

# NOTICE **Concerning Drip Gas**

In the past, gas companies have given drip gas to farmers for their own use. Since gas has become a valuable commodity, it is now being reclaimed to be refined.

If you are capturing drip gas out of a pipeline, even if it is on your own land and for your own use, you must get written permission from the Gas Company. There is a Gas Company in the process of prosecuting individuals for this very thing. Stealing even one gallon of unrefined petroleum product is a Felony, and it is a serious charge. I hadn't worried about this previously, to my knowledge the companies hadn't minded, but that is no longer the case. They will prosecute any subjects caught taking this substance from locations. It has since come to my attention

that drip gas is being sold through the service stations in Wheeler 12-31 County. I have the Texas Railroad Commission and the State Comp-1-3 troller Assisting me in stopping this problem. 1-4

I hope the above information I have shared with you will help to solve this problem, to save prosecution in our own country.
