They went on to the District Contest to capture second place and the opportunity to compete in the State Contest June 6-7. The girls will be accompanied to College Station for the contest by Mrs. Andy Taylor, who also plays the piano for the number.

Jan Taylor is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Andy Taylor of Eastland. Her father is employed with the Texas State Highway Department. Jan has one older sister, Sandy, who is a student at Ranger College.
Jan is an eighth grade student of Eastland Junior High School where she has a record of being a straight "A" student. She serves as secretary-treasurer of the Eastland seventh and eighth grades 4-H Club.

Although music is her main interest she also is a sports minded girl for she likes to play tennis, swim and watch football games.

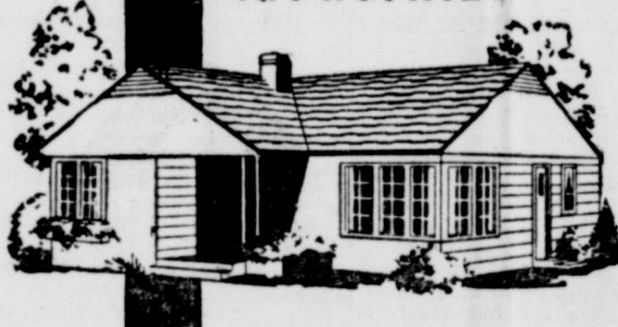

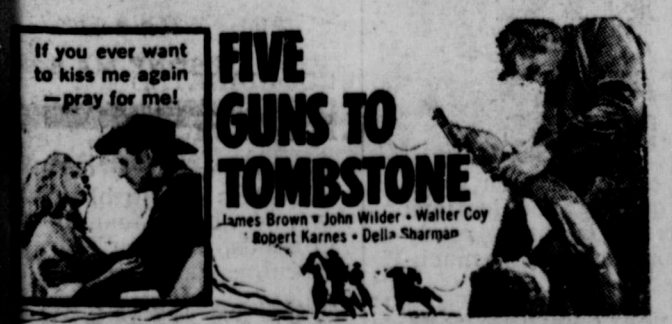

HD Council And Club Members to Observe HD Week

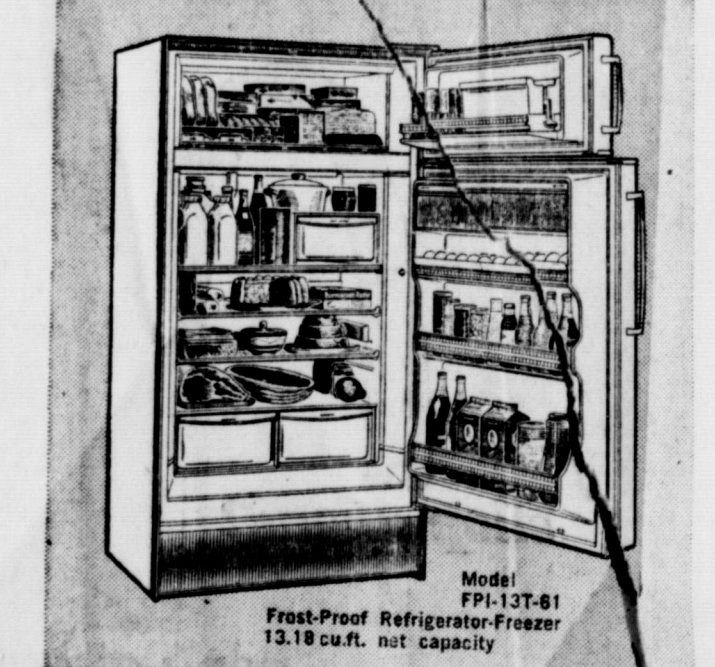

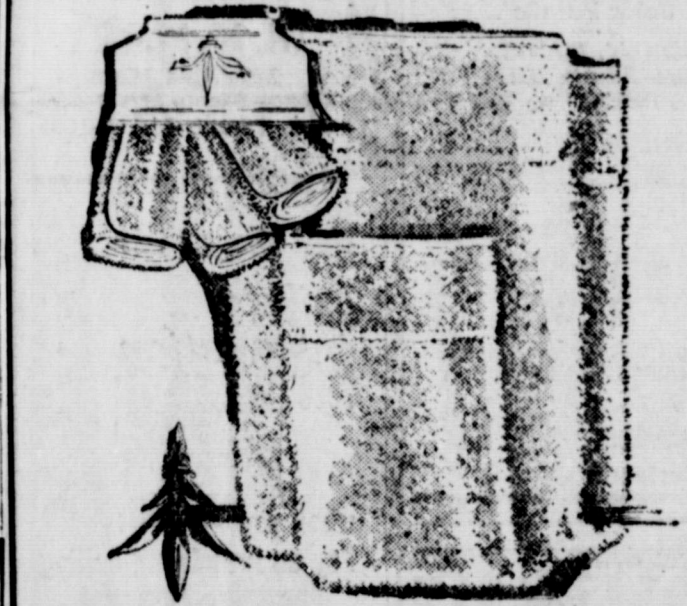
