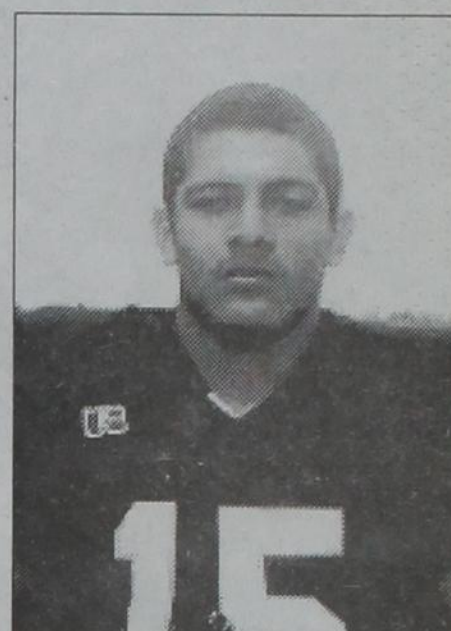
Eugene T. Vaughn Services Sept. 30

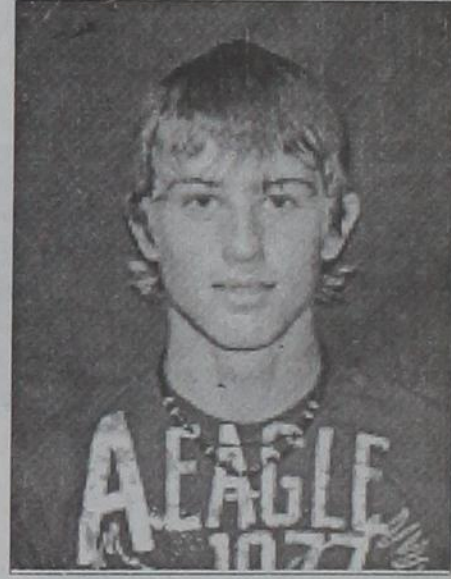

He carried 15 times for 157 yards and scored on an 8-yard run in the second quarter to put his team up 21-14. On defense, he was just as impressive with 12 tackles, including four solos.

Comment: “Richard has started all three games that he has played at Wheeler, and he continues to get better,” Wheeler head coach Brandon Smith said. “He never comes out of a game. He plays every down on offense, defense and special teams. Richard has excellent strength that enables him to get tough yards enabling the ball, and on defense has the ability to get to the ball and make plays. The thing that impressive is how hard he works to improve in every phase of the game.”



