# Mobeetie's 'Old Town Hoedown' Is June 30

## 'Billy Dixon' Recalls Battle Of Buffalo Wallow

Billy Dixon was one of six men who defeated an estimated 125 Kiowa and Comanche Indians at the Battle of Buffalo Wallow on September 12<sup>th</sup>, 1874. This year, on Saturday, June 30, those attending the Old Mobeetie Hoedown will hear the story from reenactor Marc Ferguson who will portray frontier hero Billy Dixon.

Concerned with the late arrival of Lyman's wagon train, loaded with supplies, Col. Nelson Miles sent civilian army scout Billy Dixon, fellow scout Amos Chapman and soldiers Sergeant Z.T. Woodall, Co. I; Peter Rath, Co. A; John Harrington, Co. H.; George W. Smith, Co. M, 6th Cavalry in search of the missing party. The men road hard, traveling at night and seeking cover during the day to avoid the Indians who were on the warpath in the Texas Panhandle. Soon, however, the group found themselves surrounded by Kiowa and Comanche warriors, all on horseback. This occurred on a small rise north of Gageby Creek, near the line separating modern day Hemphill and Wheeler Counties. A prairie fire had removed all potential shelters from the area and the horses, exhausted from the night's ride, made a mounted conflict impossible. The men finally sought shelter in a buffalo wallow (a shallow 10 foot area hollowed out by bison pawing around and rolling in the cool ground to escape the summer heat). To hear the amazing story of how these men, with 25-1 odds in the Indian's favor, survived this ordeal, make

your way to the Old Town Hoedown in Old Mobeetie on June 30th.

Marc Ferguson, who will portray Dixon, has won many local and national awards for his living history portrayals of Billy Dixon and Doc Holliday. He is a member of the Reenactment Guild of America, the American Frontier Guild of America, the Kansas Alliance of Professional Historic Performers and the Kansas Cowboy Society. A former head of historical interpretations at Boot Hill Museum in Dodge City, Ferguson is the curator for the Dalton Gang Museum in Meade, Kansas.

Another highlight of the afternoon will be the mounted cavalry performance. Over a dozen men from the Frontier Regiment of the High Plains will set up their tents on the museum grounds. Promoting the historical significance of the Red River War in the Panhandle region is an important part of the Regiment's goals. This is done through historical reenactments, such as horseback maneuvers, commemorations, and living history displays. The cavalry will be led by Colonel Jimmy Northcutt of Mami, Texas. This group, which includes a buffalo soldier, is focused on keeping the history of the Red River Wars alive, including Fort Elliott which was located just outside of Mobeetie. This promises to be an amazing event you will not want to miss.

The celebration doesn't stop there. Numerous living history exhibits, including metal smithing, gun smithing and display of guns for the late 1800's, a quilting exhibit, woodworking, a working trading post will fill the museum grounds. The little cowpokes can enjoy a real arrowhead hunt and authentic frontier games including cornhole darts, horseshoes and trundling hoop and roll. Period music will be provided by the Fort Elliott Choir and great items, including antiques, will be offered for your bidding at the silent auction.

This year's chuckwagon supper will feature fajitas, beans and all the trimmings. Two lines serving lines will be in place so visitors can move swiftly through the line. The meal is scheduled for 6 p.m. The Fort Elliott Cheerleaders will be on hand, decked out as saloon girls, to serve cold drinks to the guests.

This is one of the annual fundraisers for the Old Mobeetie Jail Museum and admission prices are: \$12 for adults; \$6 for 12 and under; and 4 and under free. This

Burial was in the Wheeler Cemetery under the direction of Wright Funeral Home, Wheeler, Texas.

