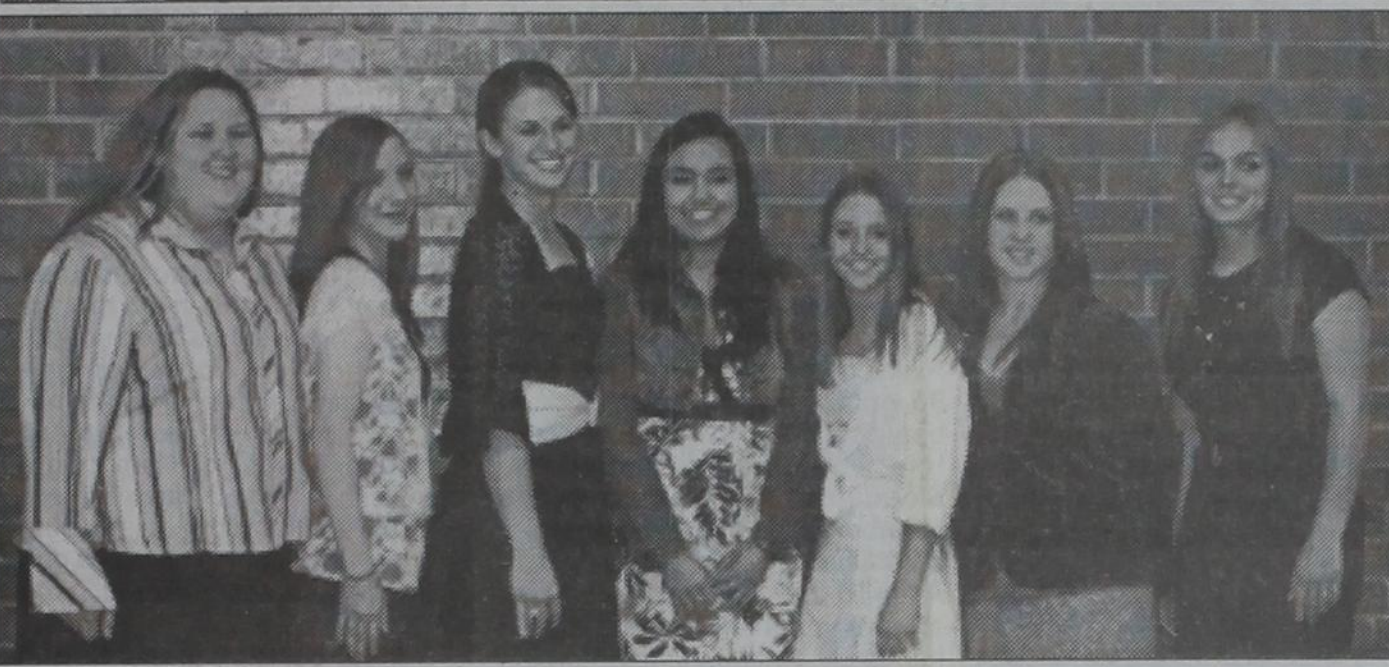

County-Wide Burn Ban Lifted Mon. At Monthly Commissioner's Court

Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in regular session on Monday, May 8, 2006, at the Wheeler County Courthouse. There were nine items on the agenda for the 10:00 A.M. meeting.

The court approved the minutes of the previous meeting as read.

The monthly meeting of the Justice of the Peace, County Treasurer, County Tax Assessor, County Clerk and District Clerk were accepted.

The commissioners voted to pay the hourly payroll as presented.

The payment of the bills as presented was approved.

No action was taken on the budget.

The county-wide burn ban was lifted, effective Monday, May 8, 2006.

The court approved a contract with Welch State Bank for the lease/purchase of a CAT Motor Grader. The group had approved the purchase at the previous meeting.

With the rising cost of gasoline and other travel expense, an increase in the rate of mileage and meal per diem for Wheeler County was approved. The amount allowed per mile is 45c and \$40 per day for meals.

The county voted to rent recently purchased computerized voting machines to other county voting entities at a cost of \$25 per machine. This does not include the cost of setting up the machines for voting; this cost will be paid by each voting entity.

The next meeting of the Wheeler County Commissioners will be Monday, May 22, 2006.