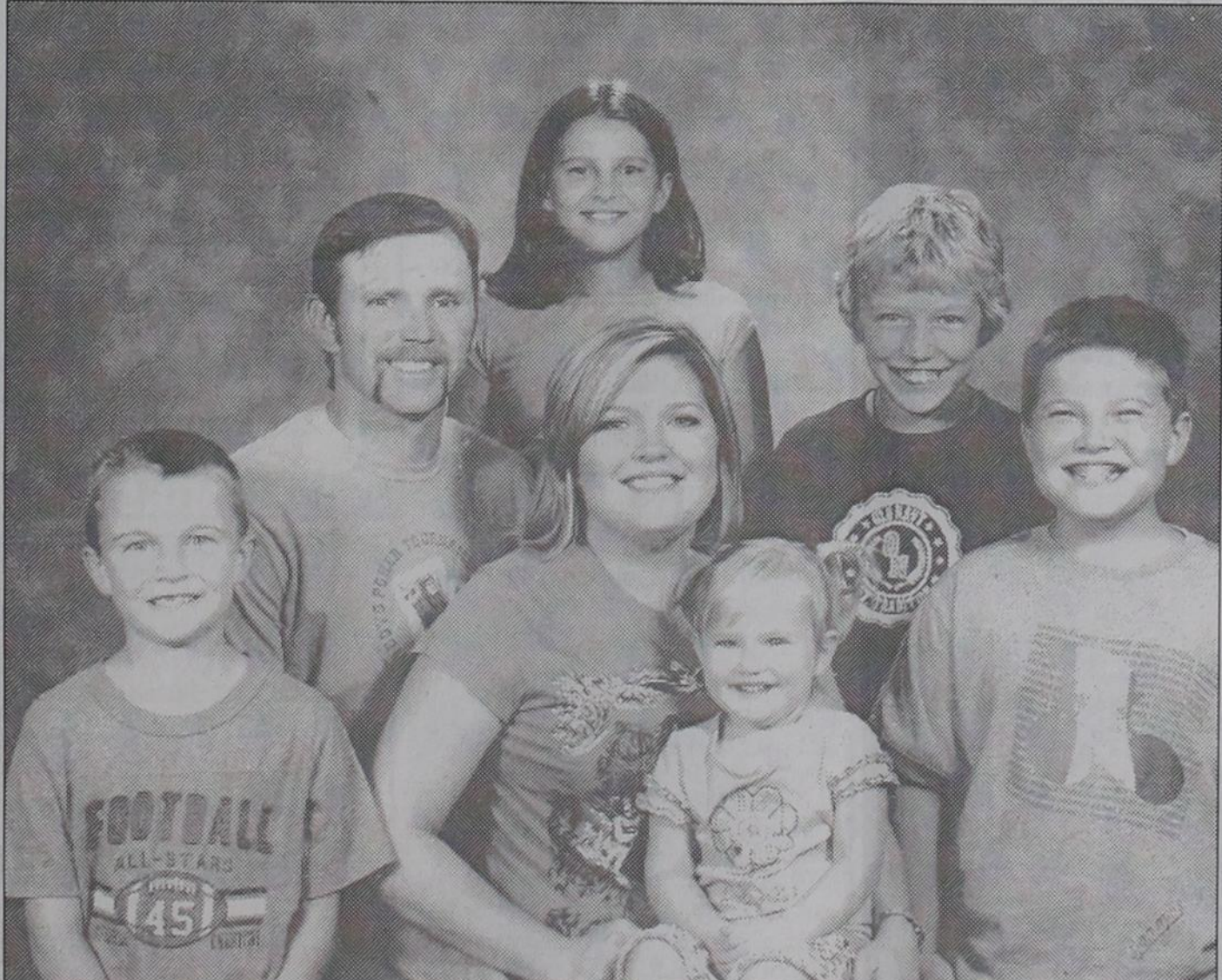

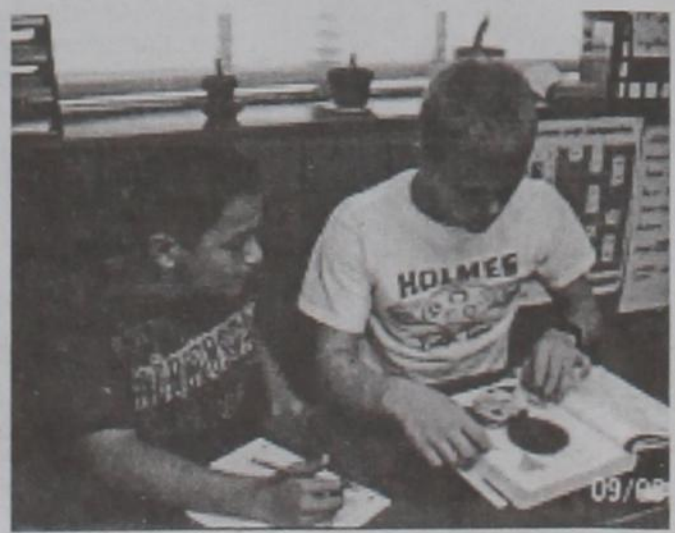

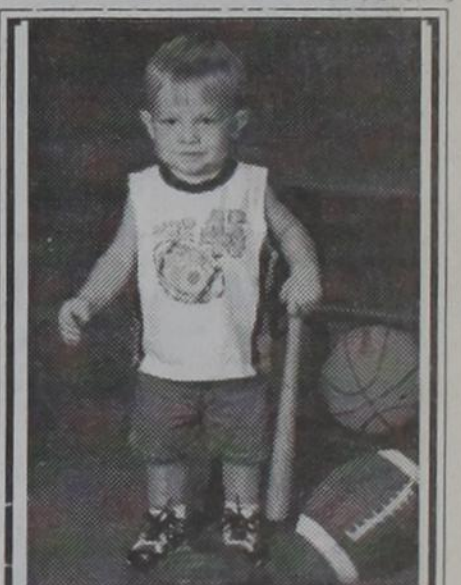

OCTOBER IS NATIONAL COOPERATIVE MONTH

Cooperative businesses generate hundreds of thousands of jobs and billions in income for their communities while also supporting local causes ranging from education to the environment, according to a series of case studies compiled to help mark October as National Co-op Month.

The 20-plus pages of case studies, put together by the National Co-op Month Planning Committee, show that co-ops take a back seat to no other sector when it comes to making economic and charitable contributions to their communities. Among the highlights:

★ Nearly 3,000 farmer cooperatives account for as many as 300,000 jobs nationwide and a total payroll of more than \$8 billion.

★ Some 270 local, consumer-owned telecommunications cooperatives employ an average of 47 people each and generate more than \$2 billion in revenues annually.

It is no coincidence that co-ops show a special loyalty to their communities.

Cooperatives serve 120 million members, or four in 10 Americans. They fall into four categories: consumer, producer, worker and purchasing/shared services. They operate in virtually every industry and range in size from small storefronts to Fortune 500 companies.

Despite this diversity, co-ops have some things in common. They are owned and democratically controlled by the people who use their services or buy their goods. They are motivated by service to their members, not by profit.

