Free Type 2 Diabetes Classes Scheduled; Registration Open

Type 2 diabetes is a growing concern for Texans - more than one million people in Texas have diabetes. Another 500,000 individuals have the disease but are unaware of their condition. Type 2 diabetes represents approximately 95% of all diabetes in Texas. To meet the growing need for education Texas Cooperative Extension created Do Well, Be Well with Diabetes for people with type 2 diabetes and this program will be offered in Wheeler County. Texas Cooperative Extension-Wheeler County is sponsoring the

Do Well, Be Well with Diabetes program, and the program will be starting Monday, October 16th at 6:00pm at the Wheeler Church of Christ Activity Center.

Do Well, Be Well with Diabetes has twelve topics designed to educate people on learning what to eat, what portions of each type of food to choose, how to increase physical activity, and how to manage sometimes very difficult medicine regimens. The program is open to anyone interested in learning more about managing and preventing diabetes and is free of charge. Classes will be held on Monday's for six weeks to cover all twelve topics. Oct. 16, 23, 30, Nov. 13, 20, and Dec. 4 from 6:00pm - 8:00pm.

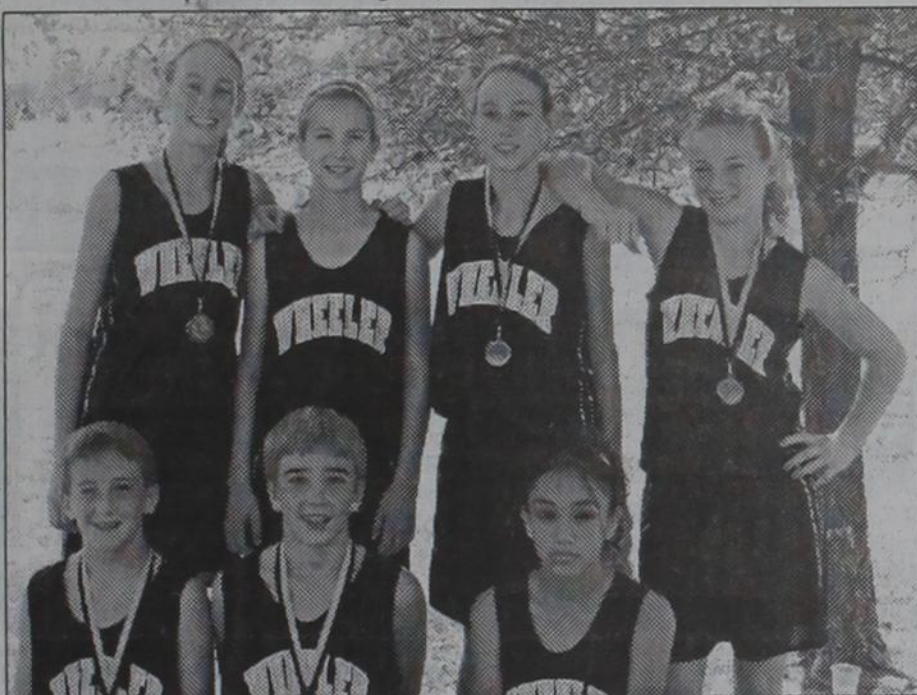

K. Ledbetter Awarded Criminal Justice Degree

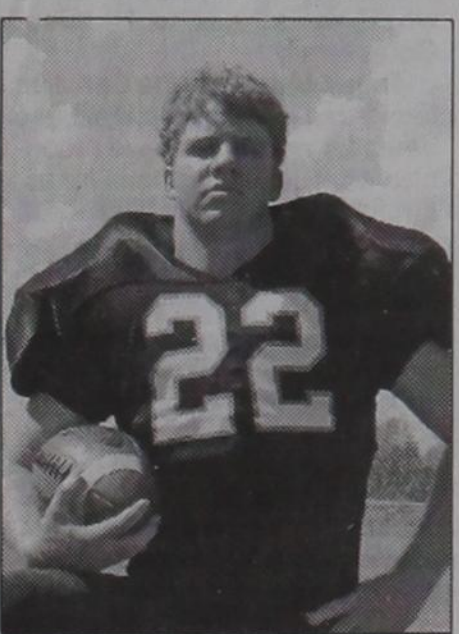

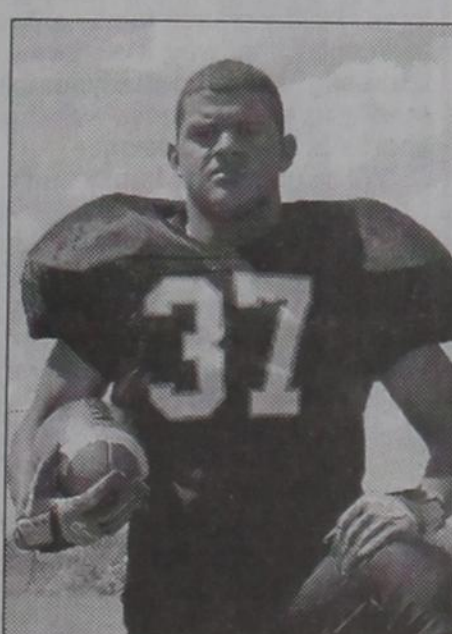

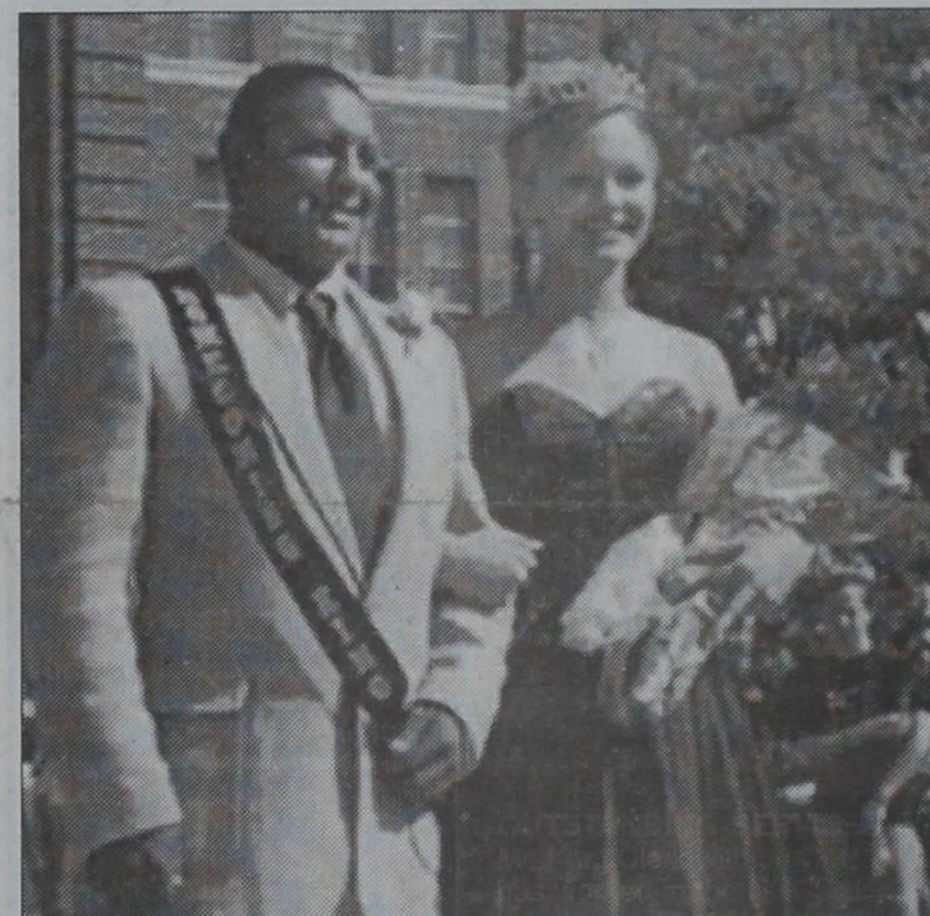

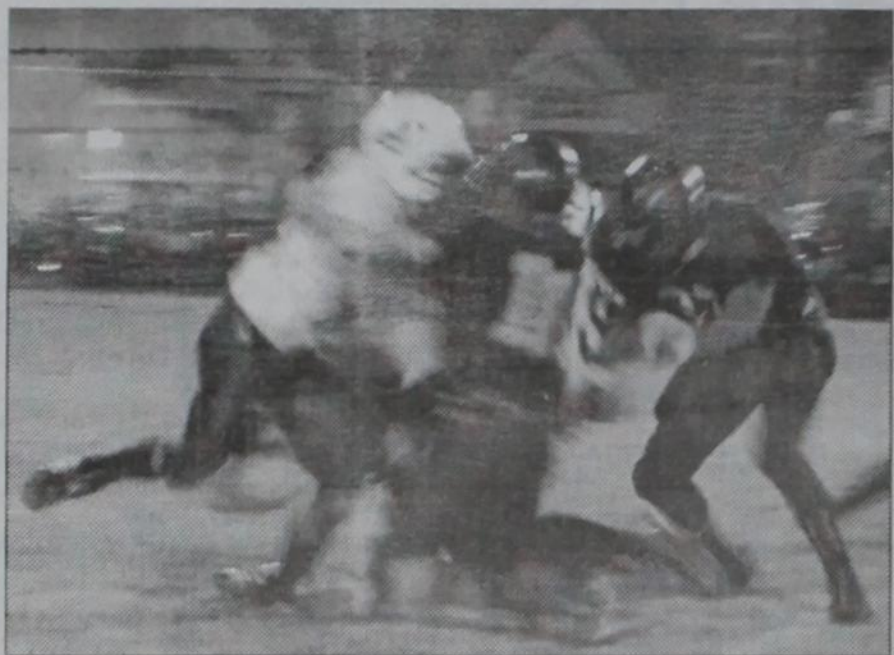

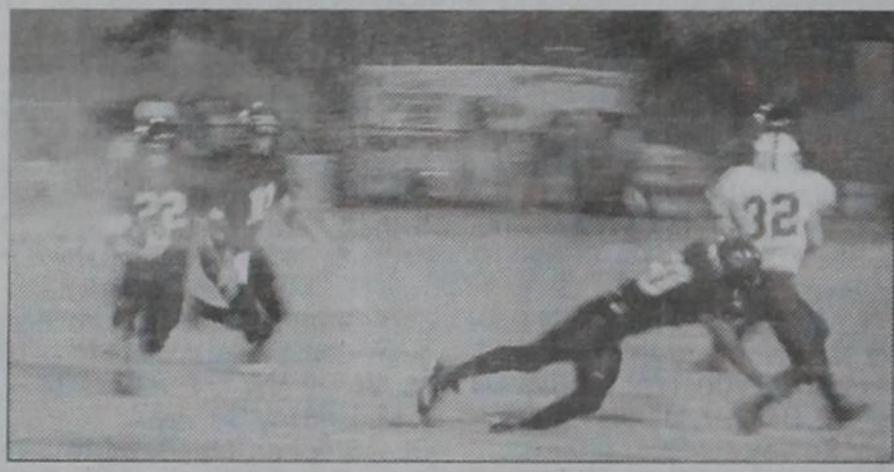

James Rivera, and Ft. Elliott Cougar, Colby Hanson! These young men were named to the *Globe-News* High School Football Players of the Week last week.

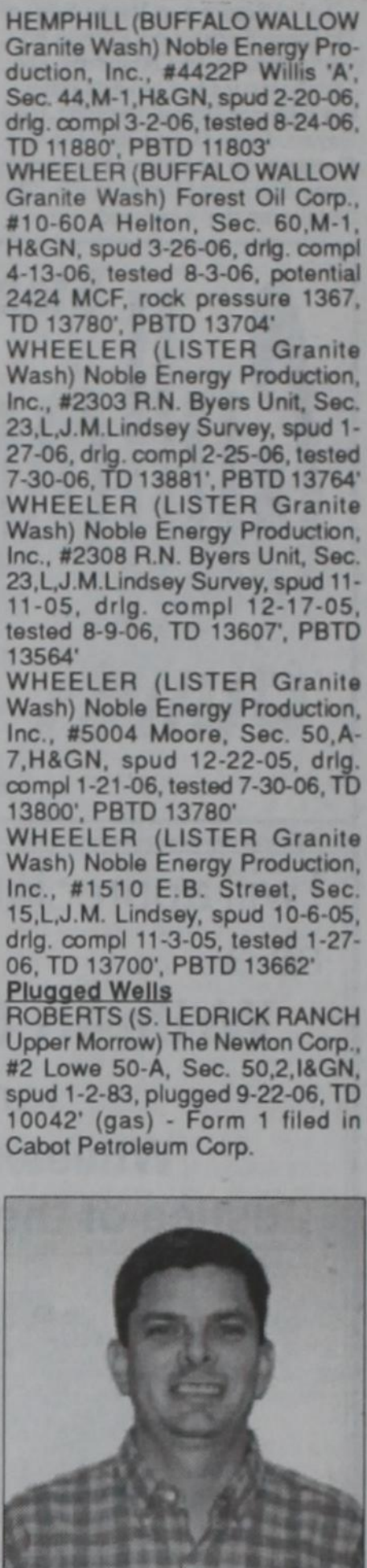
The nice slow rain we have been receiving is certainly appreciated. 1.28" was measured at noon on Tuesday.
