Day Starts With Fun Run On The Square And Ends Dance At The Shelter In Park

The twenty-third 4th of July celebration will be held this year under the sponsorship of the Wheeler Chamber of Commerce. The activities start early Friday, July 4, with the Fun Run/Walk and ends with the dance at the park under the shelter.

Park activities begin at 10:00 A.M. Friday morning and continue to dusk with the free fireworks display. The third annual 1st Lt. Ben Britt Memorial Fun Run/Walk will be held promptly at 7:35 A.M.

Anyone wishing to have a food booth at the park this year for the

4th is asked to notify the chamber office at 826-3408. An effort is made not to duplicate; it is on a first come, first serve basis. The hamburger and sausage on a stick were open at this writing, as the Methodist Men will not have a booth.

The Fun Run will be under the supervision of Kenna Howard. Individuals signing up for the Fun Run early will be charged a \$10.00 entry fee; those participating without pre-registering will have a \$12.00 fee. Each individual participating will receive a t-shirt; those registering on the day of the race may have to wait for their t-shirt.

It is not necessary to run; many just walk and enjoy the fellowship of fellow participants. The starting point for the run will be the southwest corner of the courthouse square on Texas Street. Male and female participants will be divided into five groups: 10 and under, 11-18, 19-30, 31-55, and over 55. Ribbons will be presented following the race.

Registration on site will begin at 7:00 and continue until 7:30 at the southwest corner of the courthouse square.

Punt, Pass & Kick will be at 8:30 A.M. behind the old gym on Nicholson Field, north on highway 83, Ben Ed Hillhouse and the Boy Scouts have been asked to chair this activity. The event is open to any youngster wishing to participate, and sometimes, "not so young'sters get involved. The group will be divided by ages. Ribbons will be awarded.

Participants of the parade will line up in front of the Wheeler School, beginning at 9:00 A.M. The parade will start at 9:30 A.M. and continue down Main Street, past the square and then to the City Park. Prizes will be awarded for Best Overall entry, Best Auto Entry, Best Kind's Entry, Best Horse Entry, Best Kid's Costume and Best Float. The parade is being sponsored by the Wheeler FFA and Ft. The Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in Special Session on the above date with the following members in attendance: Judge Jerry Dan Hefley, Presiding Officer; Daryl Snelgrooves, Commissioner Pct. 1; Tom Puryear, Commissioner Pct. 2; Hubert Moore, Commissioner Pct. 3, and John Walker, Commissioner, Pct. 4.

The following members of the public sector were in attendance: Dan Chavana, Brian Taylor, Brian McGregor and Leslie Breeding representing Contract Land Staff/ Mesa Power and Earl Seitz, Dean Seitz, James Gatlin, Richard Porter, Harry Sims, Randy McCurley and Liz Shipp, landowners.

Court was opened with a prayer, offered by Hubert Moore.

AMEC Earth & Environmental Inc.—Conducting Exploratory Drilling Program on County Road Right of Way

Mr. Dan Chavana, Right of Way Project Manager, addressed the court concerning the intentions of Mesa Power to drill and take core samples in the county road rights of way.

After discussion by the commissioners, Daryl Snelgrooves made a motion which was seconded by Hubert Moore to NOT allow any drilling on county road rights of way and require the company to negotiate with the land owners for permission to conduct drilling on their property. Voting FOR: Commissioner Snelgrooves, Commissioner Puryear, Commissioner Moore and Commissioner Walker. Voting AGAINST: None. Motion carried unanimously.

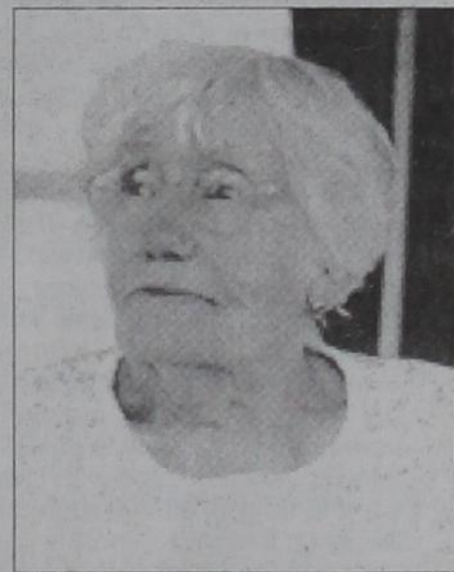

Jeff Simmons, San Antonio TX, has been the leader of The Star Canyon Band since its inception in 1987. Having played music for what seems like "forever", Jeff plays guitar and sings lead and harmony in The Star Canyon Band. Born in Virginia, his music career began in the country music field, later taking the Nashville route where he shared stages with some of "the best" before converting to bluegrass music in the early 1980s.

