Co. Commissioners Reinstate Burn Ban

Wheeler County commissioners' court met in regular session on Monday, November 24, 2008, in the commissioners' courtroom. The meeting opened at 10:00 a.m. with thirteen items on the agenda.

The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment at presented

The bills for the month were approved for payment.

No action was taken on the budget.

Due to the dry conditions, the commissioners voted to put the burn ban back into effect; effective Thursday, November 27. The order in its entirety is printed below.

Item #5 had to do with the minutes of previous meeting. No action was taken.

The treasurer's report was approved.

David Britten met with the commissioners for the approval of the purchase of a motor grader off Buy Board for Precinct 4. The purchase in the amount of \$196,432 was approved; this involved the \$29,500 trade-in. Cost with the trade-in was \$166,932.00.

The commissioners approved the contract with UniFirst for four (4) county buildings.

The commissioners approved the adjustment of the hourly pay rate for part time sheriff's department employees. The part-time dispatchers will receive \$12.65 per hour and part-time deputies will receive \$14.65 per hour.

Sheriff Joel Finsterwald presented the sheriff's department report on racial profiling for the past year; none was indicated.

The commissioners will participate in the Healthy County Wellness program. Jauna Benefield was named to get the program underway with help from Judge Hefley.

Stop signs on County Roads "17" and "2" will be changed to yield signs.

