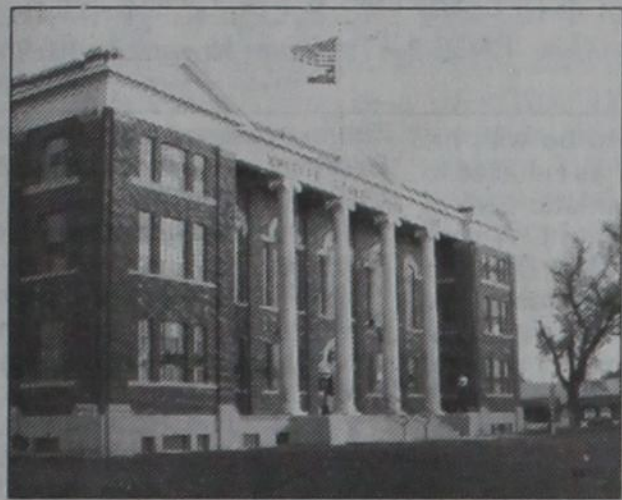

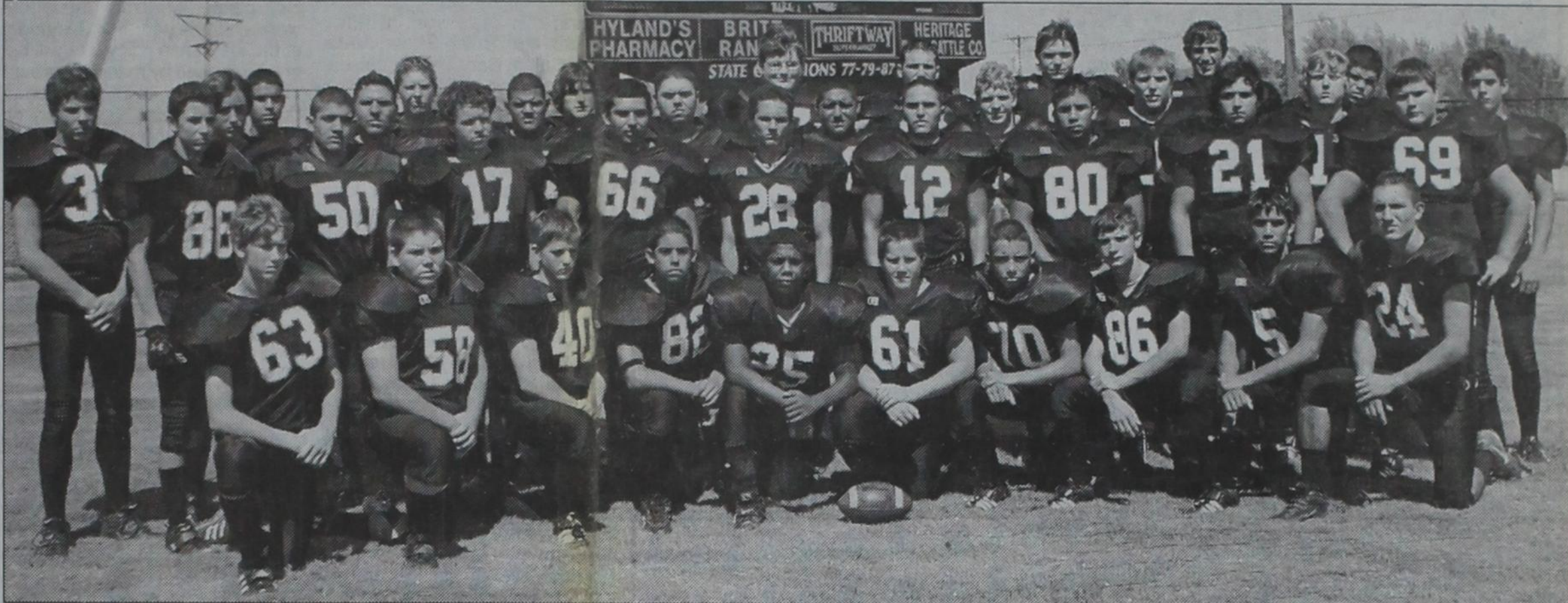

A first show will be held — at the Quilt Baptist Church Fellowship Hall.