Carl Josefy, from Altus OK, has been playing and singing bluegrass music for over 25 years. He plays mandolin, guitar and bass and sings tenor, lead, alto and (sometimes) bass vocals. Carl

was a founding member of "Truevine", a contemporary Christian music group playing churches and other events.

Tim Tynes, Burleson TX, is accomplished on banjo, guitar and dobro, and shares vocal responsibilities. During his 31 years of music experience, Tim has played in several bands, taught banjo, and assisted with area banjo workshops.

Eddie Stroud, Glen Rose TX, is an excellent bassist and sings lead and harmony. He has been playing music for 18 years — starting out on guitar and later learning to play bass.

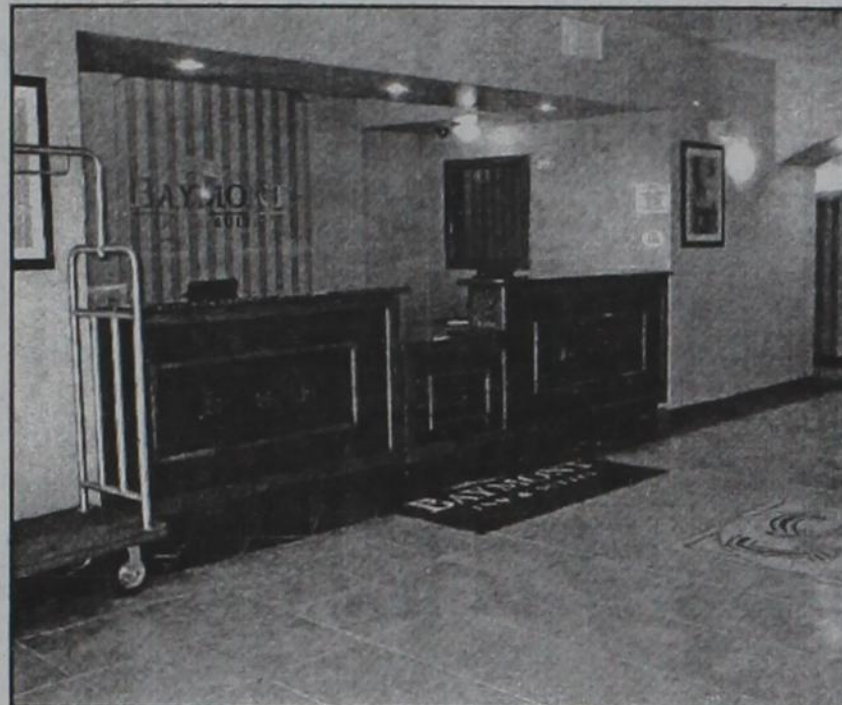

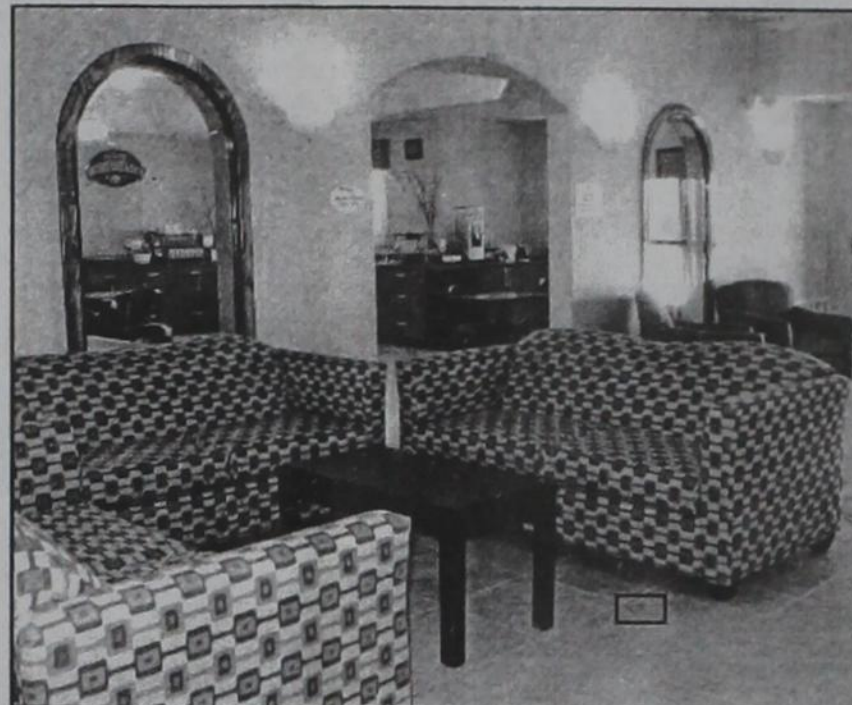

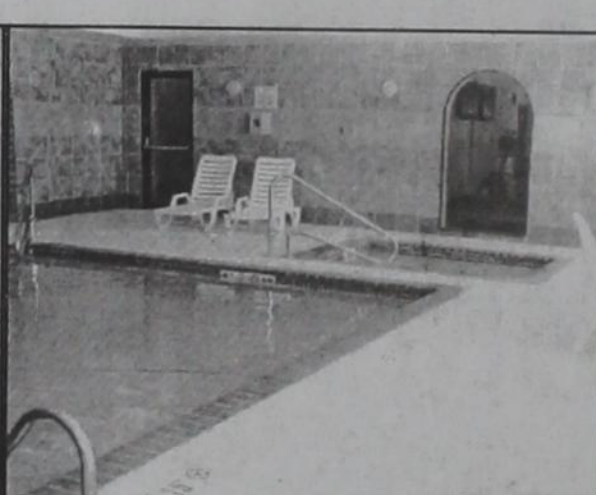

Tuesday, I had a quick visit with Tom Frye and his "harem" at Parkview Assisted Living. It's good to see that they all have a good sense of humor.