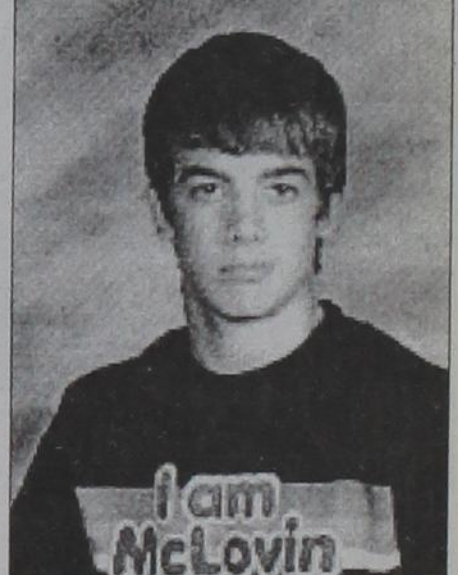

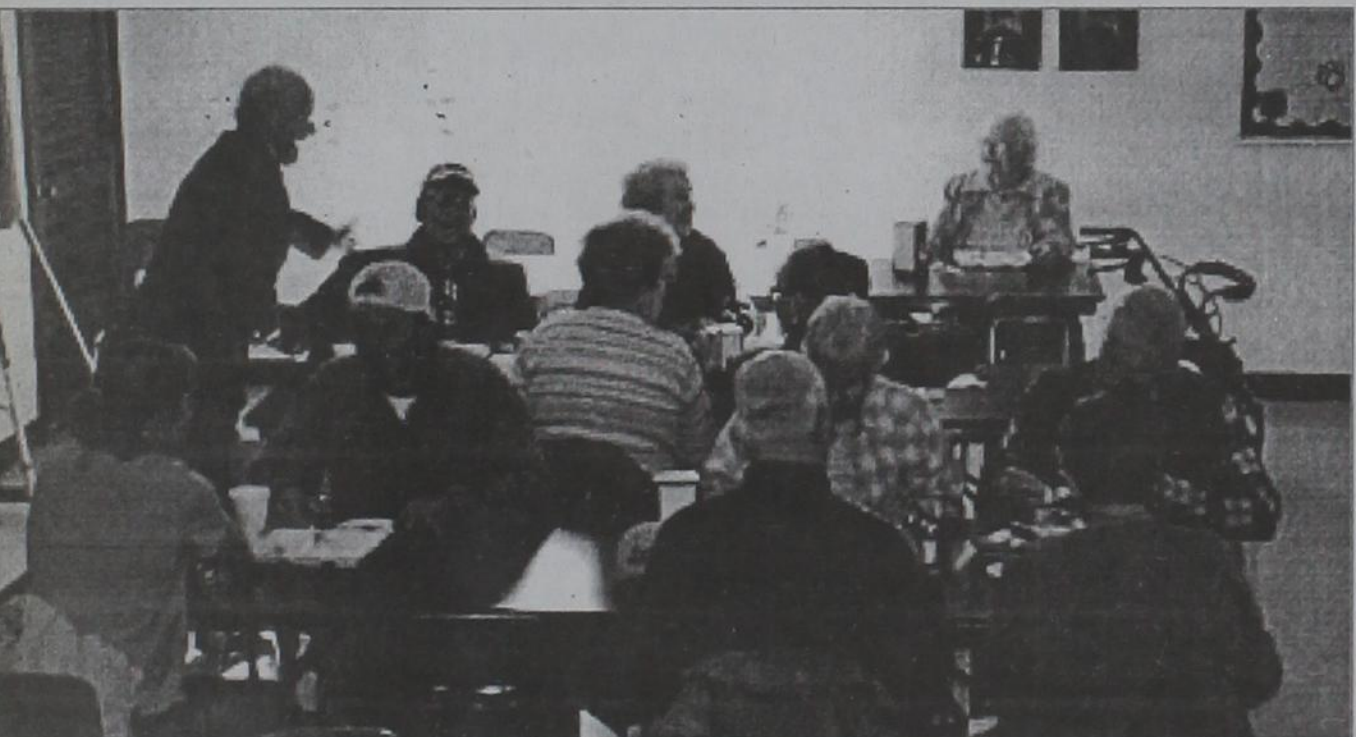

County Road "28" for the installation of pipeline. The commissioners will again meet on Monday, December 8.

Burn Ban

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court finds that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County that all outdoor burning is prohibited in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code Sec. 352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for:

- (1) Firefighter Training;
- (2) Public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations;
- (3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; and
- (4) bums that are conducted by a prescribed bum manager certified under Sec. 153.048, Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Sec. 153.047, Natural Resources Code;

In accordance with Local Government Code Sec. 352.081(h), a violation of this Order is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

ADOPTED this 24th day of November, 2008, by a vote of 4 ayes and 0 nays.

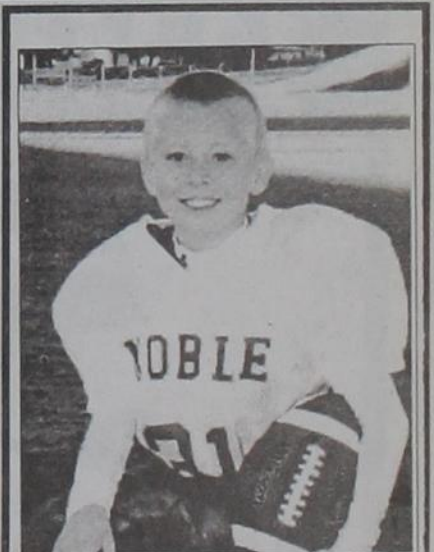

Travel Safely Over Thanksgiving

When you're packing the car for your annual Thanksgiving trip, be sure to pack your patience and drive safely by obeying all traffic laws.

"We want you to get to your destination safely," said Col. Stan Clark, interim director of the DPS. "Be patient. There will be a lot of other families traveling, and traffic is likely to be congested. Leave yourself plenty of time to get where you're going, and drive friendly. Slow down, buckle up and drive sober."

Many travelers are expected to hit the road for Thanksgiving, so all available DPS troopers will be patrolling Texas highways looking for speeders, drunk drivers and those not properly secured by safety restraints.

During the Wednesday through Sunday Thanksgiving period last year, DPS troopers wrote 10,426 citations for speeding and made 400 arrests for driving while intoxicated. They also arrested 34 minors for driving under the influence of alcohol. They wrote 1,026 citations for seatbelt violations and 358 for child restraint violations. DPS has a no-warnings policy for seat belt and child restraint violations.

