



### Funding Sought For Four Seasons Sunroom For Wheeler Cemetery

The Wheeler Cemetery Association is asking for donations from local citizens and families of the deceased who are buried in the Wheeler Cemetery to help fund a project called the "Four Seasons Memorial Room." The project will be constructed on the north side of the cemetery near the flag pole. The 12'x 24' building will be in a sun room style and will house a map of the cemetery and an index of the names and locations of those interred in the cemetery. There will also be seating for those who need shelter from the sun, rain, wind and cold while visiting the cemetery.

The building will be constructed by Four Seasons Sunrooms Designs & Remodeling Center of Amarillo. The company is a sunroom specialist and has been in business continuously for over 30 years.
