I noticed that in many of the old public buildings in Europe the floors are of wood blocks, some in two colors to make a pleasing pattern. Others are made of small boards, two inches wide and about a foot long, laid in a herring bone pattern. A very characteristic feature of all these floors is that the blocks or boards are loose and squeak as they are walked upon. I like Vienna and will remain here a few days. ### Annual Stocking Doesn't Assure Better Fishing

Rough fish always have been a big problem in Texas' Lake waters, according to the director of inland fisheries, Texas Game and Fish Commission. "Our aquatic biologists are working with this problem daily, attempting to discover new techniques for controlling undesirable fish."

According to the director, restocking lakes annually with fingerling bass is not the answer to

the problem. "Quite a number of persons feel that adding more bass fry each year would result in maintaining ideal bass population in lakes. Unfortunately, this is not so," said the director. "Most often, stocking game fish fry only provides a small meal for fish already present in the lake."

Several methods for reducing undesirable fish numbers are being tested on various lakes across the State. One method is to stock predator fish that would feed on young rough fish, in an effort to obtain a natural or biological control on the numbers of rough fish. Biologists are continuously experimenting with this method, such as the introduction of walleyed-pike, redbreast, flathead catfish, and others. Another method being used on many lakes today, is the treatment of lakes with rotenone fish toxicant for complete kills and then restocking with desirable species or reducing overabundant forage fish, such as the gizzard shad, through "selective kills" with rotenone.

"Actually," declared the director, "spawning bass can easily supply a lake with the needed fry since each adult female can lay thousands of eggs. But young rough fish compete with the young game fish and eliminate much of their food, preventing their growth. When you can't catch lots of bass, remember, when plenty of natural food is available, bass are not as apt to hit an artificial lure."

### Quail Food Supply Helped By Disking

The cheapest and most effective method for providing food for bobwhite quail is disk-ing strips in old fields and along fence rows.

Disking, says Ed Cooper, extension wildlife specialist, is often all that is needed to get a good stand of choice quail foods, such as dove-weed and partridge peas, growing. This method of turning the soil can be done at little cost and it gives the quail food plants a chance to compete with more vigorous growing ones. An application of fertilizer, the same as used on pastures in the area will greatly increase the food produced, adds Cooper.

The disked strips should be near low-growing brushy cover to give the birds protection from natural enemies while feeding. The specialist emphasizes that quail may not use the choice foods if cover is not available nearby. And, he adds, it's easier, cheaper and faster to grow food plants near cover than to develop cover plants near good food supplies.

Research has shown that strips of disked land, at least 20 feet wide, are better than square blocks. In disk-ing, the soil should be cut only deep enough to turn the grass, usually about 4 inches, says Cooper. And the best time for carrying out the practice is from now through April. The practice works best when the strips are disked in a three-year rotation, explains the conservationist.

Cooper says that livestock usually will not graze the type of plants which will grow on the disked strips, but if domestic food crops are planted for quail food, fencing is required. Too, the seeds of native plants usually last longer. That is important because quail need the food most in winter and early spring when domestic plant seeds have shattered or rotted.

And this final reminder from Cooper, if you like to have quail around the place, provide them food, cover and protection and they'll stay with you.

### Hit and Run Driver Caught

Police Chief Don Butler and Patrolman Bob Patterson, picked up a hit and run driver in Ranger about 3:30 p.m. Sunday.

Weatherford Highway Patrolmen had put out a call on a hit and run driver who had sideswiped a car on Highway 80 west of Weatherford Sunday afternoon. Ranger police spotted the pickup entering Ranger and picked up the driver, M. C. Shingleton from Arkansas, and booked him for investigation.

Weatherford Highway Patrolmen arrived in Ranger about 4 p.m. and took the suspect back to Weatherford for further investigation.

It was learned that after the accident, Shingleton had turned off on the Gordon cutoff on Highway 80 and went through Strawn and then returned to Highway 80 and proceeded to Ranger. Police reported that the man had been drinking.

Weatherford Patrolmen had parts of a rearview mirror found at the scene of the accident that matched the mirror on Shingleton's pickup.
