Telephone Directories Are Being Delivered

The 1974 Telephone Directory being delivered this week will take on new dimensions according to Southwestern Bell Manager Burnice Gorr.

For the first time in history, Cisco, Eastland and Ranger numbers will be compiled in one telephone directory.

Mrs. Gorr pointed out that the extended service between Eastland and Cisco, and Eastland and Ranger makes the Tri-city directory necessary.

As in the past, listings for Carbon and Olden will be included in the new directory.

The colorful cover of the new book features a painting, "Our Texas", by Ed Herbes. The Flemish-style painting of Texas memorabilia is a culmination of five years' research and travel by the artist in his efforts to depict our Texas heritage.

The Flemish style of painting is similar to that of Rembrandt and others of his period. The technique today involves creating detailed sketches on masonite and "underpainting" in varying shades of amber, an earth-brown color. This gives the painting its distinctive deep shadows.

Oil colors are added in glazes after the underpainting dries completely. Glazing is a transparent method of applying oils with the color intensity varying with the number of glazes applied. Each layer must dry before another can be added.

The up-to-date directory features instructions for using "O Plus" and "I Plus" dialing. "O Plus" dialing allows

residents to dial virtually all their own long distance calls, including person-to-person, collect, those billed to a third number and other calls requiring operator assistance.

"I Plus" dialing allows customers to dial direct on station-to-station calls, by dialing "1" plus the area code (if different from 817) plus the distant telephone number.

"O Plus" dialing works almost the same way. Telephone users dial "O" plus the area code (if different from 817) plus the distant telephone number. The operator will then come on the line and obtain the information necessary to complete the call.

Mrs. Gorr pointed out that the new numbers for Directory Assistance 1411 and repair service, 4102, are also listed in the directory's call guide pages.

The telephone company manager encouraged telephone users to read the information in the call guide to gain the maximum benefit of the directory. In addition to emergency listings for fire, police, sheriff, and ambulance services, the call guide contains lists of state and national Long Distance Area Codes.

Southwestern Bell Adds One Story Addition

An addition is planned to Southwestern Bell Telephone Company's building in Eastland.

The one-story addition will be 82 by 25 feet and will add more than 2,000 square feet of space to the present structure, according to Southwestern Bell Manager Burnice Gorr.

The addition will provide space for new switching equipment to serve Eastland's growing local and long distance telephone needs, Mrs. Gorr said.

"The present building is filled to capacity," noted Eastland's wire chief Bob Potter, who is in charge of telephone plant operations for this area.

The new building addition is one of several recent projects designed to improve and keep pace with Eastland's communications needs, the manager added.

Eastland received "O Plus"

long distance dialing in May. This service enables local telephone users to dial virtually all their own long distance calls, including person-to-person, collect, credit card, bill to third number and others requiring operator assistance. The area had been served by "I Plus" dialing for sometime. This system enables telephone users to dial their own station-to-station long distance calls.

Another major service improvement will be the elimination of long distance charges on all calls between Eastland and Cisco and Eastland and Ranger on July 9. This expanded service means that all calls between Eastland and the other two cities will be handled as local calls. Eastland customers will simply dial the seven-digit number to reach a telephone in any of the three towns. No prefix, such as "O" or "I", will be necessary when dialing a number in Ranger or Cisco.

T.S.A. Urges Traffic Safety

AUSTIN--According to the Texas Safety Association, nationwide traffic fatality projections for the July Fourth Holiday are the lowest in almost 25 years.

TSA President Edwin B. Locke today noted that Texas motorists can help keep the toll at a minimum by buckling their safety belts, observing speed limits and paying attention to some of the hazards which accompany the energy shortage.

"While the decline of highway death and injury which has accompanied the lowering of speed limits has received wide publicity", Locke said, "some of the hazards created by the energy shortage have not attracted much attention."

He specified the increase of small cars on the highways. According to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, the occupants of smaller cars involved crashes tend to sustain more severe injuries than the occupants of larger cars.

"Small car drivers should be aware of the extra hazards they face", Locke said. "While we urge all drivers to buckle up and drive defensively, drivers of sub-compact should be doubly cautious."

