GORDON SPOT

The dreaded screwworm flies made their presence felt in Eastland County recently. Two cases were confirmed by the screwworm lab in Mission. One sample was sent in from a farm 5 1/2 miles south of Carbon on November 5, and a second sample was sent from south of Cisco on November 8.

These were the first screwworms identified by the lab from Eastland County since 1972. This has become the worst year for screwworm outbreaks throughout the South west since the epidemic of 1972.

The cold weather last week may have been a big help since screwworm fly dies in freezing weather. Time is on our side now.

It has been the policy of the Screwworm Program to treat each confirmed case of screwworms with a sterile fly release. However, due to the fact that the incidence of screwworms has reached epidemic proportions in much of the overwintering area of Texas, the officials of the program have decided to concentrate all of the sterile fly releases in this overwintering area. No releases will be made on confirmed screwworm cases that occur in Eastland County the remainder of this year. The officials said it is doubtful that any appreciable benefit from sterile fly releases in more northern areas of the state would be derived prior to the arrival of cold weather.

The screwworm program is experiencing the second worst year in Texas since the southwest eradication program began in 1962. By concentrating their fly release activity in South Texas they are hoping to eliminate or at least significantly alter the population in this area before next spring in order to improve the chances of controlling screwworm next year.

We have seen a lot of green tomatoes on the vines. If your tomatoes got by the light frost last week you might make plans to save those green tomatoes.

Before the first severe killing freeze is predicted, harvest your green tomatoes for later ripening. How can you tell if a tomato when picked green will eventually turn red? Take a sharp knife and slice a green tomato in half. If the seeds are mature (hard) enough so that the knife will not actually cut through them, then the tomato will eventually turn red. If the knife cuts through the seed, the tomato will never properly ripen. After cutting through a few fruit, you can tell by the green color of the fruit whether or not the seed inside the fruit are mature. Those tomatoes that will eventually ripen should be harvested and stored at room temperature. As the tomatoes turn full red, place them in the refrigerator for longer storage.

HOW TO COOK:

Turkeys of any size may be roasted. Correct roasting is dry heat cooking at low temperature. It requires no water, no searing, no basting, and no cover. A shallow pan with a rack at least 1/2 inch high raises the bird off the bottom of the pan, keeping it out of the juices and allowing the heat to circulate around the bird, roasting it evenly.

Always roast turkey done in one continuous cooking period. Low temperatures assure better flavor and appearance, less shrinkage and less loss of juices.

Here are the simple steps:

1. Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. (slow).

2. Rinse, drain and dry the bird. Rub cavity lightly with salt, if desired. Do not salt if bird is to be stuffed.

3. If to be stuffed, fill wishbone area (neck) loosely and fasten neck skin to back with skewer. Sometimes the snapped back wing tips hold the neck skin down. Fill body cavity lightly, because dressing tends to expand. Tie drumsticks to the tail.

4. Place turkey breast side up on rack in shallow roasting pan. Brush skin with butter or fat. If a roast meat thermometer is to be used, insert it so that the bulb is in the center of the inside thigh muscle or the thickest part of the breast meat. Be sure that the bulb does not touch bone.

5. Place in preheated oven. If desired, baste or brush occasionally with pan drippings or

butter--especially any dry areas. When turkey is two-thirds done, cut cord or band of skin at tail to release the legs and permit the heat to reach the heavy-meated part. Cover with a loose tent of aluminum foil or lay a moistened cloth over the legs and breast to prevent excessive browning.

6. Roast until done. It is best to start the turkey roasting 30 to 45 minutes ahead of schedule. If dinner is set for a definite hour, this avoids delay should the turkey take longer to cook than was estimated from the guide. And the extra time allows the meat to stand and absorb juices so the bird is easier to carve.

There is no substitute for a meat thermometer, place in center of inside thigh muscle (so the thickest part of the breast). When it registers 180-185 degrees F., the turkey is done. If the bird is stuffed, the point of the thermometer should be in the center of the stuffing and register 165 degrees F.

The traditional "Doneness Test" used by many experienced cooks is a "Feel" test. Turkey is done when the thickest part of the drumstick feels very soft when pressed between protected fingers, and the drumstick moves easily up and down as the leg joint gives readily, or breaks.

APPROXIMATE TIMETABLE

A ready to cook turkey weighing 6 to 8 pounds should be cooked 3 to 3 1/2 hours.

8 to 12 lbs--3 1/2 to 4 1/2 hours.

12 to 16 lbs--4 1/2 to 5 1/2 hours.

16-20 lbs 5 1/2 to 6 1/2 hours.

20 to 24 lbs--6 1/2 to 7 hours.

More and more homemakers save labor and cooking time as they take a wise cue from professional chefs who do not stuff the turkeys, particularly the big birds. Instead the dressing is baked in a loaf pan or casserole the last hour of the turkey roasting period and may be basted with the turkey pan drippings.

OLD FASHION BREAD STUFFING

1 qt. diced celery

1 c. finely chopped onion

1 c. butter

4 qts. bread cubes, firmly packed. (2 to 4 day old bread)

2 Tbsp. salt.

2 tsp. poultry seasoning

1/2 tsp. pepper

1 1/2 to 2 cups broth, milk or water.

Cook celery and onion in butter over low heat, stirring occasionally, until onion is tender but not browned. Meanwhile, blend bread cubes and seasonings. Add celery, onion and butter; toss lightly to blend. Pour broth, milk or water gradually over surface of bread mixture, tossing lightly. Add more seasoning as desired. Makes enough stuffing for neck and body cavities of a 14 to 18 pound ready-to-cook turkey.

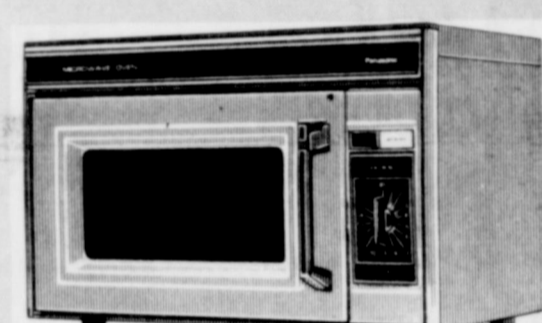


