 Wendell is one of the married students on the Ranger College campus. His wife is the former Rayma Roberts, also from Odessa, graduated from Permian High School.

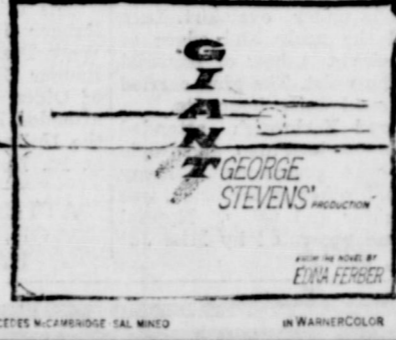

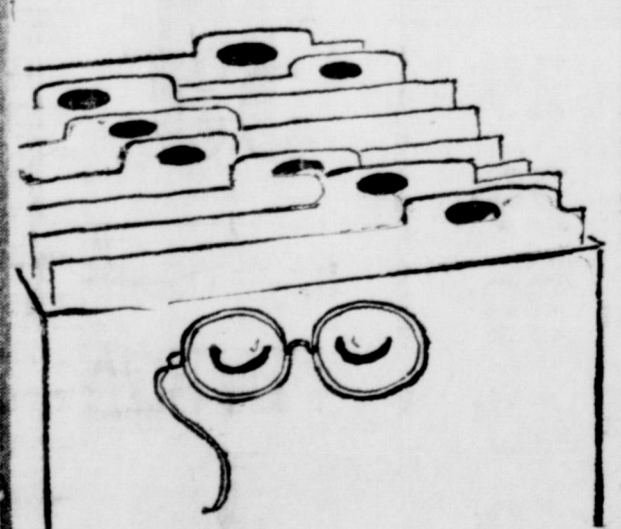