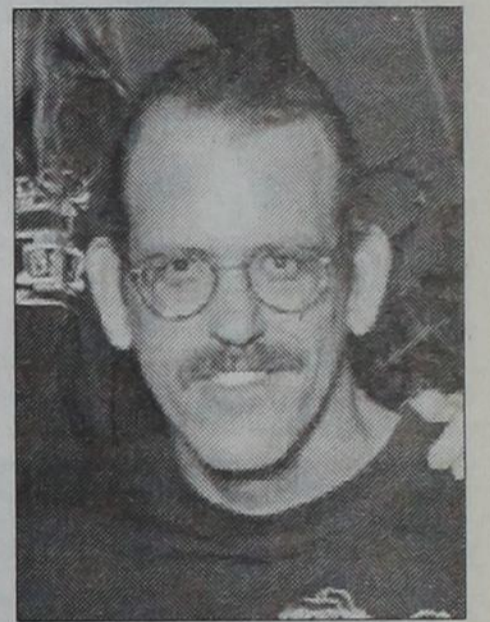

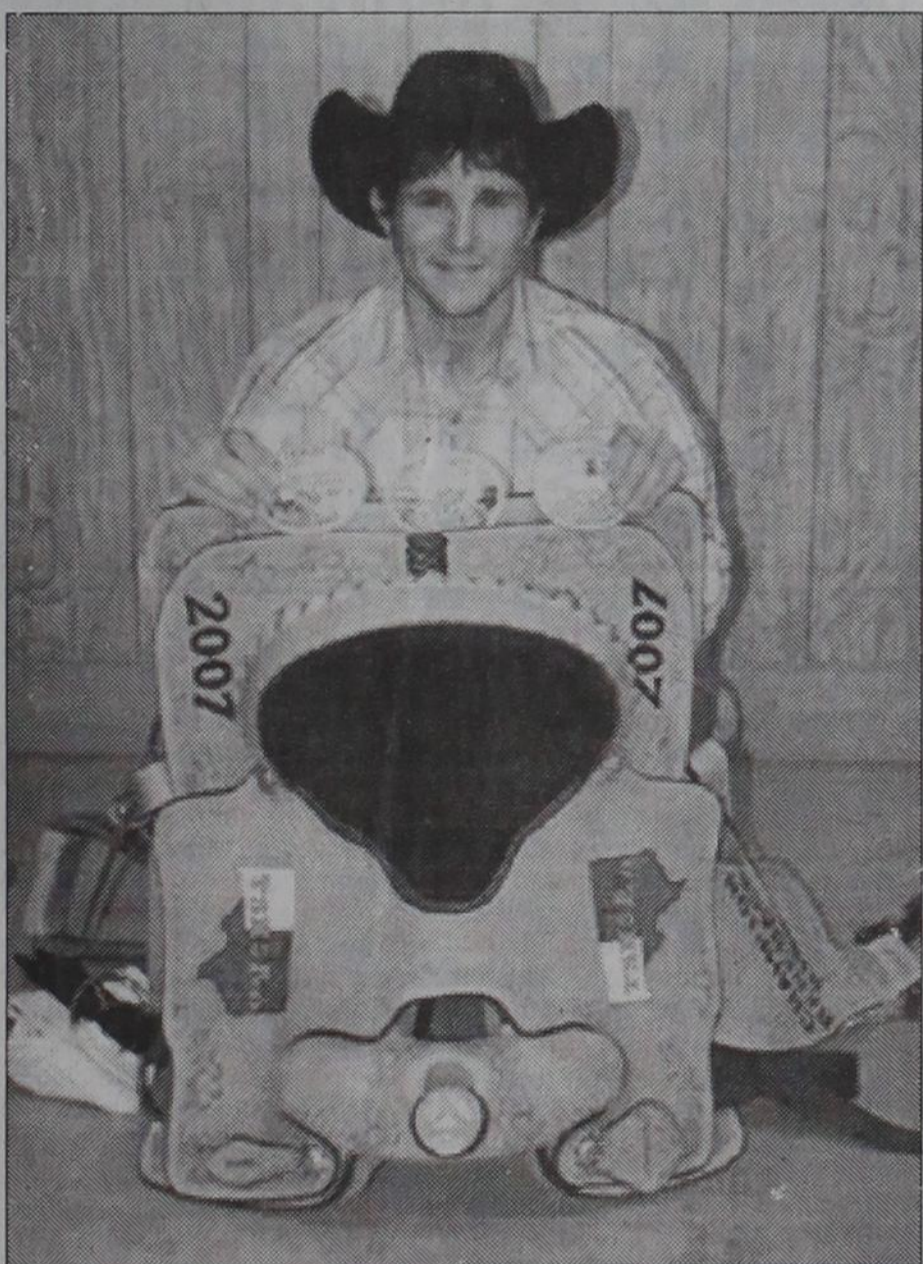

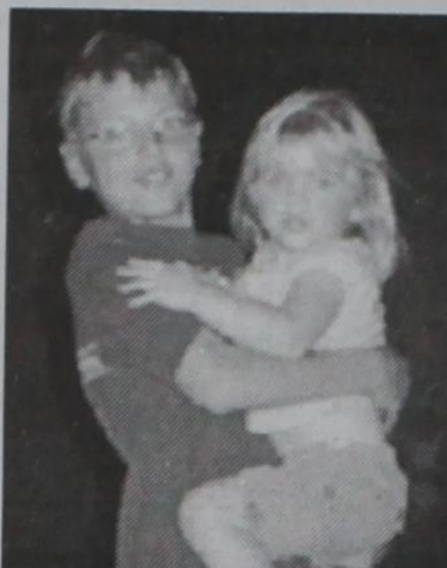

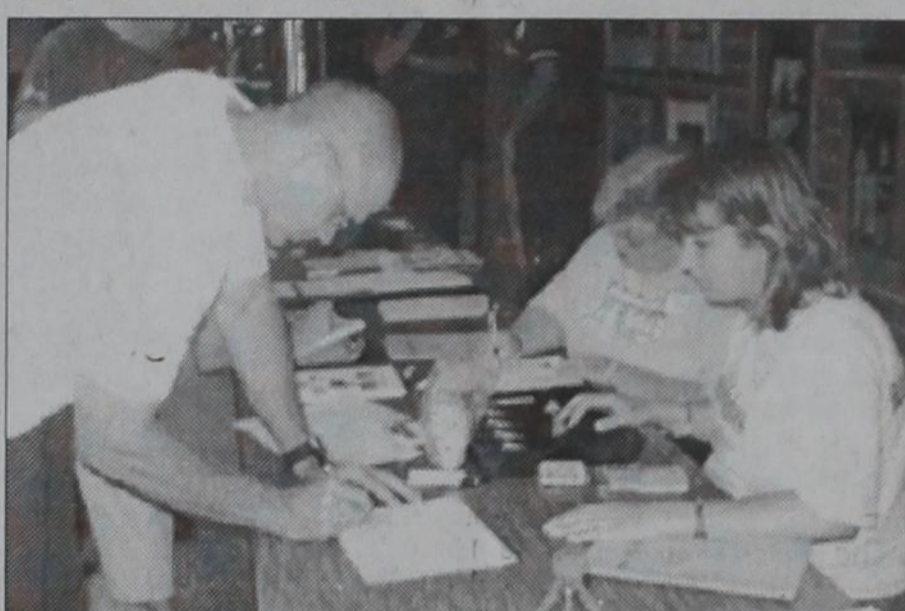

When Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount, it was still fairly early in his ministry. Obviously, he had done a few things before that time since Matthew 4 details that some disciples are already following him and that some sick have already been healed. Nonetheless, it is still fairly early. So, when he climbs up on the side of the mountain at Matthew 5:1 and many people follow after him, he is ready to start preaching...and Jesus preaches a "doozy" of a sermon (preachers today should learn from the style of his preaching). The sermon has everything in it: drama, humor, illustrations, Old Testament ideas and applications. It is a sermon that demands a response. Jesus even causes them to consider how they are to respond when he gets to the conclusion of the sermon in Matthew 7:24-27 by telling them the story of two men.  
The first man is wise. He builds a house on the rock, a solid foundation, so when the storms come and batter it, the house stands firm. The second man is foolish; he builds his house on the sand, a poor, shifting foundation. When the storms come and batter it, this house falls with a great crash. Jesus tells this story and tells his listeners that those who hear his teaching and put the teaching into practice are likened to that wise man, while those who hear his teaching and do NOT put his teaching into practice are likened to that foolish man.  
The story probably causes most people to remember the children's song where the wise man built his house upon the rock...and the rain came a-tumblin' down. The song goes on, the hand motions are done, but the point is obvious. Everything with the wise man stands firm...everything with the foolish man gets destroyed. The challenge to us at every age is to be wise, listen to Jesus and do what he directs.

