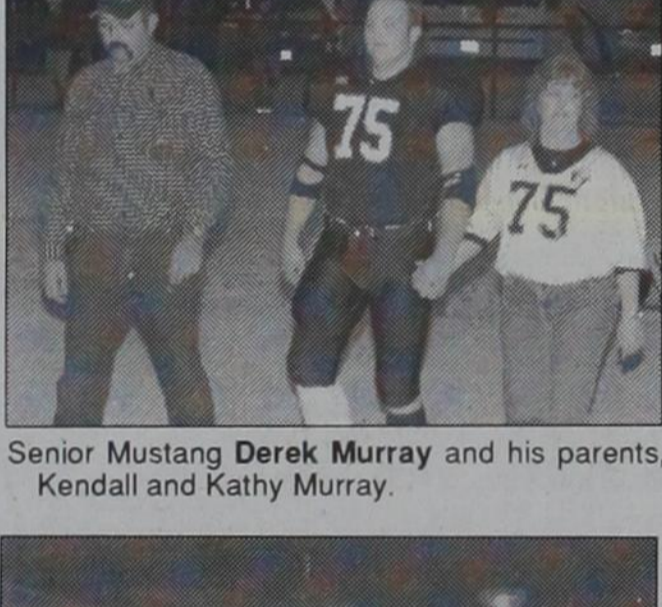

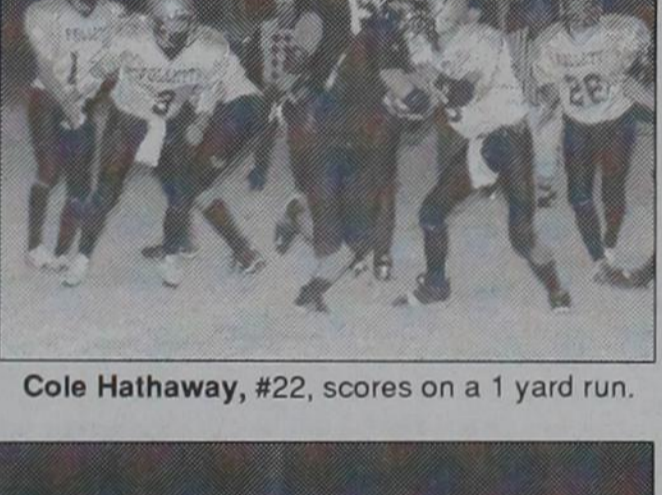

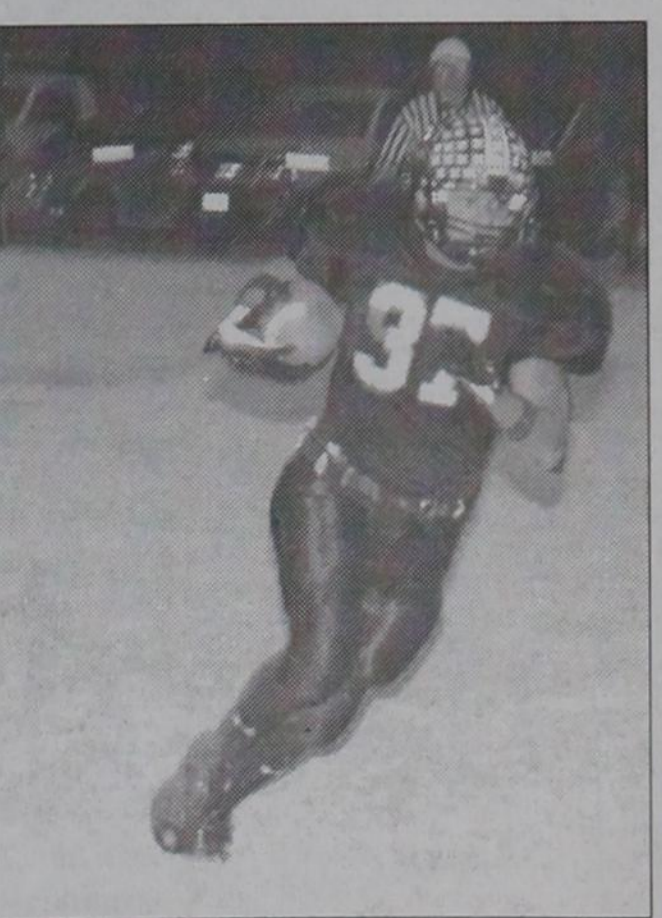

We are nearing an end to a Sunday night series on the book of Hebrews. What an interesting book of the Bible. In some regards, it seems as though it could be a very elaborate sermon. There is a progression of an argument that flows from beginning to end that is hard to miss. The people to whom this book was originally written were people who were not so sure if they wanted to follow Jesus or if they would rather stick with what they were already doing (which for most of them would have been continuing to stick with their Old Testament Judaism roots). So the author starts by showing how Jesus is superior to many good things and people that were staples of the old ways: Jesus is superior to prophets, angels, Moses, Joshua, priests, High Priests, and sacrifices. In every way, Jesus and what he initiates for the world (not just Israel) is superior to any other possible way of living.

At every step of the way, you can see the writer go back to the audience and bring them up to the point where they should be fully ready to embrace the Christian message. He even acts surprised when they need to spend so much time going back over things that they should have understood by then. And finally the author wants to encourage them. By the end of the book they should know how they should live. So the next step is to simply get out and live that way.

Although most of us today might not need to go through the lengthy process to understand who Jesus is or why he was our perfect sacrifice or why we should live a Christian life, the book of Hebrews is the place to go with someone who is still confused about all of these matters.