Locke also noted the sharp increase in the presence of gas-saving motorcycles on the road today and the corresponding increase in cycle-car accidents. He urged drivers to be on the lookout for two-wheeled vehicles, and to accord them the normal driving courtesies.

Some drivers, Locke said, continue to put themselves and others in extreme danger by taking along an extra can of gasoline in the car. "Trying to beat the fuel shortage by transporting gasoline anywhere besides the fuel tank is playing with dynamite", he said.

Even in "safety cans" gasoline vapors can leak, ready to explode with the introduction of the spark.

The National Safety Council has predicted that 450 to 550 persons will die in traffic accidents over the holiday period beginning at 6 p.m. Wednesday, July 3 and ending at midnight Sunday, July 7. The last comparable July Fourth Holiday in Texas was in 1972 when 80 people died in traffic accidents.

Those big "jumbo" grasshoppers have literally given us a whipping on our 1/2 acre "Farm". After about \$15 worth of bug poison and a lot of work--watering, tending and etc. about the only thing we are sure to save is our mail box. But I don't intend to paint the mail box a vegetable green color yet.

WHEN HECK WAS A PUP
Pardon me for writing so much about myself. But after all, I know more about myself than I do other people.
Between 55 and 60 years ago, my Papa taught me the art of catching perch and crappie with those big "jumbo" grasshoppers. To obtain the grasshoppers and get them to the fishing hole--talk the local grocery man out of two or three #16 brown paper bags. Blow a bag up as if to burst it, but don't. Shape the top of the bag like unto a mouth piece on a bass horn. Punch a row of air holes around the bottom of said bag. Wrap a rubber band around the neck. Catch grasshoppers on the way to the fishing hole. Slip them into the bag without killing them. Use a 10 or 12 foot cane or willow pole, attach a 10 or 12 foot light line to the pole, tie a small perch or crappie hook on the end of the line. Carefully slip your hand into the sack, get one Mr. Hopper. Pull him out of the sack, pass the hook through the saddle on Mr. Hopper's back. Press one of his jumping legs at the knee joint. Mr. Hopper will give you this jumping leg. Toss Mr. Hopper into the water at a likely spot. He will swim around in a circle. Sit down in the shade, wait for the perch or crappie to come up and get Mr. Hopper. If the fish is not too big you might just tree top him. If he is a large one, you must learn how to get him to the bank. Ways of catching your grasshoppers easily is another story.



The Lieutenant Governor's Report By Bill Hobby

Although Texas continues to rank at the top of all states in the location of new industries, we continue to fall behind in average per capita income compared to the nation.

In 1972, Texans had a per capita income which was more than \$500 below the national average.

Increasing the income of our people must be one of the most important goals of this state. To achieve this we must create more and better paying jobs, either through the attraction of

still more new industry or the expansion of existing industry.

During 1974-75, the State of Texas will spend only 6.5 cents per capita on its industrial development programs. The national average is 25 cents.

A study commissioned by the Texas Industrial Commission has shown that other states have a competitive advantage because of their ability to provide start-up training programs for new or expanding industry.

Industry is understandably reluctant to assume the full burden for completely retraining a basically agricultural labor force, such as ours, in the skills required for mass production. Other states are assisting their industries to overcome this problem.

Texas has outstanding occupational-technical training capability in our 44 junior colleges, the four campuses of the Texas State Technical Institute and many of the independent school districts.

The Texas Industrial Commission, in December of 1971, established cooperative agreements through the Texas Education Agency to coordinate the start-up industrial training capabilities of these institutions.

With limited funds and staff, this program has created 4,900 new job opportunities. An economic impact analysis of only eight new industries and three expanded industries shows a total of 3,987 new jobs created and a return on the investment of \$612,976 in local and \$373,741 in state taxes.

Texas must develop a start-up training program that is truly competitive

with other states. We should be able to say to industry, "Come to Texas. While you are building or equipping your plant, we will train the workers so that, when you open your doors, you can start in the black". At the same time, we would be providing steady, good paying jobs for our people.