Troopers are participating in Operation CARE—Combined Accident Reduction Effort—a nationwide effort by police agencies to reduce fatalities on major interstate highways during holiday weekends.

DPS expects a large number of travelers on the road and encourages drivers to leave themselves plenty of time to get where they're going. Avoid bad driving habits that lead to road rage, such as:

- Not using turn signals
- Driving in the passing lane

Parkview Artery Thanksgiving Food Safety Tips

Thanksgiving is upon us and with it comes the traditional turkey dinner. However, the improper storing, cooking, and serving of roast turkey can lead to the growth of harmful bacteria like salmonella, which can cause foodborne illness.

Here are some tips to share with your family for preparing a Thanksgiving bird safely.

Thaw the frozen turkey in the refrigerator. Allow one day for each five pounds of turkey. A twenty-pound turkey will take about four days to thaw. Hint: Remove neck & giblets from inside the bird as soon as possible to hasten thawing.

Do not thaw on the kitchen counter. If you do not have time to thaw in the refrigerator, you may thaw it in cold water, provided that the turkey is in a leak-proof packaging, it is submerged, and the water is changed every half-hour. Allow 30 minutes per pound of turkey to thaw in cold water.

Cook fresh turkeys within two days, thawed ones within four days. Wash your hands with hot, soapy water before and after handling raw poultry. Wash all knives, cutting boards and utensils also after using for raw poultry.

Read and follow the cooking directions on the label. Cook turkey until it is done (165°F). Do not slow cook overnight at low temperatures or partially cook. Some turkeys come with pop-up thermometers. They are to be used only as a guide to doneness. Take the temperature with a meat thermometer to be sure the temperature is over 165°F.

Reheat all leftovers to 165°F. (Use your meat thermometer.) Gravy should be brought to a rolling boil.

Follow these simple tips to help assure your family and guests a safe Thanksgiving Day.

