The third of the \$1500 Chamber of Commerce Christmas drawings will be held Saturday, December 18, 2004. The first three drawings will be on Saturday and the final drawing will be on Christmas Eve.

The drawings will be at 11:00 A.M. Seventeen individuals will be called forward for the third drawing. The division of the money will be 10-\$10, 4-\$25, 2-\$50 and 1-\$100.

The annual Christmas Drawing will again be offered by the progressive merchants of Wheeler. Certificates will be given away during December totaling \$1500. 
Daniel Miller Is A SWOSU Graduate



Now we still have the Nathaniel Hillhouse Toys for Tots Memorial to top off the holiday season. They need items for children 0-15.


