

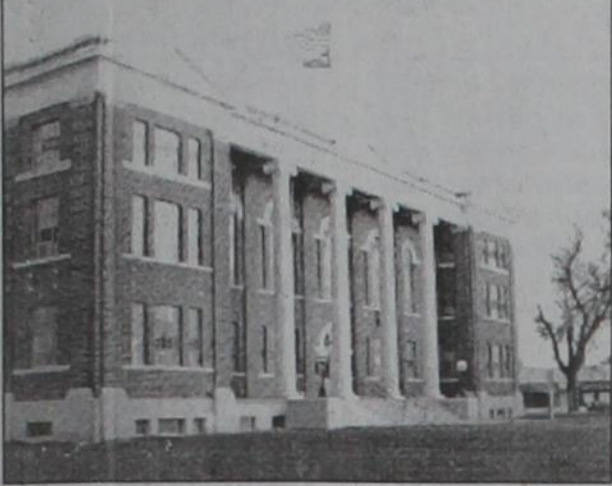

Mr. Frank Hooker, 89, a disabled veteran, went to be with our Lord on Saturday, October 18, 2008, at his home in Bridgeport, Texas. Visitation is 6-8 p.m., Thursday, October 23, 2008, at Hawkins Funeral Home, Bridgeport, Texas (940-683-2211), with graveside services scheduled for Friday, October 24, 2008, in Mobeetie Cemetery, Mobeetie, Texas, under the direction of Hawkins Funeral Home. Rev. Dewane Adams will officiate.

Frank was born October 27, 1918, the son of Silas Hake and Annie Mae (Love) Hooker in Mobeetie, Texas. He served his country in the U.S. Army during World War II. He was a lifetime member of the Disabled American Veterans. Frank married Hazel Kenyon on September 23, 1956, in Wheeler, Texas.

He was preceded in death by his brothers, Raymond, Vernon, Harold, S.B. and Sam Hooker.

Left behind to cherish his memory is his wife of 52 years, Hazel Hooker of Bridgeport; daughter, Carolyn Hooker of Mansfield, Texas; grandson, Army Specialist Jason Hooker, of Bridgeport; great-granddaughters, Rylee and Mason; numerous other children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews that he helped raise; and other relatives and a host of friends.

Clarendon Offering Large Scholarsh's

Nominees may include Clarendon College students with financial need

The Jack Kent Cooke Foundation has opened the nominations process for the largest scholarships available to students and recent alumni from community college. Through the initiative, called the Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship Program, the private foundation will award up to \$30,000 annually per recipient to help students and recent alumni from community and two-year institutions pursue four-year degrees at any accredited college or university in the United States and abroad. Last year, the Foundation received over 600 nominations for these awards.

While 45 percent of all college students in the US attend community colleges, few private funds are available to help top community college students transfer to four-year institutions, in spite of their high levels of ability and need. The Jack Kent Cooke Foundation scholarships can provide funding for tuition, room and board, required fees, and books for the length of the undergraduate degree, generally two years. Each award can total up to \$30,000 annually, though the amounts will vary based on such factors as the cost of the institution each recipient attends.

The Foundation plans to award approximately 50 scholarships through this program in spring, 2009. It will renew awards each year based upon student performance. Current students are eligible, as are alumni who earned a degree from a community or two-year institution since spring 2004 and have not since transferred to a four-year college. The application deadline is January 20, 2009. All candidates for the scholarship must be nominated by the faculty representative at their community or two-year institution. The deadline for nominations is January 26, 2009. The list of faculty representatives and application materials are available

Wheeler City Council Hosts 'Town Hall' Meeting Monday

The Wheeler City Council

called a "Town Hall Meeting" Monday evening to hear from the people. Approximately 25 Wheeler citizens were in attendance at the meeting.

Of most concern to the individuals was speeding within the city limits. They requested the council work with the Wheeler County Sheriff's Department to correct this problem.

The number of junk and/or unregistered vehicles parked on private property was also of concern. There is an ordinance against these vehicles. City employee, Frank Clymer, suggested the vehicles be marked with stickers, giving owners a period of time in which to correct the problem. The city can then haul the cars to the old dump grounds to remain until they can be hauled off for crushing.

Livestock within the city limits is also a problem. City ordinances do not prohibit livestock within the city limits, but determine the number by the amount of property per animal. Fowl must be contained within a fence and/or building. Some individuals known to be in non-compliance with city ordinances have been notified by the city via letter and steps will be taken to correct these situations.

Sheriff Joel Finsterwald was at the town hall meeting and reported that the deputies are issuing tickets within the city limits. He reported

"more tickets have been given out in the last 2 years than in the past 20 years."

The City of Wheeler is policed through the Wheeler County Sheriff's Department through a contract with the County Commissioners. An amount of money is paid by the city for this service.

The sheriff's department is presently "short-handed", due, partially, to the higher wages being offered in the oilfield. It was suggested that we work to increase the salaries of sheriff's deputies.

Mayor Wanda Herd thanked the citizens for attending and assured them the city would be working to correct the situations.

Lions' Sight Night Puts Focus On Giving This Halloween

This Halloween—or Sight Night—the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts of Wheeler in conjunction with the Wheeler Lions Club will be asking for more than just candy; they'll also be scaring up used eyewear. The used eyewear will be recycled by Lions Clubs International and hand delivered to underprivileged people around the world. During its nine years, more than 100,000 community volunteers have participated in Sight Night, collecting

more than 1,000,000 pairs of used eyewear.

"Sight Night gives children and adults a tangible way to participate in a global act of kindness on Halloween," said Dale Garner, President of the Wheeler Lions Club. "Our efforts will change lives. Some people who receive this eyewear may now be able to work or see the board in school because of their improved eyesight."

According to the World Health Organization, 250 million of the people in the world need corrective eyewear. But many people, especially those in developing countries, do not have access to eye care or eyewear. Each year Lions Clubs members around the nation participate in mission trips that provide a variety of medical services, including optical services, to those in need.

"Look for your used prescription eyeglasses and non-prescription sunglasses around your home or office," said Garner. "Whether they're big or small, chic or not, your eyewear could help someone in a developing country see the world more clearly!"

The "ghouls and boys" will be collecting the glasses at the Wheeler/Wellington football game on Friday, October 31. So come on out and enjoy the game and help someone in need at the same time. If you can't get to the stadium on Halloween, you may give your used glasses to any member of the Wheeler Lions Club, the Boy Scouts, or the Girl Scouts, or may drop them in one of the Lions Club eyeglass collection boxes around town.

Work Group Meeting Is Planned By Local SWCDs

The USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and the Wheeler Soil and Water Conservation District invite the public and any agencies with an interest in conservation issues to participate in a Local Work Group meeting to be held at Wheeler Service Center in Wheeler, Texas. This meeting will be on November 4, 2008 at 8:30 am.

The purpose of this meeting is to receive input from a broad range of local agencies, organizations, businesses, and individuals that have an interest in natural resource conditions and needs in Wheeler County.

Input received will allow the Local Work Group to make recommendations on resource concerns to be addressed, eligible practices, and ranking for county based funding. These recommendations will be used in recommending the Environmental Qual-

ity Incentives Program (EQIP) and other conservation programs offered by NRCS.

The 2008 Farm Bill stipulates that conservation programs must continue to be locally led. Through stakeholder meetings, the public is given an opportunity to help local conservation leaders set program priorities. These meetings are open to the public.