Community is not just where we work; it's why we work. Cooperatives are motivated to serve their members, not outside investors. Doing that means we must also serve the communities in which

our members live, work and play. Co-op Month has been celebrated in one form or another since 1930. Since 1971, it has been a joint project of the major co-op groups represented on the Co-op Month Planning Committee. The committee contracts with the National Cooperative Business Association to coordinate work on Co-op Month.

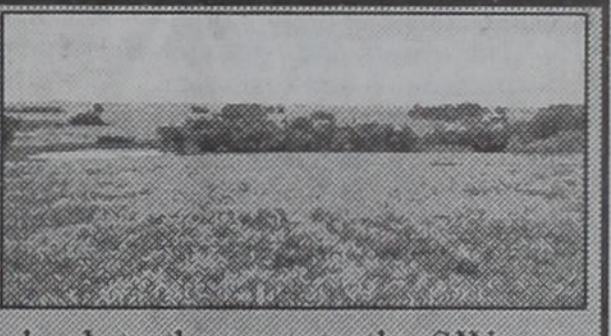

Find your oldest living relative and make plans to visit them, talk with them and, if possible, record their conversation.

Search the Internet for the surnames that you may have found. There are several good genealogy web sites to access. She also talked about

access to birth, marriage and death records.

Margaret demonstrated the Family Tree Maker program on her personal computer. She showed us how to enter a name to start your family tree and how easy it was to fill in the blanks with all the information that you discovered about your family in your search. She answered so many of our questions. Some of us have been doing genealogy for years and some of us are beginners, but we all learned something new about researching our ancestors.

A genealogist is the storyteller of the family. It is not all just names and dates, but the stories of long ago that can be shared with future generations.

Our next genealogy meeting will be October 14, 2008, at 7 p.m. at the Ziegler house in Shamrock. Anyone interested in genealogy is always welcome to join our genealogy group. We meet on the second Tuesday of each month, except for the months of June, July and August.