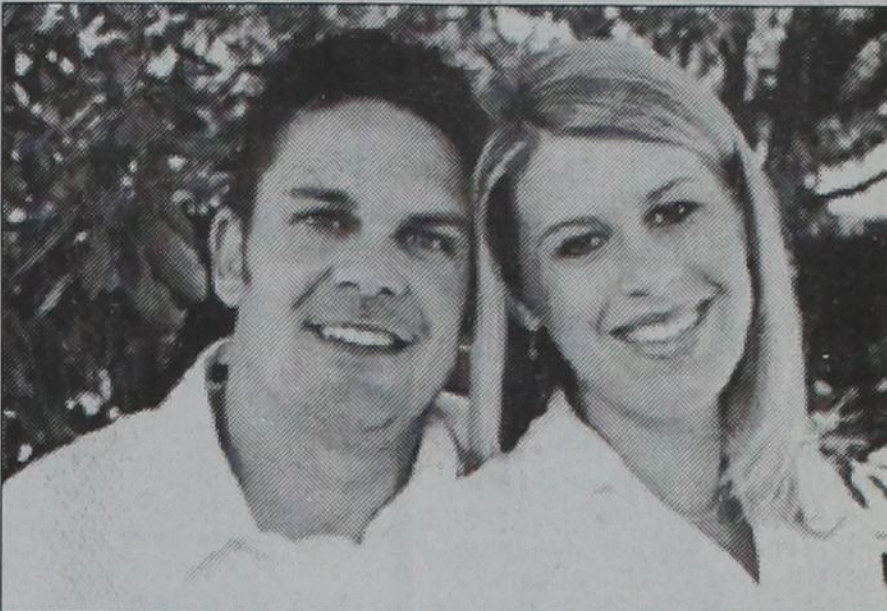

Ah yes summer is here and with it comes the lawn mower season as well. We want to make sure you have a good and safe summer.

So below are some lawn mower safety tips.

Many parents view the task of doing yard work as an important way to teach youngsters how to help around the house and thus be an active participant in the family. After all, a good number of you probably were assigned the chore of grooming your grass with a push mower—or even operating a riding mower long before you qualified for a driver's license. According to the recent reports, close to 10,000 children a year are treated for injuries caused by lawn mowers. While a majority of these injuries occur in older children and teens—three-quarters of whom are male—that doesn't mean that younger children are immune to the risks. Whether a child is actually operating a lawn mower or is simply a bystander, lawn mowers have the potential to slice body parts—even amputate them—as well as cause injury from scattering debris. Yet despite these facts, there are no industry or government standards when it comes to the use of lawn mowers.

As you head out to cut the grass this summer, here are some specific things you can do to lessen the chance of your child getting injured:

- Do not mow in the vicinity of your child. In fact, try to get in the habit of not mowing when your child is playing outdoors, especially if you have children under the age of six.
- Never allow your child to ride with you on, or to be towed behind, a riding mower. (yes! I know people that do this!)
- Make sure that you store your mower in a safe place, out of reach of your child, such as in a locked tool shed.
- Teach your tool that the blades of a lawn mower are dangerous because they are as sharp as knives.
- Remember, yard work can be fun, or at least more fun, if you make it a family activity—just include your child in other tasks and not the mowing.

