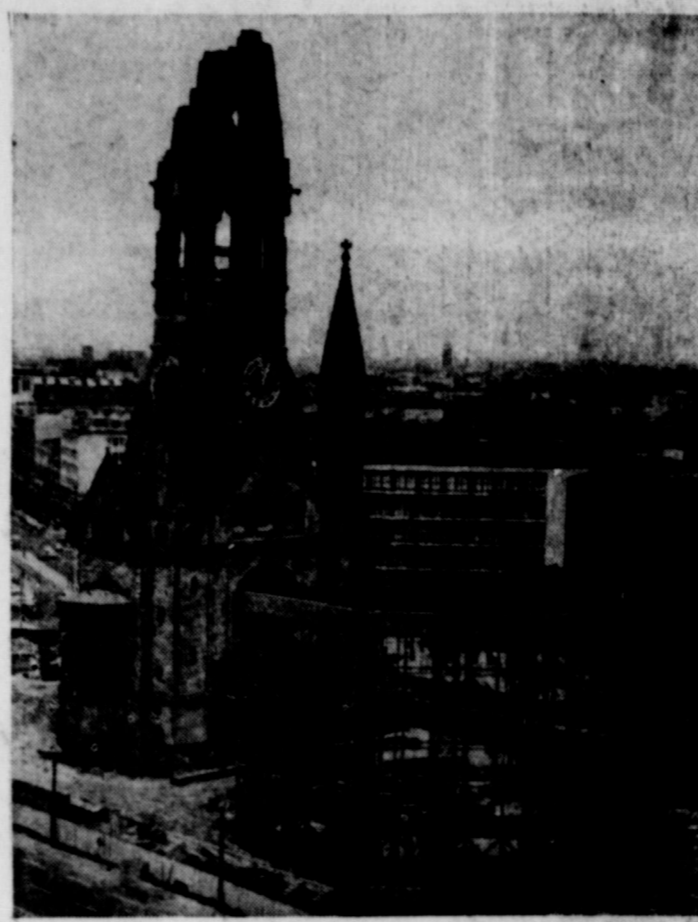

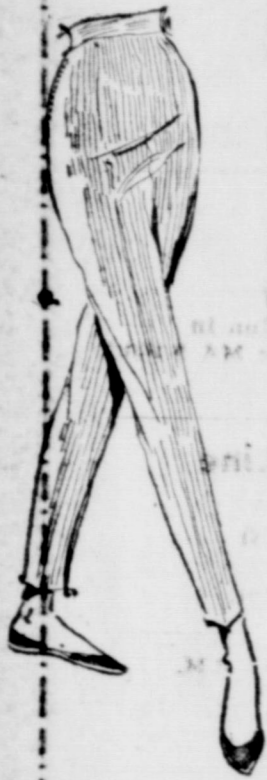

All interested workers in the end the meeting tonight at 7:30.

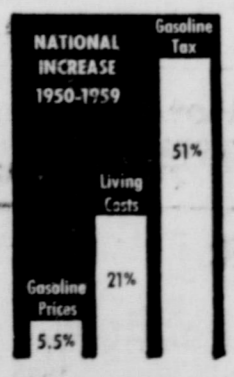
**First Meeting Of Ministerial Association Held**