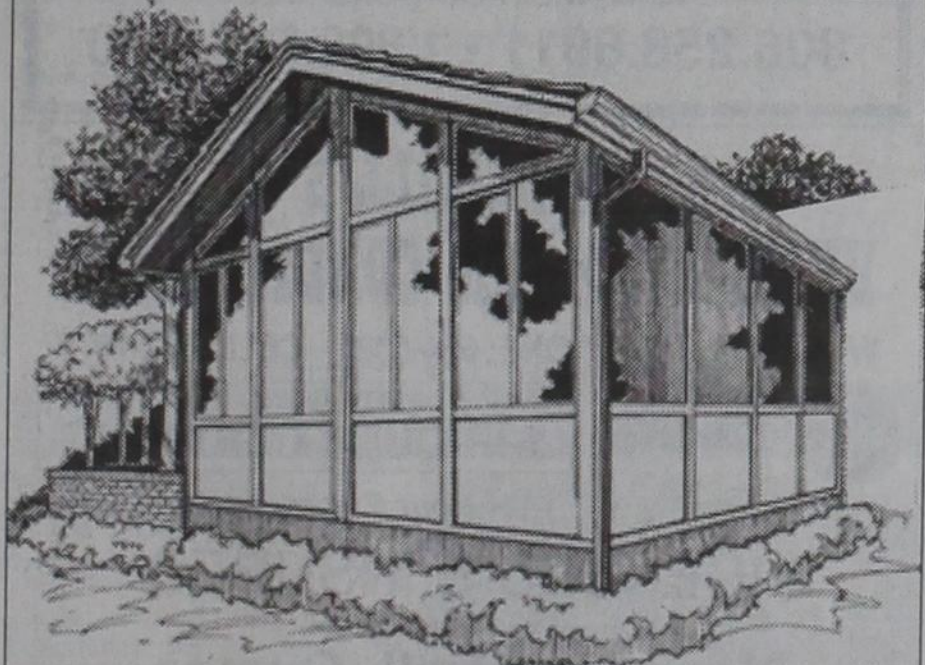
Businesses will be open late on Monday evening.

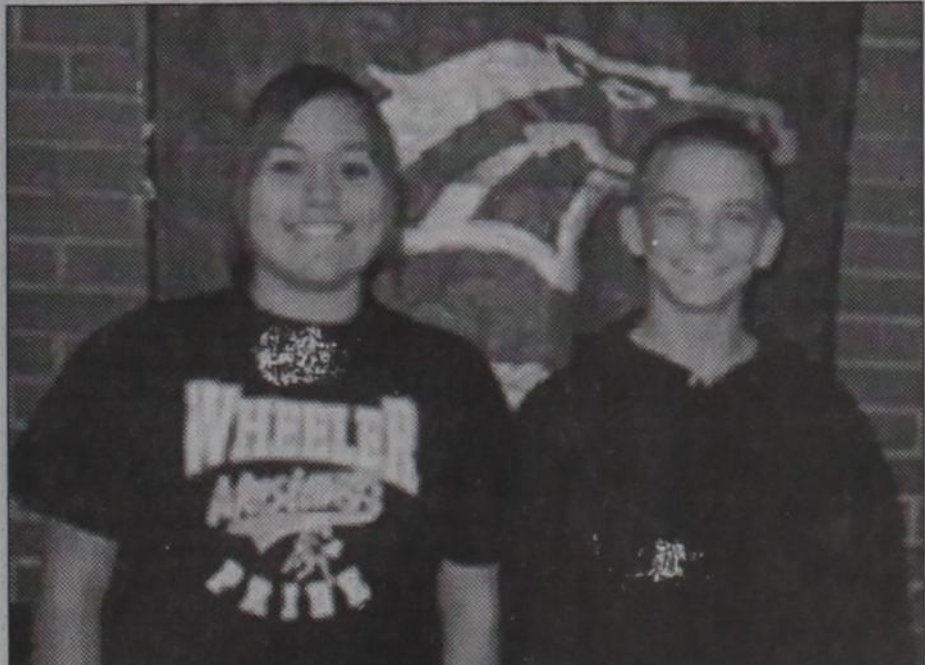

Commissioners' Court Meets Mon., Burn Ban Goes Into Effect Thurs.

The Wheeler County Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, November 13, 2006, at 10:30 a.m. in the commissioners' courtroom in Wheeler. Seventeen items were on the agenda.

The court approved the minutes of the previous meetings as presented.

The court accepted the monthly reports of both Justices of the Peace, County Treasurer, County Tax Assessor, County Clerk and District Clerk.

The hourly payrolls were approved for payment as presented.

Budget action was the transfer of \$23,700 from the Sheriff's equipment fund to Pct. 2 equipment fund, in relation to a vehicle transaction within the departments.

The commissioners voted the burn ban into effect as of Thursday, November 16, 2006. The burn ban information appears elsewhere in the paper.

Rodney Murray, TxDOT, met with the commissioners to get the county's part on the Adobe Creek highway project. The court voted to pay \$100, the county's cost of the project. The project is the reconstruction of a bridge on west highway 152, near Mobeetie.

Sherri Jones, District Clerk, asked the commissioners permission to hire Konnette Koen as a part-time employee, effective Oct. 30, 2006, at a wage of \$8.00 per hour. Permission was given.

The court approved fourteen holidays for the county employees for 2007.

The court voted to allow four road crossings: Dominion Exploration will cross County Road B for

the installation of an oil and gas
