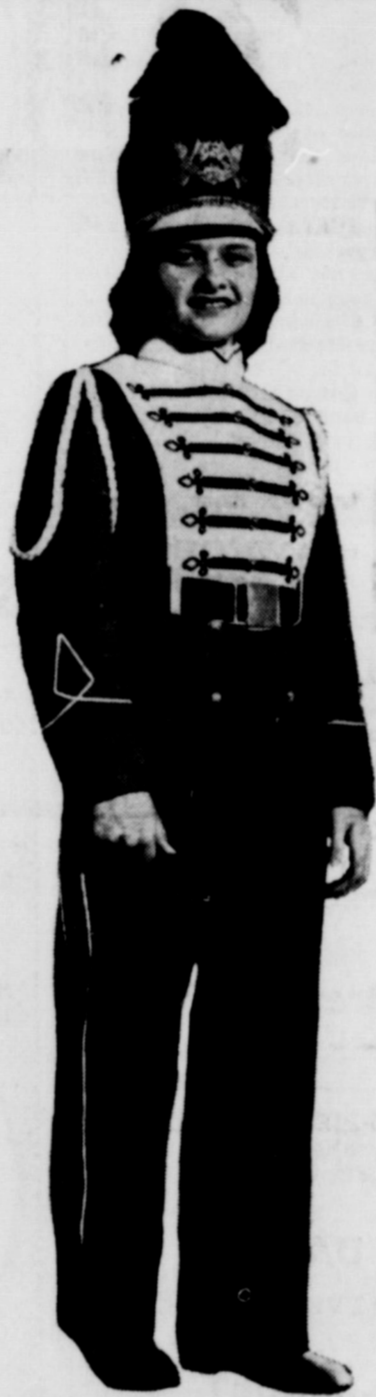

vision's 10,000 citizen-soldiers in 78 Texas cities is a job in itself. Telephone, radio and even messengers will be used in rounding up the Guard's men.

Once the officers and enlisted men have reported to their armory or training center, equipment and weapons will be issued. Timing will be checked too.

Immediately the Guard's men will report to their actual duty assignments.

"We are looking forward to the alert", said Lt. Ragsdale, "our unit wants to show the people of Ranger that we are ready for any emergency".

The alert is the first of its kind for the 49th Armored Division since the unit took part in a nationwide exercise "Operation Minuteman" in 1955. Since then units have held annual practice alerts at local level.
