Pokey the Clown will be on the square, with entertainment and competitions for young and old alike.

#### Pokey's WRCA Ranch Rodeo

This rodeo is in affiliation of the Working Ranch Cowboy's Association. It's an excellent opportunity for children and adults to experience some of the skills used by working cowboys on ranches today. There is no real livestock—instead, Pokey uses wooden "live-stock" in all events. This enables all ages to participate. The winning team of each group qualifies for the WRCA World Championships in November of each year in Amarillo, Texas.

The entry fee is \$20.00 per four-person team. There are three age groups. Each team will compete in four events; Pony Express Race, Steer Doctoring, Wild Cow Milking and Calf Branding.

The goals of these rodeos are to teach young people the ways of the American Cowboy and to keep our American heritage alive. It also teaches young people to compete in an event as a team, just as on a real ranch.

Pokey will also have "The Cowherd" barrel train. The longhorn herd is pulled by a riding lawnmower and the fee to ride is \$1.00 per person. This is guaranteed to create excitement, adventure and entertainment for all. Almost all of the proceeds will benefit a local charity. On April 27, 1956 in Anson, Texas Bobby Cornell and Mary Lou Elrod were married in her parents home.

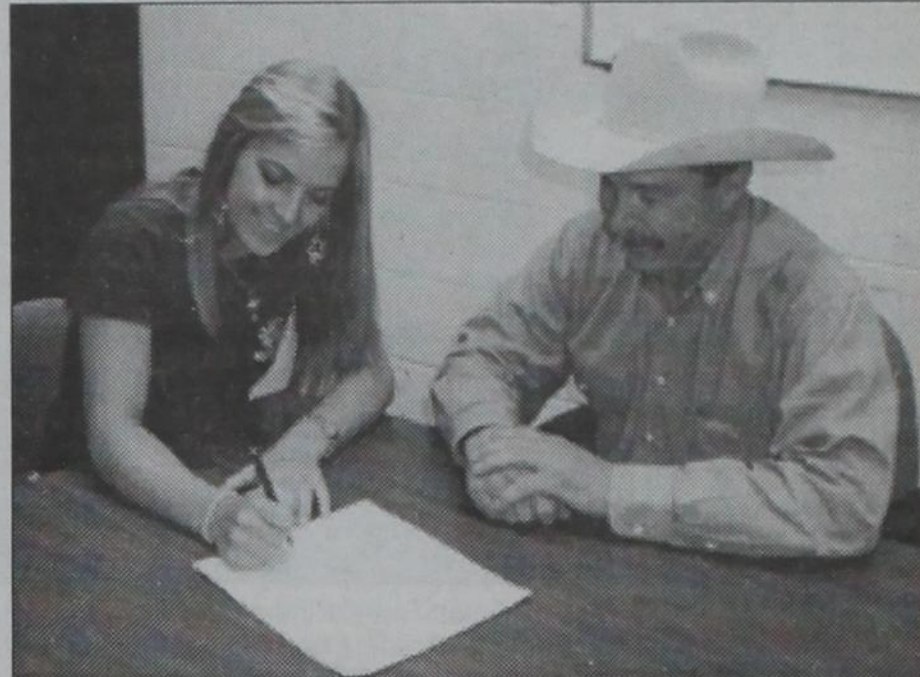

#### Rites In Mesquite

Frank Otis Mote Jr. born December 25, 1925 in Davis, Oklahoma passed away April 19, 2006 in Mesquite, Texas. Frank served in the Atlantic Theater during World War II and was with the first troops to go into Hiroshima, Japan after the Atomic bomb was dropped. Frank retired from the Dallas Police Department in 1986 after 34 years of service. He served in many capacities within the Department retiring with the rank of Sergeant of Detectives. After his retirement from the Dallas Police Department Frank worked with Dallas County Sheriff's Department for 10 years, as a Bailiff in the Dallas County Court House. Frank was a member of the James Burgess Masonic Lodge #1305 in Dallas.

Frank was preceded in death by his first wife, Betty Hudson, a daughter, Mary Mote who died from Leukemia at the age of 6 and a daughter Patsy Mote Camp and grandson Frank Otis Mote III.