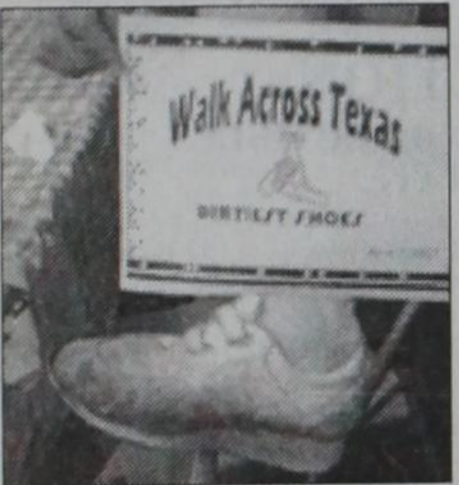

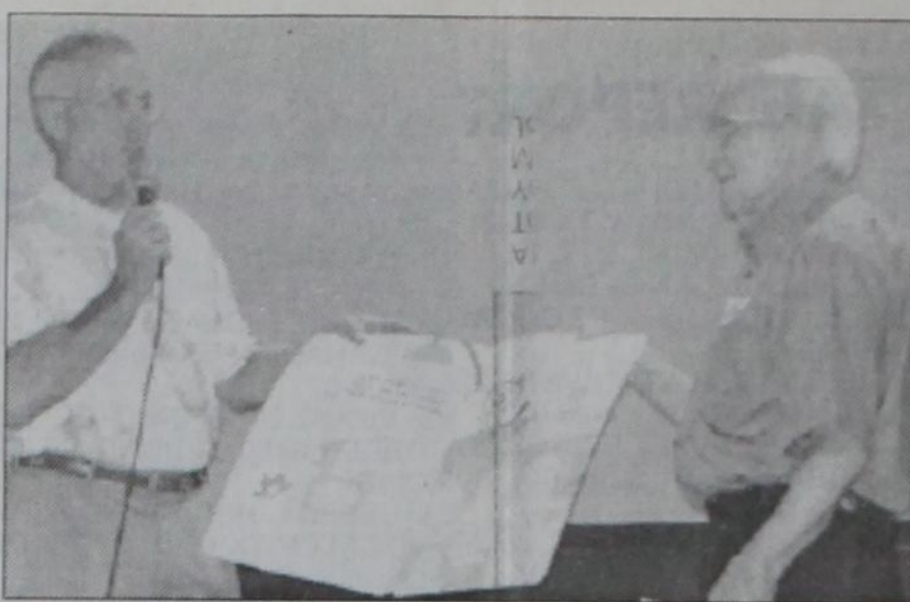
Afterwards Glenn and Betty planted some flowers in Opal's flower bed in front of her house. Opal was very thankful for that.

**Aubrey Russell Re-Elected To Texas State Soil & Water Conservation Board**

Aubrey L. Russell, of Panhandle, Texas, was re-elected May 1, 2007, to serve another two-year term on the Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board (TSSWCB) board of directors.

Russell represents TSSWCB State District One which consists of 51 counties in the panhandle and south plains regions of Texas. District One encompasses 49 Soil and Water Conservation Districts (SWCDs).

Prior to being elected to the TSSWCB four years ago, Russell served four years on the Association of Texas Soil and Water Conservation Districts (ATSWCD) Board. In 1971, Russell was elected to the McClellan Creek Soil and Water Conservation District Board and served on this Board for 35 years, 16 years as chairman. He has also served on various committees of the National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD).

"I started farming in 1958 after

college and a tour of duty with the U. S. Army. Conservation of our soil and water is a challenge we must give our total attention. It is a God-given gift that we must protect for ourselves and future generations," he said.

The TSSWCB's chief responsibility is to coordinate the programs of Texas' 217 SWCDs. In addition, the TSSWCB is the lead agency in Texas for programs relating to abating agricultural and silvicultural nonpoint source pollution.

The TSSWCB board of directors consists of five elected members and two governor appointees. The five members are elected in a convention-style election by SWCD directors in the State District that the TSSWCB member represents.

Russell and his wife, Mary Lou, have three surviving children and fifteen grandchildren. His family is involved in a farming operation consisting of about 1500 acres of irrigated and dryland farmland and also have a stocker cattle operation.