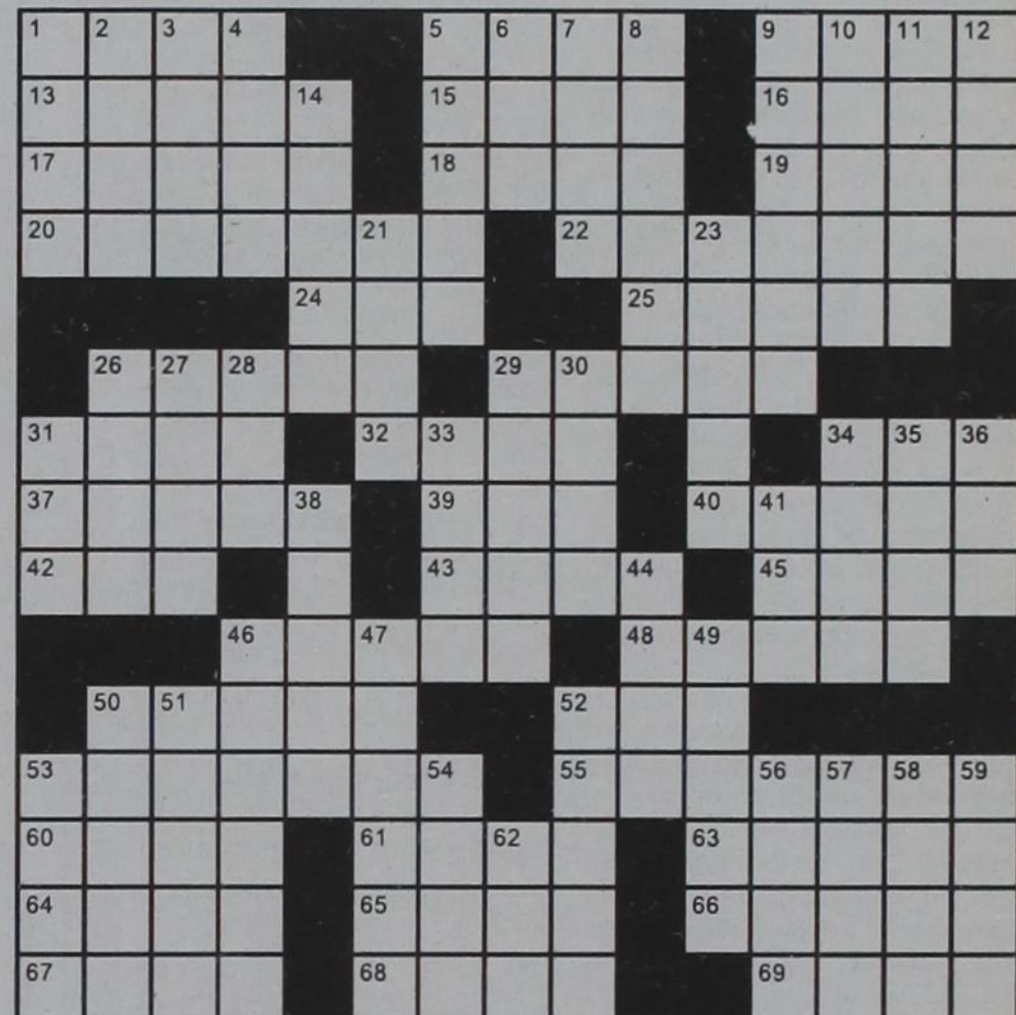

High Energy Costs Solutions Take Time

Texas is the second most populous state in the nation with more than 23 million people, many of whom are busy driving cars, working to support their families and heating and cooling their homes. As the population of Texas grows, the people of this great state are using more energy than ever before, facing higher energy costs and looking for cheaper solutions. Couple these issues with the fact that the climate change debate puts pressure on carbon-emitting sources, and any way you look at it, energy prices are squeezing our families and our economy.

Our state and national economies need reliable energy to keep growing. That means adding necessary infrastructure, although costly. Texans understand this as well as anyone, because our state has added more than 34,000 megawatts of new electric generation since 1996 and invested almost \$4 billion in new or upgraded transmission lines since 1999. Continuing to maintain and upgrade this infrastructure alone will cost billions, not to mention changes that may be necessary for bridges, highways and filling stations to bring our transportation system into the 21st century. There is some good news on the horizon, however, even in the midst of almost daily dire predictions.

We have resources here at home? oil and natural gas across the country and offshore, along with coal and uranium? and many promising renewable energy technologies at various stages of development to meet the challenges we face. As we face the prospect of continued demand growth and high energy prices, we must also be prepared for high-cost investments in energy infrastructure, clean energy research and development, and more baseload power production. Before we continue down this path, we need to have an open and thorough conversation about our choices in Texas to both mitigate prices and ensure robust and reliable supply.

Texans should have the opportunity to understand the full range of options, consider the tradeoffs and assess the impact of policy decisions by Austin or Washington before moving forward. Groups like Power Across Texas, a recently created information forum to help Texans plan a clean, affordable and abundant energy future, understand that no one technology or state or federal policy is going to solve our energy problems. By making the most informed decisions possible, we can successfully adjust to the new realities of the energy market and prepare for the future.

We all need to be better informed about some of the energy economy options before us. Carbon taxes or other plans to control greenhouse gas emissions, for example, are frequently suggested as policy solutions. Carbon control mechanisms may be enacted in the future. That means Texans should start studying now what these plans might mean for our economy, our workforce and our pocket books.

Power Across Texas and others are committed to discussing all of our options for a balanced energy portfolio and providing objective information in order to have an informed debate about our future energy policies. There are no obvious answers when it comes to energy policy. Only by examining all alternatives and building a flexible consensus can we plan an energy future for all Texans that includes clean, affordable and abundant energy.
