### **Donald Rives Inducted Into The** Texas Tech Athletic Hall Of Honor

Donald Rives was inducted into the Texas Atheltic Hall of Honor in Lubbock in a ceremony on Friday, October 28, 2006, at the Lubbock Memorial Civic Center.

Donald was one of seven receiving recognition.

The following is a page from the program on Wheeler's own:

Don Rives came to Texas Tech from tiny Wheeler, Texas, with his twin brother, Ron, on the promise that if they attended the same college their dad would buy them a car. It was appropriate that the car was red and black, because Texas Tech was the choice over several-Big 8 and Southwest Conference

After a year on the JV, in which Rives battled a back injury and played four different positions, he settled in at middle guard and became a starter from day one on the varsity. In his first game, a win over Tulane, he had nine tackles and recovered a fumble. At Rice he intercepted a pass and returned it 38 yards setting up the only points in a 3-0 win. In the Sun Bowl against Georgia Tech he blocked a punt. For his work on the season, he was named to the Southwest Conference All-Sopho-

#### Elk City Student Is In Academic Program

Caitlyn Burch, a student at Elk City Junior High School, will join a select group of students representing their schools, communities and states as People to People student leaders. Burch has been accepted into the People to People Leadership Summit in Washington, D.C. on July 9-18, 2007. All students accepted into a People to People program must meet rigorous academic and leadership requirements. Burch was nominated and accepted for the honor based on outstanding scholastic merit, civic involvement and leadership potential.

The People to People Leadership Summits bring together outstanding student leaders from around the globe to focus on leadership, team building, community service, college admissions, and professional aspirations. Students work on an action plan to make a difference in their communities, develop skills to help them lead tomorrow's world, and build their college resumes, while earning academic or service-learning

Participants also gain insights to guide their educational and professional careers, and benefit from a strong focus on college admissions. Through workshops, presentations, excursions and discussions, student leaders attain a clear advantage as they pursue and fine-tune their selected fields of interest. Students will have the opportunity to meet with admissions officers and gain valuable advice for navigating the college application process. In some locations, students will be able to tour several area universities.

The program is coordinated by People to People Ambassador Programs to fulfill the vision President Dwight D. Eisenhower had for fostering world citizenship when he founded People to People during his presidency in 1956.

As a junior Rives exploded with 194 tackles for an average of 17.6 stops a game. Against Texas A&M that year he laid a savage hit on an Aggie ballcarrier which caused a fumble that he returned to the eight-yard line, setting up a Red Raider touchdown. However, his best day that year came against SMU as he racked up 25 tackles and was honored with the 1971 Peruna Award as the best Red Raider performer in the SMU

The honors continued Rives' senior year as he averaged 14 tackles a game, despite playing through some nagging injuries. Again he tormented SMU with 20 tackles, six of which resulted in losses totaling 42 yards. For his efforts, he was named Associated Press National Defensive Player of the Week as well as Sports IIlustrated Lineman of the Week. He also had 20 stops in the Texas game, and following the season he was awarded the Pete Cawthon Memorial Award as Tech's most valuable player

In addition, he was a consensus All-Southwest Conference pick and an Associated Press second team All-American selection at noseguard. He participated in the Hula Bowl following the season and played professionally for the Chicago Bears for six seasons.

A 1974 graduate of Texas Tech, he and wife, Sammye, a 1975 Tech graduate, have two grown sons, Chad and Blake, a daughter, Audra, and 3 granddaughters. Don and Sammye both teach in the Morton Independent School District in Morton, Texas, where Don also serves as the head football coach for the 2005 District Champion Morton Indians.

Dr. Herring and her husband, also a doctor, are also concerned about obesity in America. The Doctors through their studies have published a book on obesity entitled "Fast 5".
