CHARLOTTE VAUGHT, EHS' head cheerleader, organized the famous Vaught School for Cheerleaders.

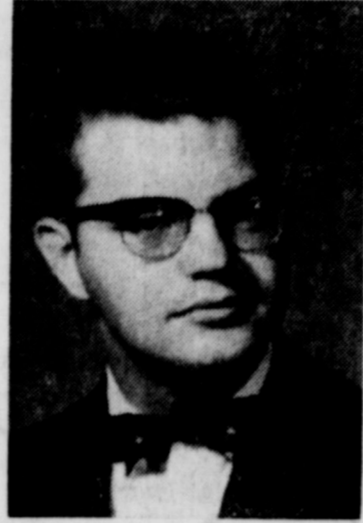

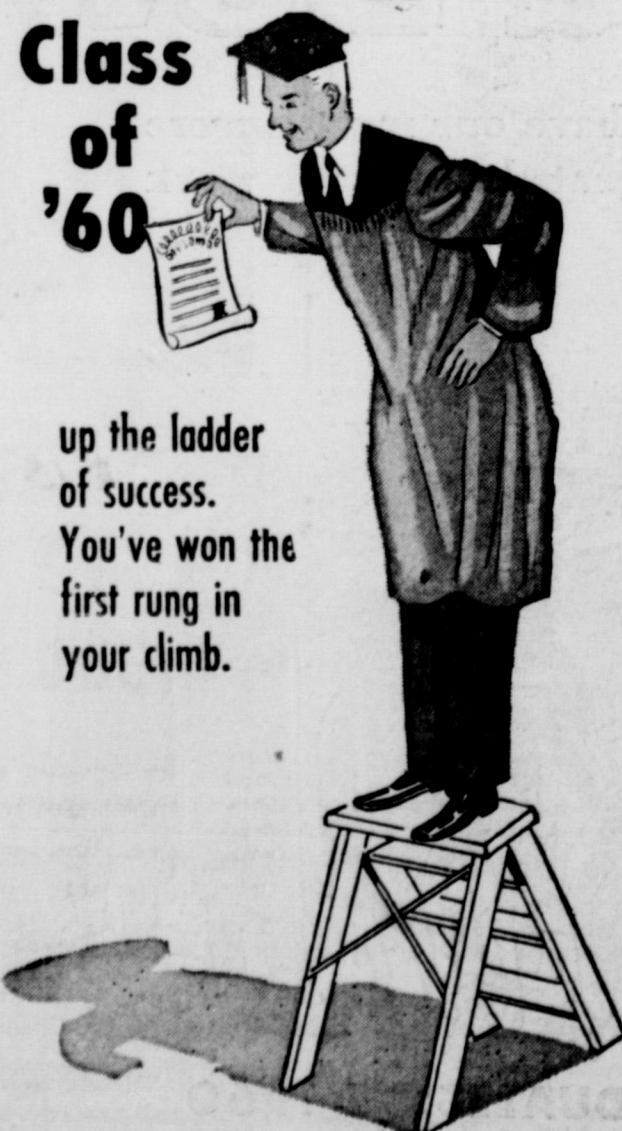

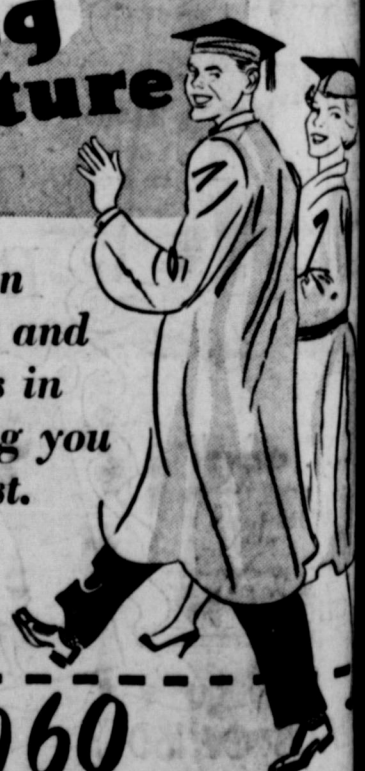

Mrs. O. M. White Hosts Members Of Pioneer Club

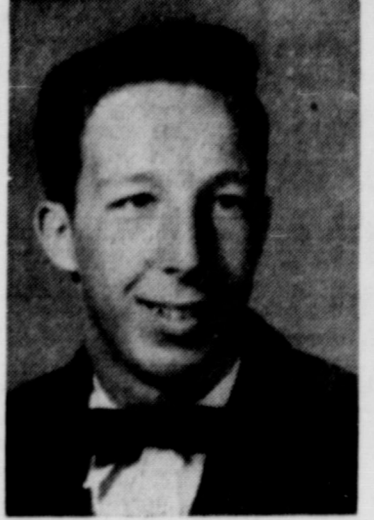
Mrs. O. M. White was hostess to the members of the Pioneer Club at her home at the Power Plant.

