# STATE CAPITAL Highlights AND Sidelights

AUSTIN, Tex. — Constitutional Convention delegates are entering the make-or-break last laps of their work.  
 Delegates last week completed first-draft approval of the proposed new state charter after final agreement on the delayed judicial article.  
 President Price Daniel Jr. said he hopes all articles will be pushed through the third-reading stage by the end of June.  
 After that, the document will go to the convention's "Submission and Transition Committee," which will wrap up all proposals in package form and return them to delegates.  
 At this stage, the document and related separate-submission items (like right-to-work) must be approved by a two-thirds majority (121 votes) to be submitted to voters.  
 The Submission and Transition Committee will serve as a kind of conference committee, seeking compromises which can rally approval of the necessary majority of delegates.  
 After months of stormy debate and close votes, the convention began to receive praise from many quarters for its efforts to improve the 1876 constitution.  
 Kind words were still being withheld by the governor, however. Aides to Gov. Dolph Briscoe said he would "find it very difficult"

to support the revision in its present form, because recommended changes infringe on gubernatorial powers in areas of veto and calling special legislative sessions.  
 TRADING STAMP LIMIT? — The State Finance Commission may ban use of trading stamps and other inducements by savings and loan associations to help attract deposits.  
 The panel's savings and loan section is scheduled to rule on the long-standing issue June 22.  
 Opponents argue the regulation would curtail advertising by savings and loan associations, would not benefit consumers and would be meaningless to federally-chartered institutions.  
 An earlier version of the proposed regulation included an exemption for associations competing with other financial institutions which offer stamps and other premiums.  
 Savings and loan associations are divided on the issue. Several consumer groups have indicated they will offer testimony in opposition to the proposal.  
 WASTE HEARINGS SET — Texas Water Quality Board has scheduled 12 public hearings over the state to explore problems concerning disposal of industrial solid wastes, a controversial issue.

The first hearing will be held July 11 in Fort Worth with the final one in Austin October 24.  
 Other hearings are slated for Dallas July 12, Port Arthur July 25, Beaumont July 26, Houston August 6-7, Corpus Christi August 22-23, Brownsville August 30, El Paso September 20, Midland September 26, Amarillo September 27 and Longview October 2.  
 Legislative committee probes of TWQB, with special attention to its procedures in processing

applications for waste disposal sites are scheduled to begin after the Constitutional Convention adjourns.  
 COURTS SPEAK — A man who entered a Fort Worth hospital with a cut thumb, fainted, felloff the operating table and suffered a brain concussion and loss of two teeth is entitled to \$7,211 damages, the State Supreme Court ruled.  
 The high court held a Houston ironworker should get workmen's compensation benefits due to inhalation of lead and zinc fumes.

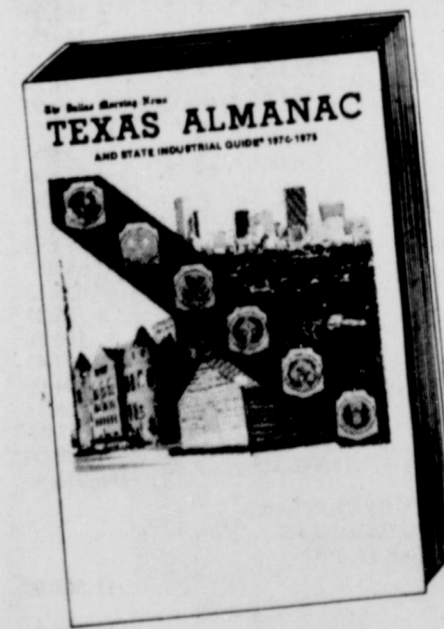

## Vacation Game Is Multiple Choice

Multiple choice is the name of the vacation game in West Texas when it comes to riding the Texas Travel Trails. Four trails fall entirely within the western half of the state, while another three overlap its eastern rim.

Entirely West Texas in flavor are the Mountain Trail, Pecos Trail, Plains Trail and Forts Trail.

Sharing part of West Texas' geography are the lakes, Brazos and Hill Country Trails.

The listed attractions for all seven trails total 354. The four primary West Texas trails count up 202 among themselves, in a region larger than most of the 49 other states.

Other states, in fact have begun to emulate Texas' geographic approach to Montana and Missouri, for example, while Montana, Wyoming, the Dakotas and Nebraska have formed a region known as the Old West Trail.

