
John W. Smith To Be At Church of Christ

Commissioners Offer Terms For Accepting Agricultural Activities Center From W.A.A.I.C.

The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas, met in regular session on Monday, October 23, 2006, at 10:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' courtroom, Wheeler County Courthouse, 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas.

Ten items were on the agenda. The court approved the hourly payroll time sheets for payment as presented.

The bills were approved for payment.

No action was taken on the budget.

No action was taken on the burn ban.

Wheeler Area Activities Improvements Council, Inc. was scheduled to meet with the court for the court to consider the ownership of the proposed building. The commissioners decided the building would have to be called the Agricultural Activities Center. After the completion of the building, the county will assume ownership and provide maintenance, insurance, upkeep and utilities. The final plans will be subject to the approval of court, subject to the ratification by the extension service. The county will allow the

building to be built on land currently owned by the county and the county will do the dirt work of which they are capable.

Brigham Oil and Gas requested permission to cross County Road 26 and County Road W for installation of an oil and gas pipeline. The crossing was approved.

The court decided the courthouse would not be closed on Tuesday, November 7, 2006, for the general election.

No action was taken on item #8. Joel Finsterwald, county sheriff, was to meet with the court for the consideration of raise for part-time deputies.

The commissioners decided to canvass the votes for the November General Election on November 15, 2006, at 10:00 a.m. in the commissioners courtroom.

The commissioner adopted the resolution supporting Designation of Competitive Renewable Energy Zones in the Texas Panhandle, Pursuant to SB 20 and PUC Project No. 31852.

The next regular meeting of the commissioners' court will be Monday, November 13, 2006.





Friends and family,
Thanks so much for your prayers today! It all went well and mom and I feel we received a great blessing from God today.

The biopsy went well, and was different than before. It was taken from my sternum or chest, about 6 inches down from my throat. I was some concerned about him doing it from there since the sternum seems more fragile than the hip (and my heart's under it too!) but he convinced me to do it since it is a purer sample and requires no bone sample (no digging around in the middle of my bones!) just a fluid sample and is faster.

I was very nervous (but 4th one

now, so ok) and Mom and I started our praying as soon as he started working. He numbed up the site (was a 4 inch needle) and I started saying my Psalms 91 verse. I always say this one when I am getting things done to me. He asked "Where do you go to church?" (with the needle in my chest) and I wanted to say "Shut up I'm in the zone here of praying" but I answered him and went back to praying. I really felt like God's presence was in that tiny room. Mom said afterward "if he doesn't know God, he will by the time we are done with him!"

I was prepared for the pain, but it was different from previously in the hip. It was more like having a 5 second heart attack. So of course I yelled, and praying loudly. He didn't tell me to stop, so I continued. Finally it was over, and I just wanted that tube out of my sternum. "Get it out, get it out" and it was done! Praise God!

Also, we were blessed to find out that Dr. Lim is trained in looking at smears of bone marrow under the microscope in Europe, so he was able to give us results of the biopsy in 5 minutes! (Blessing not waiting a whole week!) Mom and I PRAYED big time while he was checking the smear! He came back in and said, "The smear is clear, it looks great!" YES! He said there might have been 1% blasts in it, but couldn't even tell if they were leukemia cells or not. He is still going to send it off, but we all feel really good and he does too about the sample.

We scheduled Monday, Oct. 23rd for an all day chemo (from 8:00-5:00) to stimulate my body to start growing more cells. (chemo kills cells and body regrows a lot.) Then I'll have repagen shots (growth shots) for 2 weeks. Harvesting of my new cells will be the week of Nov. 6 (will be just finished in time for Kyler's birthday on Nov. 10th—Thank God!) Then big chemo and transplant week or so after that. So Nov. will be my "Transplant Month".

The biggest blessing for us today came as we were leaving the Dr.'s office. I looked down and saw the shinnest penny on the floor right in front of me! (Pennies are a sign for me from God to trust him, that I'm in his care "IN God We Trust") I made Mom see it before I picked it up, and she was in Glee

The purpose of the HPG Program is to promote continued economic development in rural communities by making grants to sponsoring organizations for the repair or rehabilitation of low and very-low income housing. Grants are competitive and are made available in areas where there is a concentration of need.