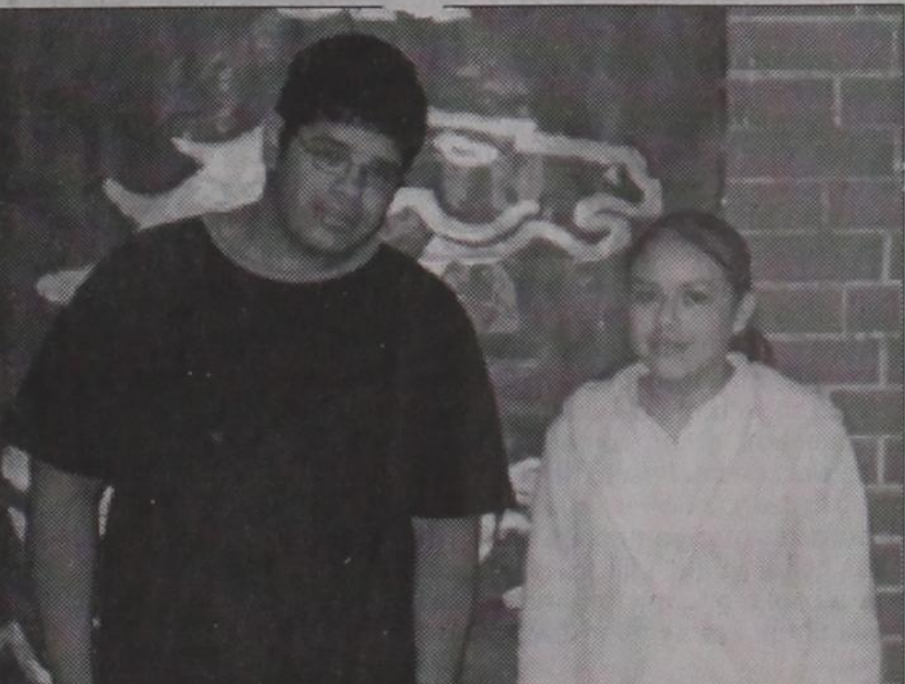

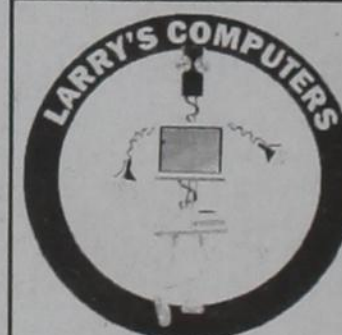

If she was up to it, I would bring her some chicken broth or whatever she felt like she could keep down, and we would talk about how her day was going so far.

Life goes full circle. Once upon a time she took care of me when I couldn't take care of myself. Eventually, I was privileged to take care of her when she couldn't take care of herself I don't have a living Mom to whom I can send flowers or a card now. Her body may reside now in a cemetery in Groesbeck, Texas, but she still lives within my heart. I love you, Mom.

Wheeler Graduate, Dr. Raymond Martin Receives Recognition

Dr. Raymond Martin, a 1975 graduate of Wheeler High School and a graduate of Texas Tech University in 1979 was the recipient of the "You Are Special" award. The Salute to Mansfield dinner was held March 30, 2006, in Mansfield, MA, to raise money for the Mansfield High School's Journey to Resilience program.

Raymond's biography in the program was titled: "Dr. Raymond Martin - Someone to Smile About" Originally from Texas, Dr. Raymond Martin graduated from Texas Tech University, received his Doctor of Dental Surgery degree from the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio in 1983, and completed a general practice residency with the Tufts College of Dental Medicine. Once at Tufts, Dr. Martin discovered how much he loved the Boston area. Now he provides family dentistry at his practice on Chauncy St. in Mansfield.

It's here that Dr. Martin holds the "Doctors with a Heart" event each Valentines Day. Founded by an Iowa Dentist, Dr. Duane Schmidt, the goal of the charity is to provide free dental care to those who might not be able to afford the services normally. It has now become the largest doctor charity in the world. This past Valentine's Day, Dr. Martin says that his practice had about 47 people come in and he and his staff completed about \$6,500 worth of service. "We see a lot of the same people come in year after year" he explained. "It's great because even if they only get work done once a year, they're still maintaining their dental health. There have been many recent studies that link systemic diseases to dental problems."

