

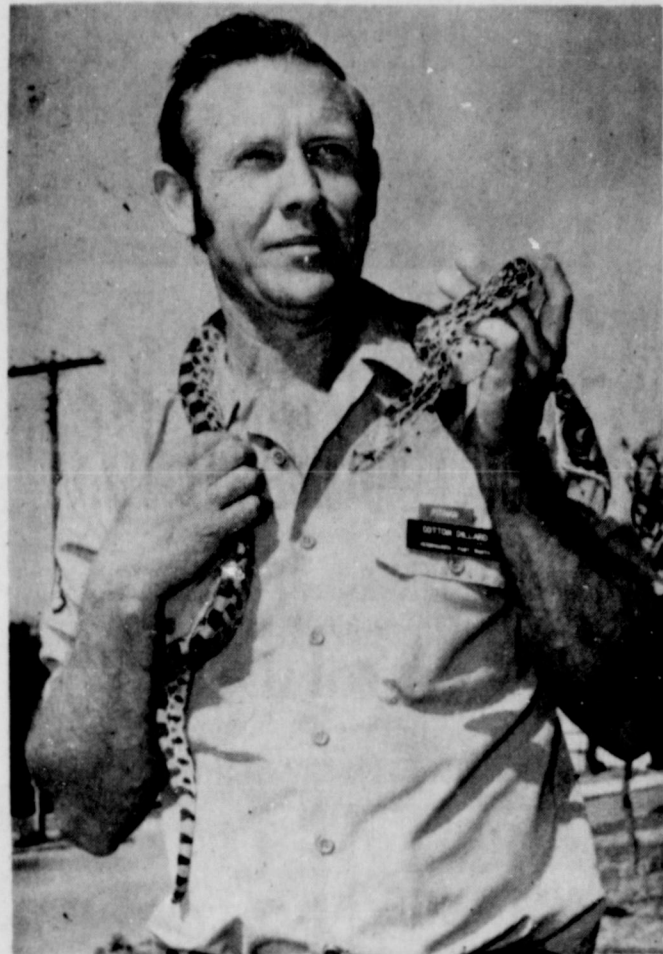

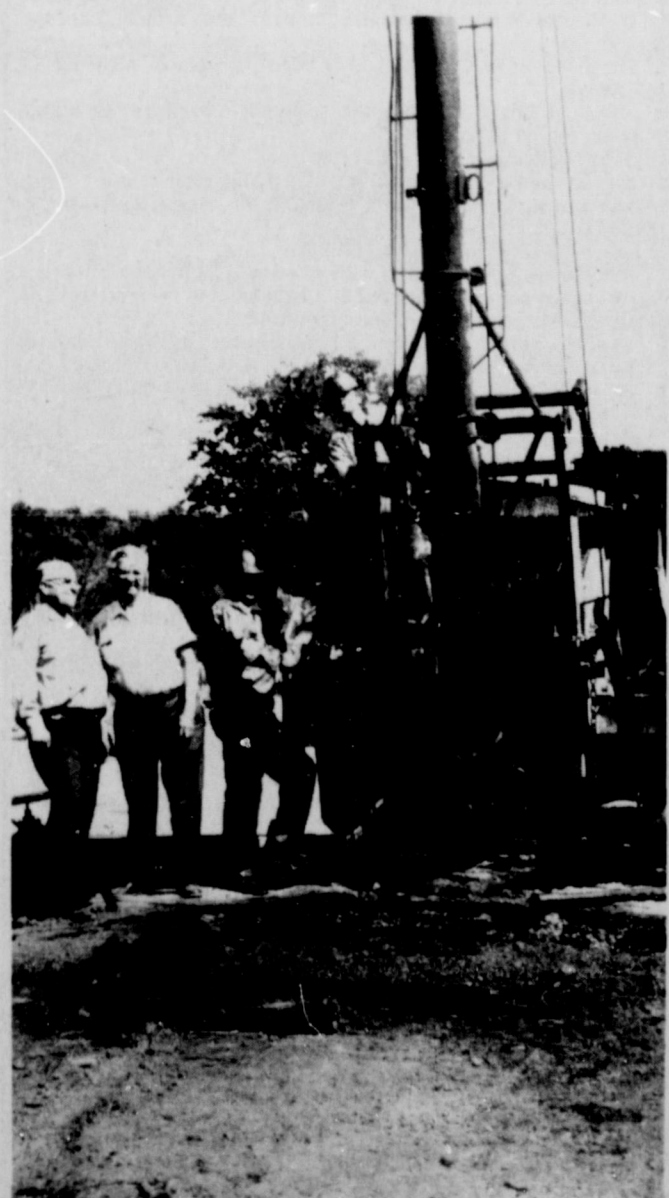
IF YOU'VE wondered about the pecan and walnut trees on the courthouse lawn, you might want to make a note of this: they're 14 years old. According to a plat recorded at the Courthouse and researched by County Clerk Johnson Smith for the Eastland Centennial Memorial Archives, the trees were planted Jan. 26 and 27 by the late County Agent J.M. Cooper, Bailey Bryant and Cullen Rogers. A plat drawn by Mr. Cooper then indicates that the trees are still in place and doing well. Several varieties are represented. The three trees on the northwest corner and the one south of the sidewalk on the west side are Bartons. The three on the south are Western Schleys. In the northeast corner the two on West Main are Burketts and there's another Western Schley north of the sidewalk on the east side. The two trees on the east side, south of the sidewalk are the Carpathian Walnut trees which Mr. Cooper held so highly.