A proposed training program for Texas has been developed. Under this program, each individual start-up training program would terminate when the plant's staffing needs are met. Because of such short-term, highly specialized training, the cost, per trainee, would be much less than the usual cost of vocational training.

The state's investment would bring a healthy rate of return. Fifteen thousand trainees would produce 15,000 new jobs and a total of \$2,070,000 in new state taxes each year. At this rate, each trainee would pay back his investment in training in 15 months and then

produce an 80 per cent return on the investment each year, just in new state taxes.

It is proposed that the industrial training program be jointly undertaken by the Texas

Education Agency, Texas Industrial Commission, the state's junior colleges, technical institutes and independent school districts.

According to local National Weather Service Records, June was another hot and dry month for Eastland with the temperature reaching 103 degrees on June 15 and only 2.07 inches of rain falling during the month.

Local records reveal that June of 1973 had a high reading of 99 degrees for the month, recorded on June 28.

In the rainfall department, the month was about equal both years, with June of 1973 producing 2.31 inches of rain. That is where the similarity ends however, because through June 30 of last year, local gauges recorded 16.72 inches above normal for that time of year.

Total rainfall for the year through June 30, 1974, is only 8.99 inches, which is 7.55 inches below normal for the first six months of the year.

Some relief from the heat occurred on two successive nights during the past month with the thermometer falling to all-time record lows of 52 and 55 degrees on June 25 and 26.

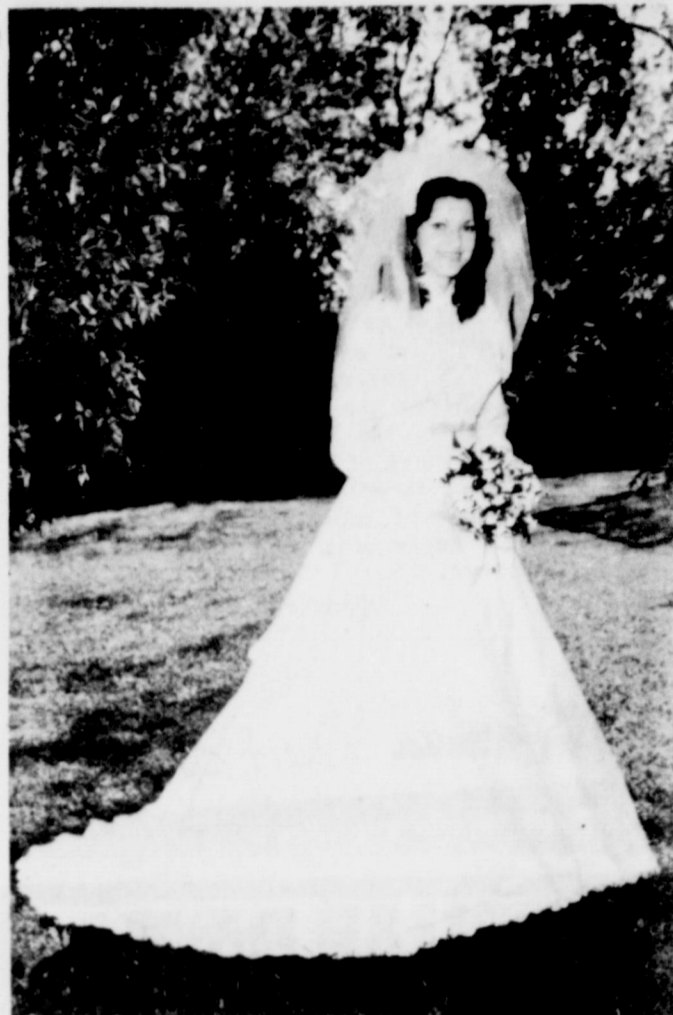

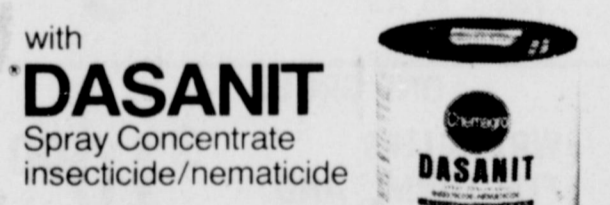


