## Buddy System Is Again In Use By Local Recruiter

The local Air Force Recruiting representative, Sgt. Tom Mabry, announces that it has been a long time since the Air Force Recruiting Service could recruit for "Buddy" flights or groups. The restoration of the buddy system is mainly due to an accelerated quality recruiting program.

The special "Buddy" flight program means that young men from this area can enlist with their friends and join an Air Force "Buddy" flight which assures them of traveling and training together with hometown friends at Lackland Air Force Base. Sgt. Mabry said that it was possible that friends may stay together during other technical training schools if they have the same qualifications, abilities and desires. This special plan will be available for a short time only.

Sgt. Mabry stated that the first phase of basic military training is a course of instruction that provides the fundamental skills of an airman in the United States Air Force in five weeks. The remainder of basic military training is received in conjunction with technical training at one of the following Technical Training Centers, Chanute AFB, Illinois; Keiser AFB, Mississippi; Lowry AFB, Colorado and three bases in Texas—Amarillo, Sheppard and Lackland.

## Texas Electric Has Prototype of Plant to Purify Brackish Waters

A prototype of the nation's first highway-capacity single unit electrolysis plant for removing salt from inland brackish waters such as are found in West Texas has been built by Texas Electric Service Company in Fort Worth.

H. R. Drew, the company's director of research, reported this week at the Summer Annual Meeting of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers in Dallas.

Drew reported that the 40-foot long laboratory unit is capable of treating moderately saline water, making it suitable for human, industrial and agricultural use.

The research on desalting brackish water being conducted in a laboratory at Texas Electric Service Company's North Main generating station is part of the company's continuous program for developing the West Texas area it serves, Drew reported.

"We are hopeful" he said, "that we have taken one more step towards helping to assure an adequate, long-range water supply for the great West Texas region served by Texas Electric. We intend to continue working toward that end. Although desalting water is far from being economically practical in most places in West Texas at this time, it is inevitable that many West Texas cities will eventually need to turn to desalting brackish waters as an additional source of water supply."

Texas Electric Service Com-

any has been carrying on active experimental work in desalting by electrolysis for almost six years, and more recently has been operating three small electrolysis units under regular operating conditions at its Permian Basin Electric Generating Station near Monahans. "We have learned much from the operation of these units," Drew reported, "and have been continually able to improve the equipment being used."

The unit now undergoing research in the Fort Worth laboratory has six product streams capable of producing a total of about 30,000 gallons of potable water per day. It was designed as a model for a plant capable of treating enough water to supply the needs of a city of about 10,000 people. Additional product streams may be added merely by enlarging the original unit.

"We know that our present design is far from the ultimate," Drew declared. "In fact, we have learned enough in building it to warrant starting all over again with an immensely improved version. Nevertheless, it does represent the first attempt in this country to build a prototype for a high-capacity single cell (unit) plant. As such we feel that it is a success."

## Salvation Army to Send Four to Camp

From cities, towns and rural communities all over Texas, including the 223 Service Units now in operation, 450 boys will take leave of Mom and Dad and their youthful playmates, some for the first time in their young lives, as they leave home by bus, private car or train at the week-end to spend one full week, as a camper at the beautiful Camp Hoblitzelle operated by The Salvation Army near Dallas. During the summer camping season three camp periods of one week each will be conducted for boys in Texas, with accommodations for 150 boys during each camping period.

## Applications for Cotton Classing Due August 1

Cotton farmers who have not already filed applications to receive free classing service and market information for their 1960 crop have until Aug. 1 to apply for these services.

Applications should be filed with Roy W. Gilreath, 1407 Ross Avenue, Dallas 2, Texas. Gilreath is in charge of the Agricultural Marketing Service's area cotton office which includes 53 Texas counties and the Oklahoma counties of Bryan, Choctaw and McCurtain.

Procedure for preparing and filing applications has been considerably shortened and simplified this season. "However, promptness in filing is necessary, as time is needed for each group to arrange for submitting samples to the classing office," Gilreath said.

Applications and instructions for applying may be obtained from Gilreath's office or from the county agricultural agent.

Under the free classing service, organized growers learn the grade and staple of each bale of cotton they produce. Through market news they learn what cotton is selling for. These two services put them in better bargaining position when they sell their cotton.

More than 13.7 million bales of cotton, about 95 percent of the 1959 crop, were classed under the Smith-Doxey program last year. This is the largest proportion classed for any crop since the service became available in 1938.

## Senate Passes Bill To Cut Wheat Acreage

The U. S. Senate recently passed and sent to the House a bill designed to cut the nation's huge and costly wheat surplus, in part, by reducing the planted acreage 20 percent.

The bill also included three more years of price supports at the present level plus additional payments in wheat from the nation's towering stockpile, in exchange for the permanent 20 percent cutback in planted acreage, to the growers.

At the present time the allotted acreage is 55 million acres. The measure is designed to cut the planted acreage by 11 million acres, leaving 44 million acres in production.

A rival bill is being kicked around in the House at the present time, and the Senate measure will meet much opposition.

Supporters of the bill said they hoped the Senate, by rejecting the original proposal to boost the price support level, had whittled

Staten also said guar is resistant to cotton root rot, is a dependable producer of high yields of forage and seed, is a valuable livestock feed and increases yield of the crop which follows it. Tassel and Groehler guar consistently produce high yields of seed and are used more frequently for seed production than for forage. Mesa produces large yields of vegetative matter and is valuable as a green manure crop or for silage. Guar is adapted to a wide range of soil types, but thrives best on medium-textured and sandy types. The major area for guar seed production is west of the 35-inch rainfall line. Further information on guar may be obtained by writing the Agricultural Information Office, Texas A & M College, College Station, Texas, and requesting Leaf-let L-482.
