WHEELER GIRLS ROLL PAST ADRIAN, 65-43
(Editor's Note: The following article was taken from the Wednesday, Feb. 19, 1986 Daily News.)

Dee Ann Jolly scored 26 points, 20 from the freethrow line, to lead Wheeler to a 65-43 win over Adrian in a foughlplaged Class 1A girls' basketball area playoff game here Tuesday.

There were 52 fouls in the game and seven players, two from Wheeler and five from Adrian fouled out.

The Mustangettes broke the game open in the third quarter leading by just five points at halftime. Miss Jolly connected on 13 of 14 free-throw attempts in the first half and 20 of 23 for the game. Marlo Hartman contributed 11 points for Wheeler (27-3).

Meeting Announced On Conservation Program

Wheeler County farmers can find out about details of the new Conservation Reserve Program of the recently passed farm bill at one of two meetings scheduled for this area of the state. Meetings are scheduled for February 25, in Lubbock at the TAMU Research and Extension Center, Highway 87 North and February 26, in Abilene in the Jury Assembly Room on the 3rd floor of the new courthouse. Both meetings will run from 9:00 a.m.—12:00 noon.

The meetings will be hosted by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, which has educational responsibilities for the program, points out Don King, County Extension Agent.

Extension Service specialists plus officials with the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service and Soil Conservation Service will be on hand to explain the provisions of the program.

The Conservation Reserve Program is aimed at taking highly erodible cropland out of production in an effort to protect soil resources and to curb production of surplus farm commodities, says King.