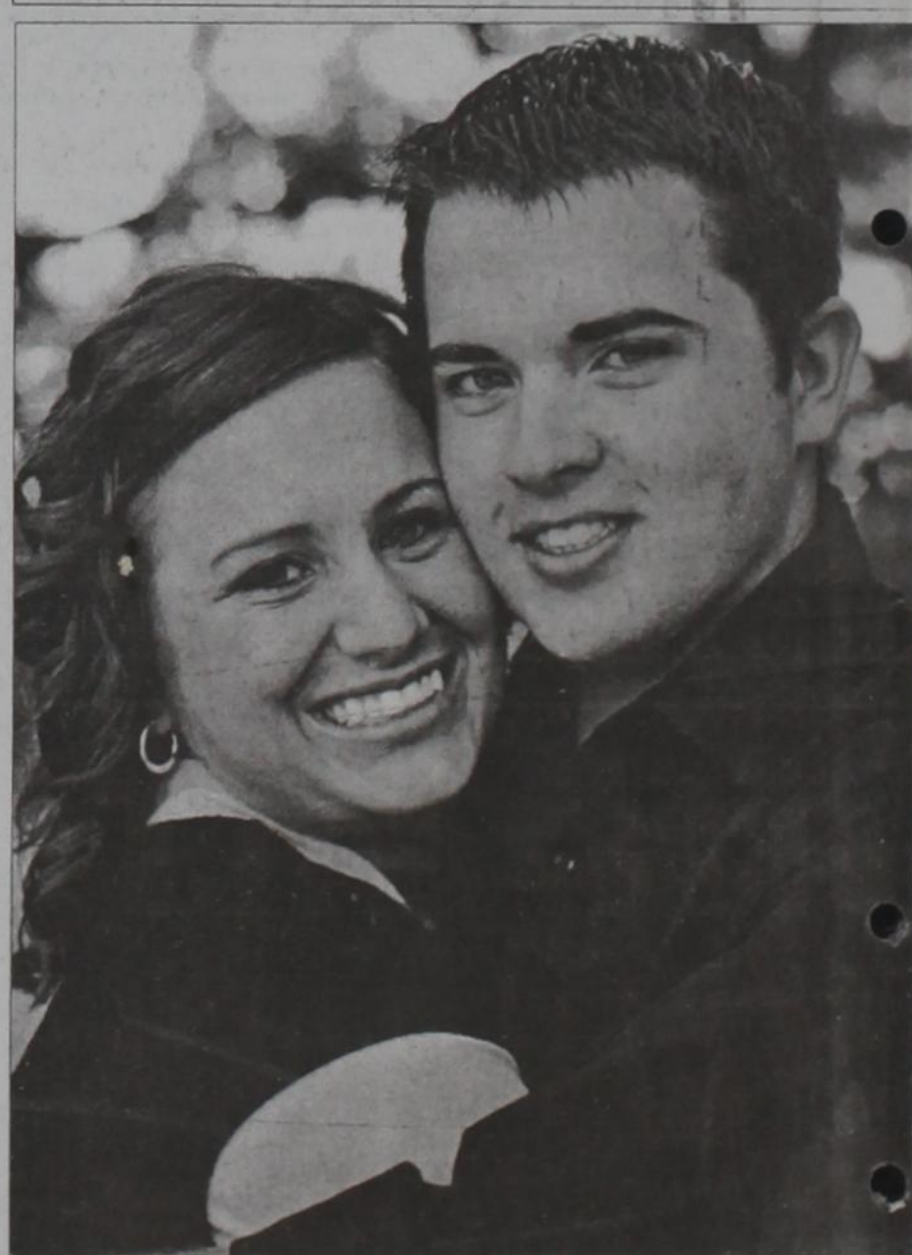

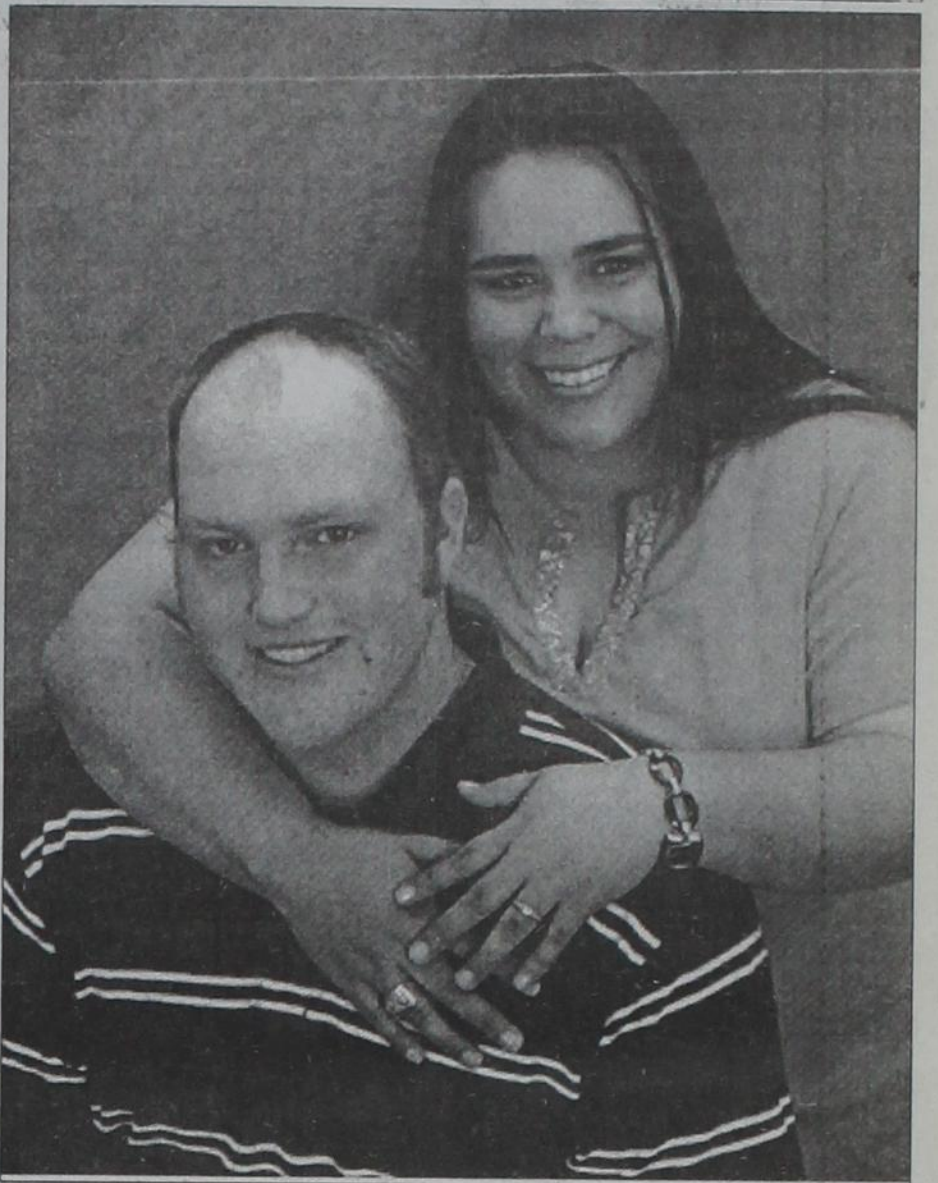

across the lake, we heard howler monkeys in the forest. Later, we hiked down to La Fortuna Falls, which is about 800 steps down. Students enjoyed the clear, beautiful water at the bottom of the falls. The reward for completing all of this activity was two hours at the fabulous hot springs of La Fortuna. We were able to soak away our sore muscles.

Ranching Workshop Aimed At Improving Wildlife Habitat

All the tools may be in place for ranchers to make more money off their land, they just need to learn how to diversify and utilize what is there, said Texas AgriLife Extension Service agents.

A workshop, Ranching Aimed at Wildlife Habitat Improvement and Diversification of Enterprises, known as the RAWHIDE program, will be held on July 17 in the Miami School Cafeteria in Miami. It is co-sponsored by AgriLife Extension in Roberts and Hemphill counties.

The event is to help producers see the value of diversifying their operations while keeping their primary focus on ranching, said Brandon Dukes, AgriLife Extension agriculture and natural resources agent in Roberts County.

"It will identify strategies producers can utilize in an effort to tap all available resources on their ranch," Dukes said.

There is no registration fee, and a free lunch will be provided. Participants will have the opportunity

