under 12 minutes in 11:49.0 and Haley finishing in 12:09.0.



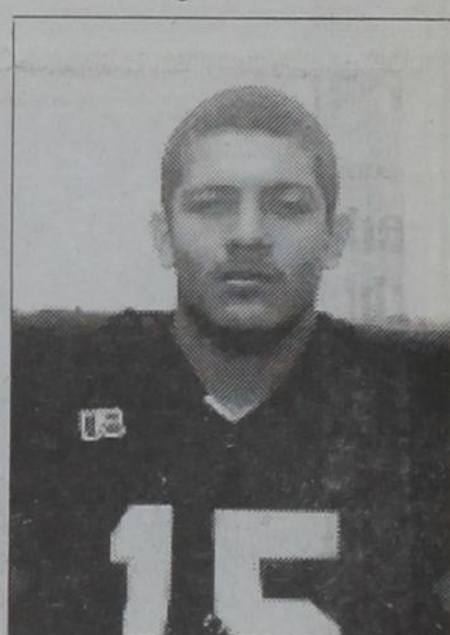

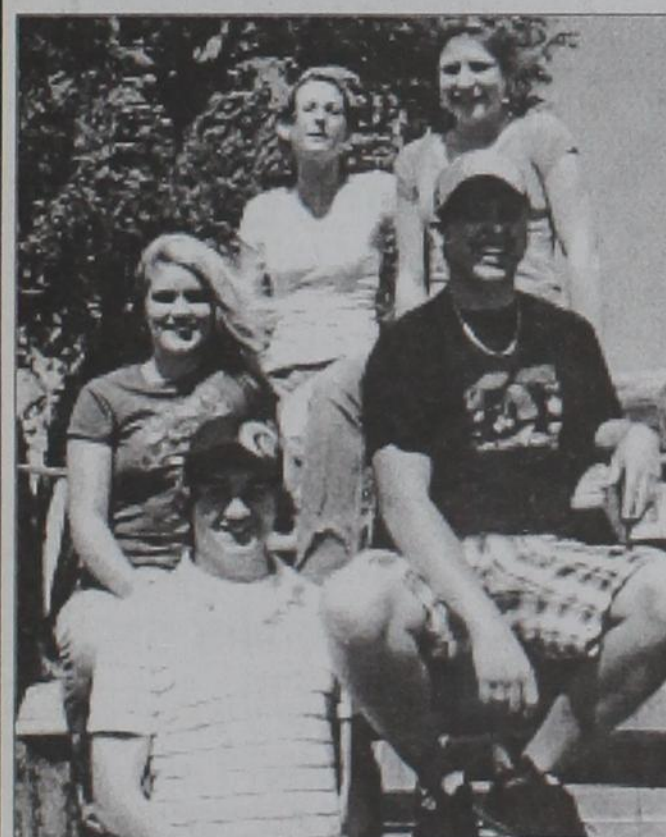
