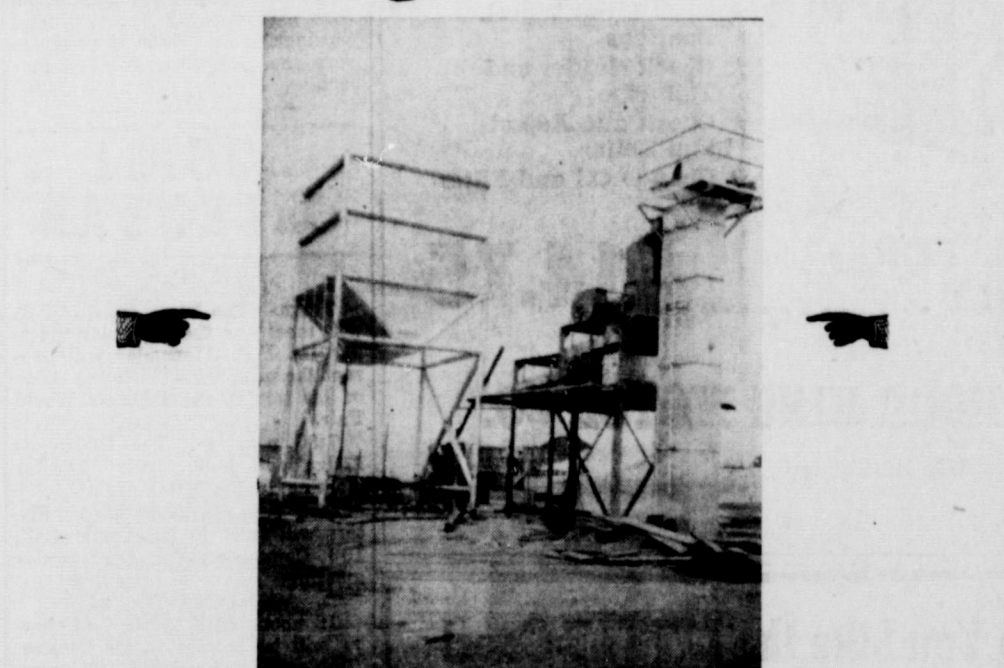

**THE INSTALLATION OF A CLEANER FOR FARMERS' STOCK PEANUTS**

We are now able to custom clean your peanuts for you before they are graded. Peanuts which are not eligible for loan because of excess foreign material can now be made eligible by cleaning.

Here's the way it works. The peanuts are emptied into an elevator which takes them up to the cleaner. The cleaner will remove most of the sand, rocks, sticks, leaves, etc. They are sampled as they leave the cleaner. Another elevator takes them to an overhead bin which will hold them until the entire load has been cleaned.

The clean peanuts are then loaded into a truck and weighed prior to selling. Your grade and weight are determined on clean peanuts.

The cost of cleaning will be much less than the penalty for excess foreign material. It will pay you to see us before selling your peanuts.