Food Management Course Is Offered

The typical American household spends an average of \$2,634 on food away from home each year.

To assist area food establishments in providing food that is safe for their customers, Texas AgriLife Extension Service officials from Sherman and Potter counties are offering a one-day food manager certification training course.

"Food Safety: It's Our Business" will be offered July 2 at the AgriLife Extension office in Potter County at 3301 E. 10th Street in Amarillo. Registration deadline is June 30.

Food establishments are required by law to have one certified food manager employed, said Sue Church, AgriLife Extension family and consumer science agent in Potter County. If successfully completed, this course meets the state requirement.

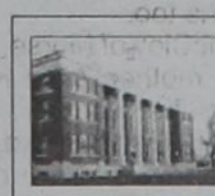
Included with the training will be materials and the state food manager certification examination. Cost of the course is \$79. For those individuals wanting to test only, the cost is \$50.

Food-borne illnesses affecting an establishment are estimated to cost thousands of dollars in lost wages, insurance and medical bills, Church said.

By attending the course, foodservice managers will learn about:

- Identifying potentially hazardous foods and common errors in food handling.
- Preventing contamination and cross-contamination of food.
- Teaching and encouraging personal hygiene for employees.
- Complying with government regulations.
- Maintaining clean utensils, equipment and surroundings.
- Controlling pests.

GPRMC Will Offer 'Hospitalist' Prog.

Improved patient care will be the key goal of a new program adopted by Great Plains Regional Medical Center.

Called a "hospitalist" program, the plan is to have physicians on staff that only treat patients who have been admitted to the hospital. The program will begin on July 1st of this year.

Hospitalists are internal medicine physicians responsible for coordinating a patient's hospital stay. Their goal is to improve the quality, efficiency and safety of care and to improve communication with patients and families.

"These doctors have no offices or patients outside the hospital," said Robin E. Lake, CEO of GPRMC. "They are in the hospital 24 hours a day. They will be able to see patients multiple times every day. They can respond to urgent patient needs in minutes and are available to order lab work, x-rays and other tests and procedures, see the results when they're available and react to those results immediately."

The hospitalist does not replace a patient's personal physician. Lake says the hospitalist will stay in close contact with patients, their families and their family doctor. He calls the hospitalist another integral part of the care giving team at GPRMC.
