

Truck Operators' Highway Tax Is Explained

A considerable number of truck operators have not paid their Fed-Chief Laney paid thanks to eral use tax on highway motor vehicles, according to A. E. Fogle Jr., Administrative Officer of the Abilene office of the Internal Re-venue Service. The Internal Revenue Service has surveyed the State Registration Records and has prepared a fist of the truck operators subject to the Federal highway use tax who have not filed their tax return on Form 2290 and paid their tax.

Mr. Fogle explained that although the law had been in effect since July 1, 1956, many truck operators still are not familiar with the tax and with the fact that a return must be filed annually and the tax paid. Those who do not file and pay terest at the rate of 6 per cent per is due. In addition, there is a penalty of 5 per cent a month, but not to exceed 25 per cent, for delinquent filing in the absence of reasonable cause for the delinquency.