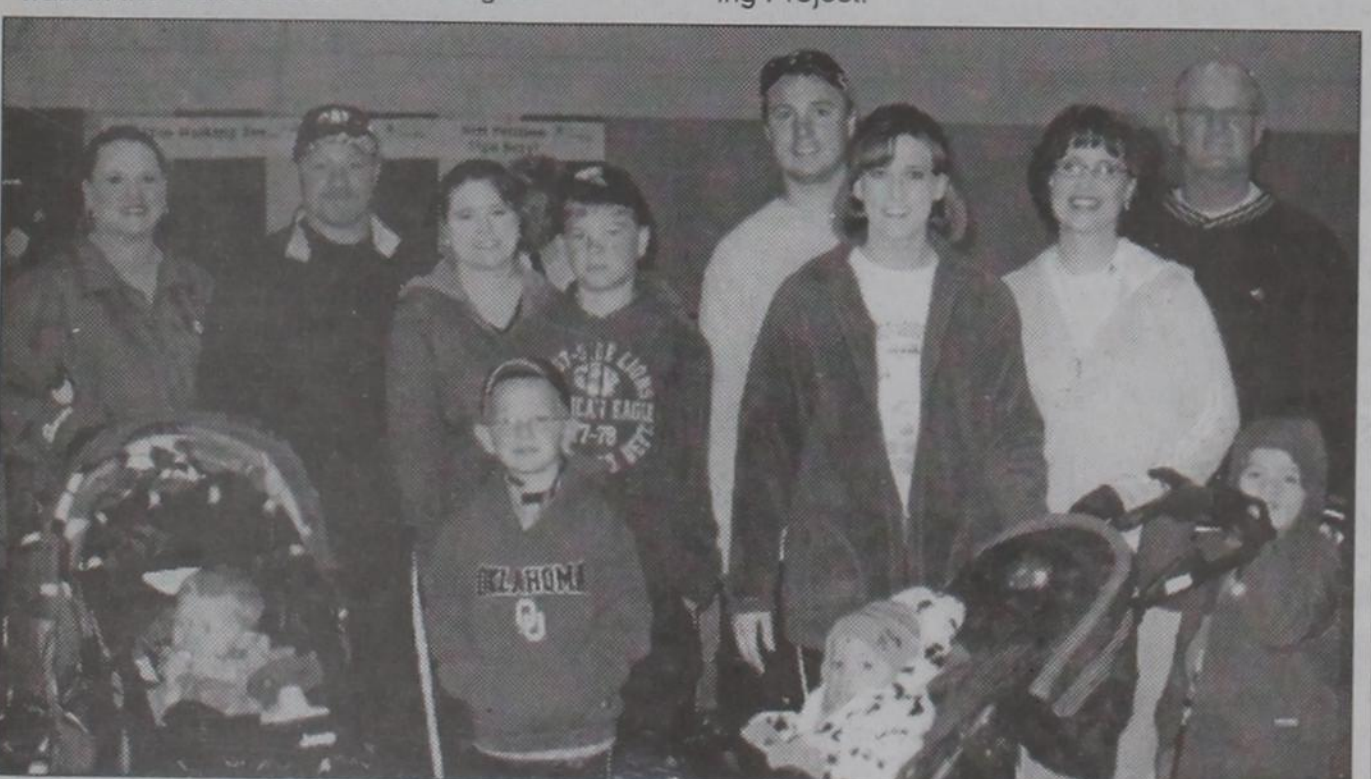

**Wheeler Church of Christ**

Some of these thoughts are adapted from an article by Greg Cummings I recently read concerning false advertising. A group of women came together to discuss the problem of deceptive packaging, false advertising, and truth-in-labeling. But during the discussion, a survey of these women was taken and they discovered the following results: 35% of those presented tinted their hair, 11% were wearing wigs, 80% were wearing rouge, 98% had on lipstick, 75% wore eye shadow, 22% had false eyelashes, 9% had on nail polish, and 9% had once had cosmetic surgery. They had to admit that they also practiced deceptive advertising.

Now there is really no harm in dressing up, but this illustrates two very important things:

1.) People have an enormous capacity for condemning in others the same sins they commit. For example, people intolerantly condemn intolerance. Gossipers gossip about a neighbor's weakness for gossip. Dishonest folks bemoan the dishonesty rampant in our culture. Those with a judgmental spirit criticize others for judging. People consumed with prejudice wail against reverse discrimination. We complain about traditionalism down at church until it is our traditions that are challenged. For this important detail, just go read Matthew 7:3.

And 2.) False advertising exists in the church as well as in the world. There are many people who claim to be Christians but do not walk the talk. Almost everyone claims membership in a church someplace, but how many actually attend? Participate? Most people give verbal assent to Christian virtues like honesty, faithfulness, and fairness, but do not live what they preach. For this important detail, just go read Matthew 23:27.

Go ahead, dress up if it pleases you. But be sure that when you put on Christ, it changes you both inside and out.