Dr. Martin's volunteer work is not limited to his office. In 2002, he was honored with an International

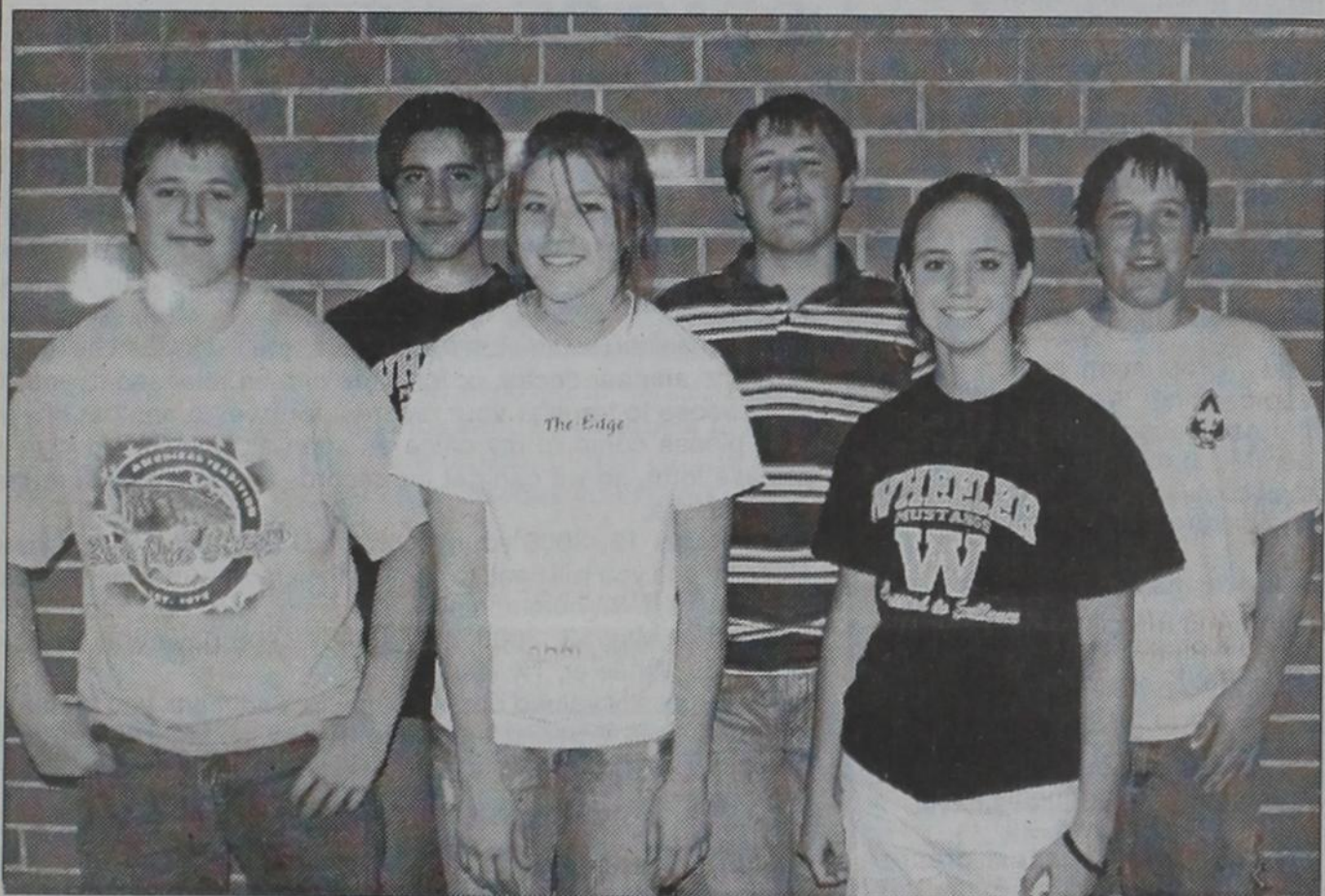
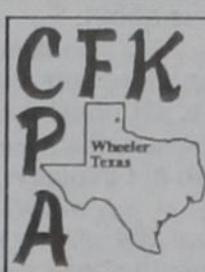
Service Award for running a fundraiser that raised money to buy and deliver wheelchairs all over the world. In Mansfield alone they were able to raise enough to buy 27 chairs and those were delivered to places such as India and Kazakistan.