New Lease On Life For Gas

With untapped gas reserves lying dormant in Eastland County since the great and historic oil boom of 1917-22, the County is presently enjoying a new "lease" on life...as far as "wildcatting" is concerned. One of those rags-to-riches wildcatting now operating in Eastland County is H. Bryan Poff, of Fort Worth, more widely known as the "Kentucky Wildcat". During his many years of searching for oil in the shallow fields of Kentucky, Poff's motto was "Always go down one more foot".

That "extra foot" has paid off for Poff in his No. 1 J.J. Finley, four miles southeast of Eastland. Poff brought the gasser in Friday afternoon as a new Strawn Sand discovery producing from a relatively shallow depth of 1210-1245 feet at the rate of "better than a million cubic feet per day", according to Poff. The well, located on a 173 acre lease belonging to Eastland businessman Jonah Finley was spewing gas, mud, and condensation with a deafening roar Friday and Saturday as it cleared itself out. Also involved in the drilling of the well was W. Rov

Services will be held at 3 p.m. Friday in the Arrington Funeral Home Chapel with Rev. E.D. Norman, pastor of the United Pentecostal Church, officiating. Interment will be in Eastland Cemetery. Grandsons will serve as pallbearers.

Marker To Be Erected

The following is the text for the 27" x 42" official Texas Historical Marker, to be erected on FM 8, three miles NE of Gorman:

ELLISON SPRINGS

Used for Centuries by Indians inhabiting the region. Named for James Madison Ellison (1840-1923), a native of Alabama, who was the first settler in this section of Eastland County, erecting a cabin near the springs in Oct. 1858. He soon married Eliza McGough, a member of another pioneer family and had three children. During the Civil War, frontiersmen organized militia companies for mutual protection against the Indians. Ellison joined the company mustered from Eastland, Shackelford, and Callahan Counties. On

Sharrock, oil operator, and producer of Abilene and Albany.

Poff is typical of the many oil operators who have made it and lost it in a short period of time. He sold out and retired from the oil business in 1966, but the recent energy crisis has led him like the ring of the fire bell to the old fire horse.... it meant "It's time to hitch up and go!"

And go he did...to Eastland County with its long history of voluminous gas reserves. There was a time...during World War I, when the gas and oil fields of the County provided American forces with 75% of their gasoline and oil supplies. During and immediately after WWI, the County boasted more than 20 gasoline refineries.

At one time during the boom, there were more than 450 wells drilled at one time in an area between Morton Valley (4 miles north of Eastland) and Ranger, and northward into Stephens County. Those were the days of the big gushers...wells roaring in at the rate of 15,000 bbls per day, and throwing tools through the crown block on the derrick. There was no oil proration, and wells ran wide open 24 hours per day, producing all their owners could sell.

In those days, the smaller wells...those which produced a meager 100 or 200 bbls per day...were plugged. Also, many gas wells were capped, because it was oil that was "king". There wasn't too much demand for gas. Most land owners piped the gas into their houses and used it for lighting, and continued to burn wood in their stoves and fireplaces. Some of the gas was piped to one of the many "Casinghead" gasoline plants that dotted the area, and some folks used the "drip" gas from the well-head in their cars.

After the initial boom, the oil play in the area continued to go on a downhill slope as newer fields were opened up in East Texas in the early thirties in the Kilgore and Longview area. It

Mr. Moore will be speaking at the 10:20 a.m. service at the church June 2. The congregation invites all to join in this service and again at 2:30 p.m. for an old fashioned gospel singing.

Primary Run-Off Election Saturday

Polls Open 8 To 7

Saturday is Election Day again!

It's Primary Run-Off Day and there's one county-wide contest that should attract voters in all precincts. The only other race is for the position of County Commissioner in the newly-created Ranger Precinct, and only voters in the four Ranger voting boxes will cast ballots in this race.

Only 44 people had voted absentee by Tuesday, 5 p.m. deadline.

Seeking nomination for County School Superintendent are Stubby Warden of Ranger and Jimmy Hughes of Carbon. These two were high candidates in a field of four, for the office being vacated with the upcoming retirement of County School Supt. O.L. Stamey.

In the Ranger Commissioner's race, Lee Cantrell and Jack Blackwell are in a runoff, having been two high candidates of five seeking the office in the first primary.

In the May Primary Hughes got 1,525 votes and Warden 1,275, in the superintendent's race.

Mr. Blackwell drew 396 votes and Cantrell got 326 in the Ranger Commissioner May Primary.

Voters in Ranger, Olden, Lake Leon and Desdemona will find the Ranger Commissioner race on their ballots. All other voters in the county will have only the Warden-Hughes race on their ballot.

A less than fantastic turnout is expected but voters were being reminded of the importance of these two contests and the necessity of going to the polls Saturday and casting ballots.

Both contests have attracted a great deal of runoff interests as candidates go down to the wire in seeking Democratic nomination.

Over 10,110 voters are qualified to vote in Eastland County.

Only 4,478 turned out in May. The Democrats will vote in one of nine voting boxes depending on their place of residence. A new voting box was added this year at Lake Leon and voting there will be in the home of Mrs. Morris Newham.

Other Democratic polls will be at Eastland, Olden, Ranger, Carbon, Gorman, Desdemona, Rising Star and Cisco.