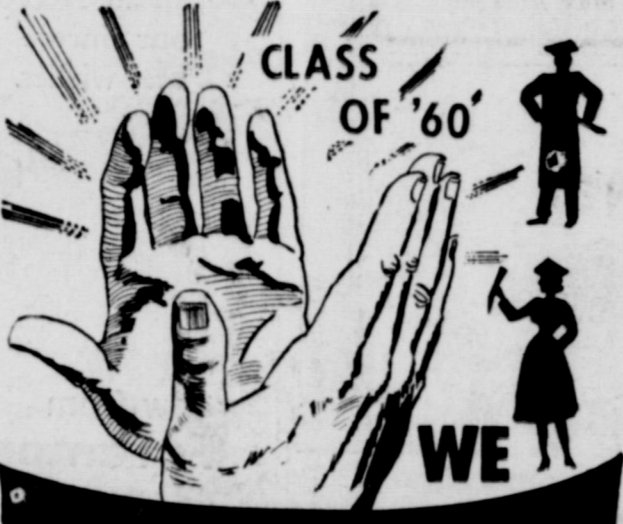

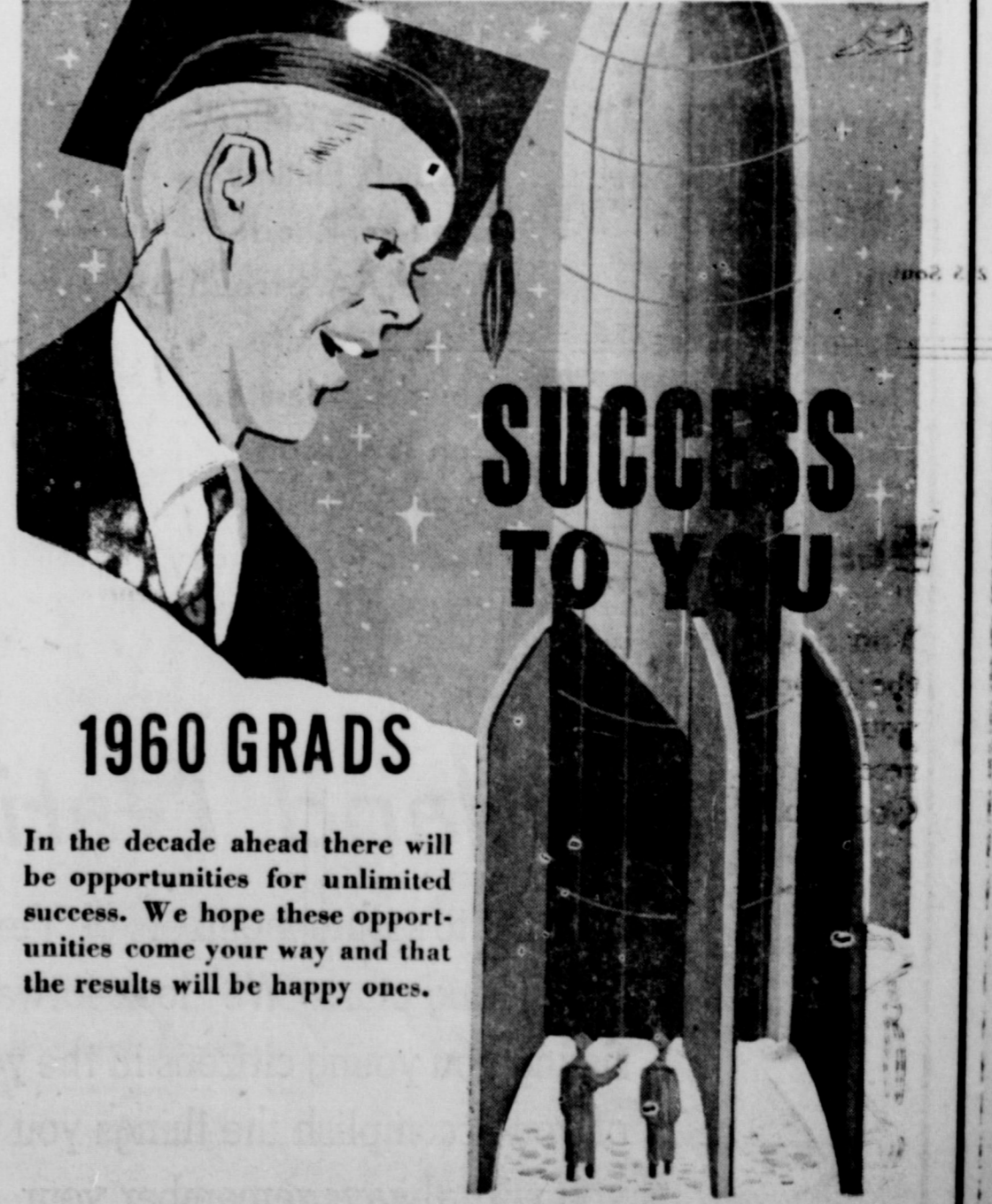

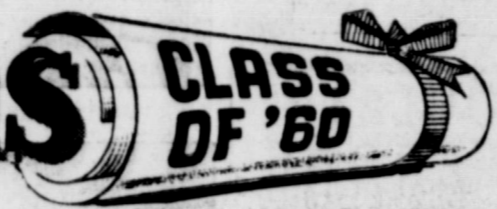

AN ORDINANCE FIXING AND DETERMINING THE GENERAL SERVICE RATE TO BE CHARGED FOR SALES OF NATURAL GAS AND NATURAL GAS SERVICE TO RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL CONSUMERS WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF EASTLAND, EASTLAND COUNTY, TEXAS, PROVIDING FOR THE MANNER IN WHICH SUCH RATE MAY BE CHANGED, ADJUSTED AND AMENDED. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF EASTLAND:

SECTION 1. Effective with the first gas bills rendered on or after the 1st day of May, 1960, the general service rate for sales of natural gas and natural gas service rendered to residential and commercial consumers within the city limits of EASTLAND by Lone Star Gas Company, a Texas corporation, its successors and assigns, is hereby fixed and determined as follows:

Minimum Monthly Bill \$1.00
First 600 Cu. Ft. @ \$.1760 per CCF Gross; \$.1584 per CCF net.
All Over 600 Cu. Ft. 8433 per CCF Gross; .7590 per MCF net.
Net rate shall apply to all bills paid within ten days from monthly billing date.

This ordinance does not regulate any rate or charge except those specifically set out hereinabove.

The above rate is applicable to each residential and commercial consumer per month or for any part of a month for which gas is used at the same location.

SECTION 2. The rate set forth in Section 1 may be changed and amended by either the City or Company furnishing gas in the manner provided by law. Service hereunder is subject to the orders of regulatory bodies having jurisdiction, and to the Company's Rules and Regulations currently on file in the Company's office.

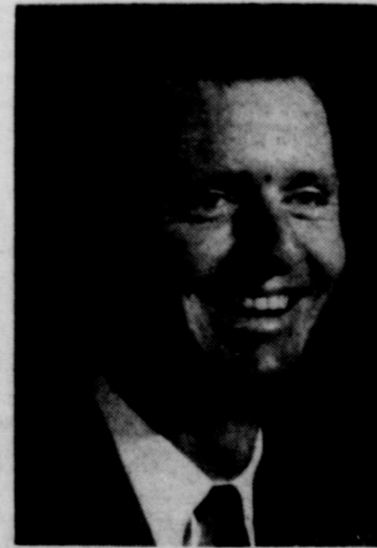

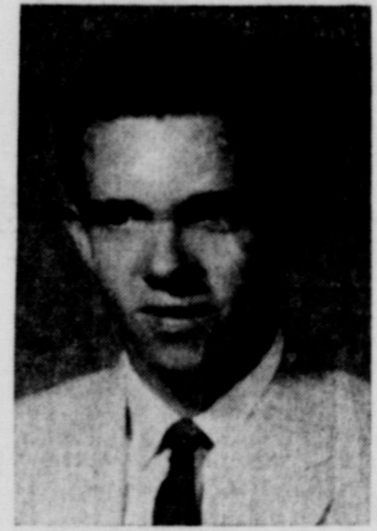