Information on the seven West Texas trails is available from the West Texas Chamber of Commerce in its new Wonderful West Texas Fun and Adventure Map.

Abilene is the home of the Texas Forts Trail Association

and the West Texas Chamber. This spring the Forts Trail Association recognizing new travel needs because of fuel, painlessly "drew and quartered" the trail into four quadrants.

The rangeland trail was presented as four "mini-trails". Each contained two of the old frontier forts: Richardson and Belknap in the northeast, Phantom Hill and Griffin in the northwest, Chadbourne and Concho in the southwest, and McKavett and Mason in the southeast.

The idea was a closer-to-home approach for the 691-mile Forts Trail.

The starting point for each trail and the number of its attractions are: Mountain, Al Paso, 59; Pecos, Odessa, 42; Plains, Amarillo, 42; Forts, Abilene, 49; Lakes, Dallas, 62; Brazos, Waco, 43; and Hill Country, San Antonio, 48.

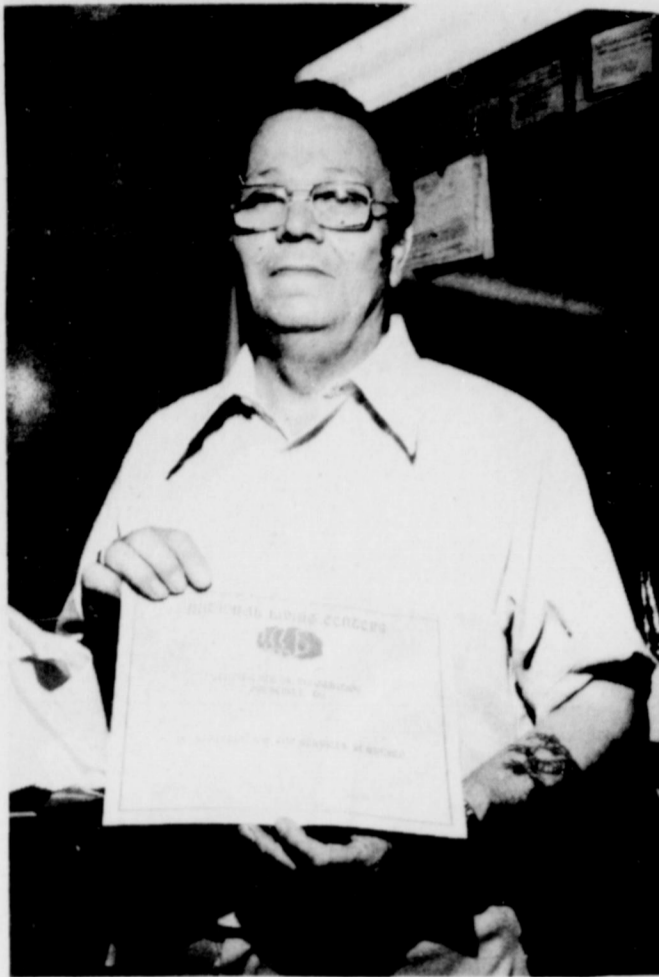

## Landowners Win Victory

American landowners have won a major victory in Congress with regard to the Land Use Planning Act of 1973, according to Jack Cozart, president of the Eastland County Farm Bureau.

On June 11, Mr. Cozart said, the proposed legislation, H.R. 10294, was prevented from coming up for House consideration by a vote of 211 to 204. Cozart said, American Farm Bureau Federation legislative representatives in Washington, D.C., said this defeat of the rule to bring up the bill had the effect of killing it for this session.

"However," Mr. Cozart said, "They warned to expect it to come up in the next session. They also reminded that many are expecting a more liberal-oriented Congress next session."

Mr. Cozart commended Congressman Omar Burlison of Anson, for his vote that helped defeat the rule to bring H.R. 10294 up for consideration by the House.

Mr. Cozart said that H.R. 10294 was similar to S. 268 which was passed by the u.s. Senate in June of last year. Both bills provide for federal grants to states which designate an agency of the state to conduct a comprehensive study on the "highest and best use" of each acre of land, and then authorize some agency of government to implement the recommendations of the study, he said.

Both bills also spell out guidelines that states must follow in their land use studies and subsequent implementation in order to be eligible for federal grants, the county farm leader said.
