

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) has established the MCL for NITRATE at 10 mg/L. And has determined that it is a health concern at levels above the MCL. Analysis of the drinking water in your community for NITRATE indicates a level of 12 mg/L.

Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrate in excess of the MCL could become seriously ill and , if untreated, may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blue baby syndrome. If your child is under the age of six months, the child must be given an alternative water supply for any consumption. Boiling the affected water is not an effective treatment for nitrate removal.

Most consumers do not need to use an alternative water supply. However, if you have health concerns, you may want to talk to your doctor to get more information about how this may affect you. At this time, the health effects to fetuses of pregnant women is unclear. If you are pregnant, you may choose to use an alternative source of water for drinking and cooking purposes.