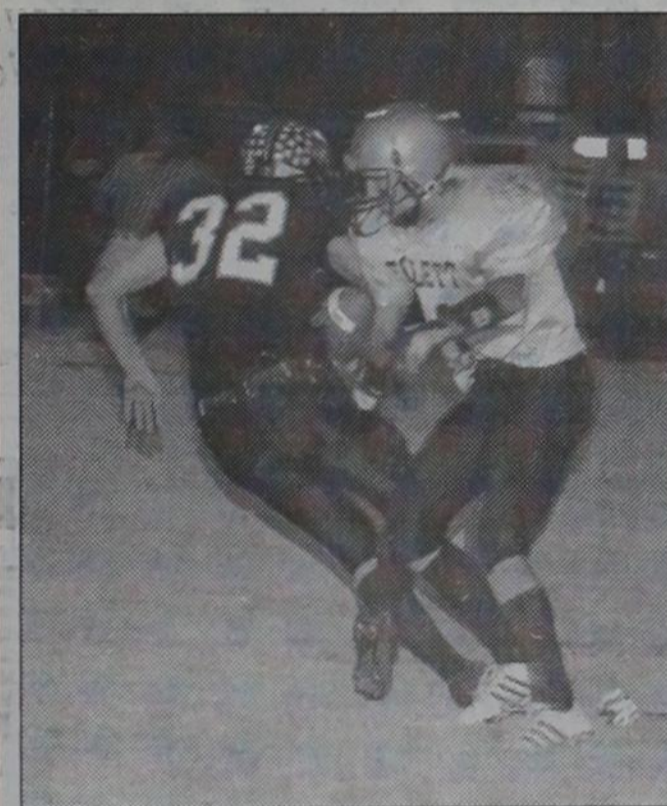

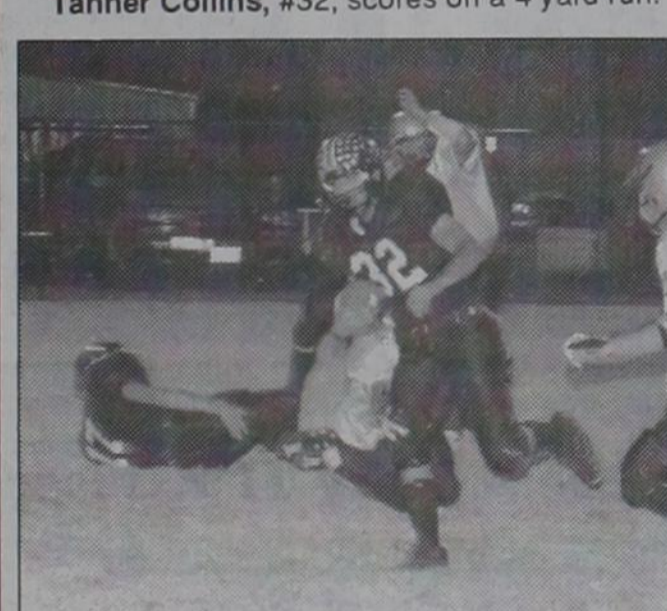

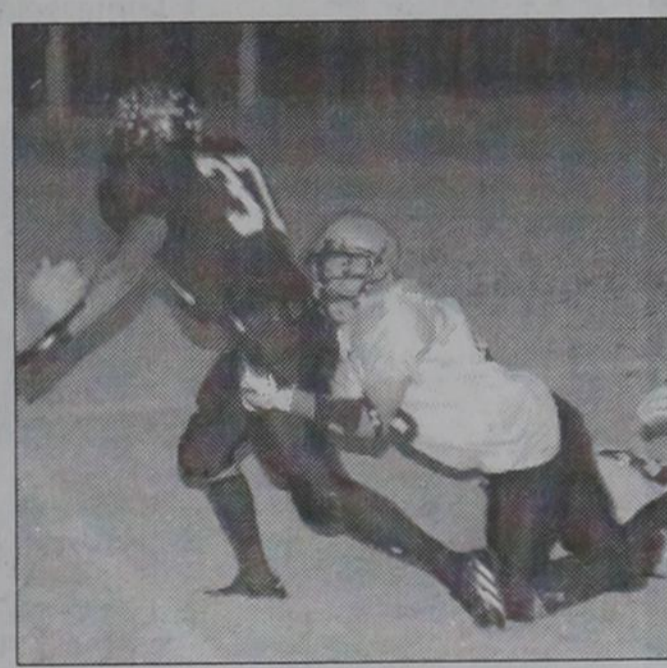

Due to vaccine being shipped to us in weekly partial allocations, it will be necessary for Parkview Hospi-

tal to change scheduled flu clinic dates to every Friday throughout the months of November and December, starting November 11, 2005. The amount of vaccine will be limited each Friday. High risk individuals should be vaccinated NOW according to Center for Disease Control. You may call Parkview Home Health each Friday or Sue Stiles or Vickey Nelson at Parkview Hospital for further updates on vaccine status. A list published in the CDC identifies in order of highest to lowest risk the following people:

1. Persons aged >65 years with serious health conditions (heart, lung or kidney disease, diabetes, cancer, HIV/AIDS, anemia or steroid therapy)
2. Residents of long-term care facilities
3. Persons aged 2-64 years with serious health conditions
4. Persons aged >65 without serious health conditions
5. Children aged 6-23 months
6. Pregnant women
7. Health care personnel who provide direct patient care
8. Household contacts and out of home caregivers of children aged <6 months
9. Household contacts of children and adults at increased risk for influenza-related complications
10. Health persons aged 50-64 years
11. Persons aged 2-49 years without high-risk conditions