A member and past president of the Rotary Club in town, Dr. Martin has helped raise money for many local and international charities. He was given the 2004 Rotarian of the Year award for chairing the Wine and Fine Dining Auction, which raised money for polio research and helpful worldwide eradication of the disease. Money was also raised for a variety of other Mansfield projects, including Rails to Trails, a bike path established in 2003.

When asked why he thinks Mansfield is such a great town Dr. Martin replies, "This community is more involved in volunteerism than any other I've seen. Everyone is committed to trying to make it better everyday. I also come from a small town in the Texas panhandle. I was looking for a place to live where I knew the people, worked with them and didn't have a cold and impersonal feeling. Mansfield is that. It's a modern twist on a country town."

When Dr. Martin isn't working on volunteering, one of his favorite things to do is bike. He was the New England Champion of the single speed class in mountain biking and nationally ranked in the Road Race Masters. He lives in Mansfield with his wife, Jean, and their two children, Elaine and Tyler.

Orphanage To Be Named For Slain Soldier, Benjamin Britt

(This is an article from the Thursday, May 4, 2006 Amarillo Globe-News paper written by Michael Smith.)

Kathryn Selmon said she saw a rainbow in the sky over Wheeler the day U.S. Army 1st Lt. Benjamin Britt, her daughter's fiance, was laid to rest in January. In a later event about 6,000 miles away that at first seemed unrelated, 70 children orphaned by Liberia's civil war gathered to see the plans for a new orphanage being built by the Shine Foundation, an Oklahoma-based relief group Selmon's son and daughter started. "It looks like Rainbow Town!" Selmon said one of the orphaned children exclaimed, and that's what the kids call it. When the Selmon family members heard this, they immediately thought back to the January day Britt was laid to rest and got an idea: There would be no greater tribute to Britt's joy, dedication to others, leadership and service to his country than for the orphanage to bear his name. After raising the \$60,000 necessary, Shannon and Zac Selmon, Kathryn Selmon's daughter and son, announced that construction on the first Benjamin Britt Academy is scheduled to begin this summer in Gbarnga, Liberia. Britt, 24, fought with the Army's 101st Airborne Division. He died Dec. 22, in Iraq when an improvised explosive device detonated as he led a patrol through Baghdad, Defense Department records show. Kathryn Selmon said it is more than fitting to name the school after Britt, who had the kind of drive

that would put him right by their side during construction. "Ben was just the type of guy that gave 100 percent whenever he did something," she said. "We kind of feel like he's pushing us on." The orphanage will be staffed by Liberians, and the foundation's goal is for the home to become self-sufficient in five years, she said. The foundation is also raising money to build five more Britt Academies across Liberia. Dave Britt Jr., Benjamin Britt's father, said he is touched by the Selmon's efforts to commemorate his son's willing worker spirit. "Ben appreciated knowledge," Dave Britt Jr. said. "I think it's one of the most generous gestures that anybody could do in his name."

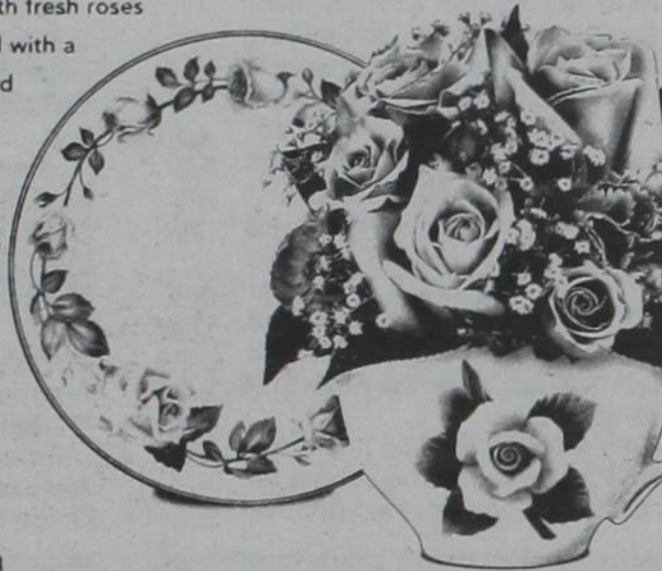
