Since Lyne T. Barrett drilled the first well at Melrose in 1866, oil fields have become a part of every Texan's heritage. On January 10, 1901 the

Spindletop well, near Beaumont, made Texas petroleum history. The great gusher produced 94 percent of the states oil in 1902 and oil prices dropped to an all-time low of 3 cents a barrel, quite a contrast to today's prices.

Living in the heart of Eastland County, Eastland residents are well acquainted with the oil industry. Eastland County oil wells have produced over 122 million barrels of oil since 1917.
