## Delegation Receives Award In Austin

At a luncheon culminating the Beautifying Texas Council's Annual Meeting in Austin, Wednesday, June 19, Gov. Dolph Briscoe recognized the 1973 winners of the Governor's Annual Community Achievement Awards.

Gov. Briscoe presented the large, handsome cast aluminum plaques signifying the Governor's Community Achievement Award to the Texas cities of Stanton, in Category 1 for cities with a population of 2,500 or less; to Eastland, in category 2 for cities between 2,501 and 5,000 population; Jacksonville and Athens in a tie for Category 3 for cities between 5,110 and 10,000; New Braunfels in Category 4 for cities between 10,001 and 20,000; Lufkin in Category 5 for cities between 20,001 and 60,000; and San Antonio in Category 6 for cities over 60,000.

### EFFORTS JOINED IN EASTLAND:

1973 in Eastland was a year when many joined efforts to improve a town. Setting off all the remodeling of buildings in the downtown area as well as the construction of new buildings was the massive planting or greenery through the cooperation of merchants, city officials, Boy Scouts, School children, and civic organizations.

The Civic League and Garden Club's tree planting beautification program culminated with over 800 trees and shrubs planted. Part of a continuing awareness of self-improvement in Eastland, the program involved organizations, business firms and many individuals.

It was a logical follow-up of a massive "Clean Up Eastland" campaign in the spring that not only helped improve the city, but through a community auction benefited the remodeling of an old building into a modern library. Citizen interest has encouraged the city council to begin greater efforts to tear down deteriorated buildings and houses.

Three new industries have selected Eastland as a plant site. Six other already existing industries have continued to prosper.

Tourism has increased with the recognition given Eastland through its stamp mural window at the post office as well as the flag garden and ceremony. "Old Rip" the Horned Toad, was placed on display in a new glass case at the Courthouse with both inside and outside views available to tourists.

In 1973 many joined efforts to see that Eastland will have a great future. With the refurbishing facades, new buildings where dilapidated ones stood only a year before, and mini-parks beneath an attractive overpass which speeds the traffic flow. Flowers bloom where weeds once grew. Neatly painted litter containers hold trash that once blew into gutters. A seven-acre park has been begun, and on school campuses, church yards and private property crape myrtle, pine and other trees have been planted.

Along with the physical evidences of Jacksonville's intensive clean-up and beautification program came the people's enthusiasm and civic pride which permeated into all facets of the Jacksonville way of life.

### PUBLIC INTEREST IN ATHENS:

With two annual clean-up drives, the Athens Improvement and Beautification Association succeeded in improving and promoting interest in beautifying the city.

## City Gets Bonus \$70,000 From EPA

An additional grant of \$70,950 has been approved by the Environmental Protection Agency for the City of Eastland to build the new sewer plant. Cong. Omar Burleson has advised this newspaper.

Total cost for the plant is pegged at \$351,481.60 and the city has voted and sold bonds in the amount of \$92,000.

The federal grant money will total \$259,420 and work began this week on the project.

Check, who is secretary of the Cross Timber Shrine Club, helped President T.L. Jay Jr., serve a fish dinner to members of the Shrine Club

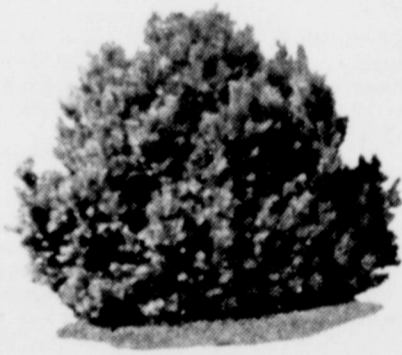
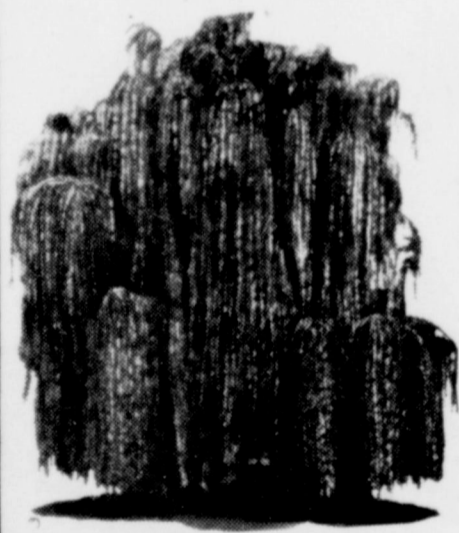

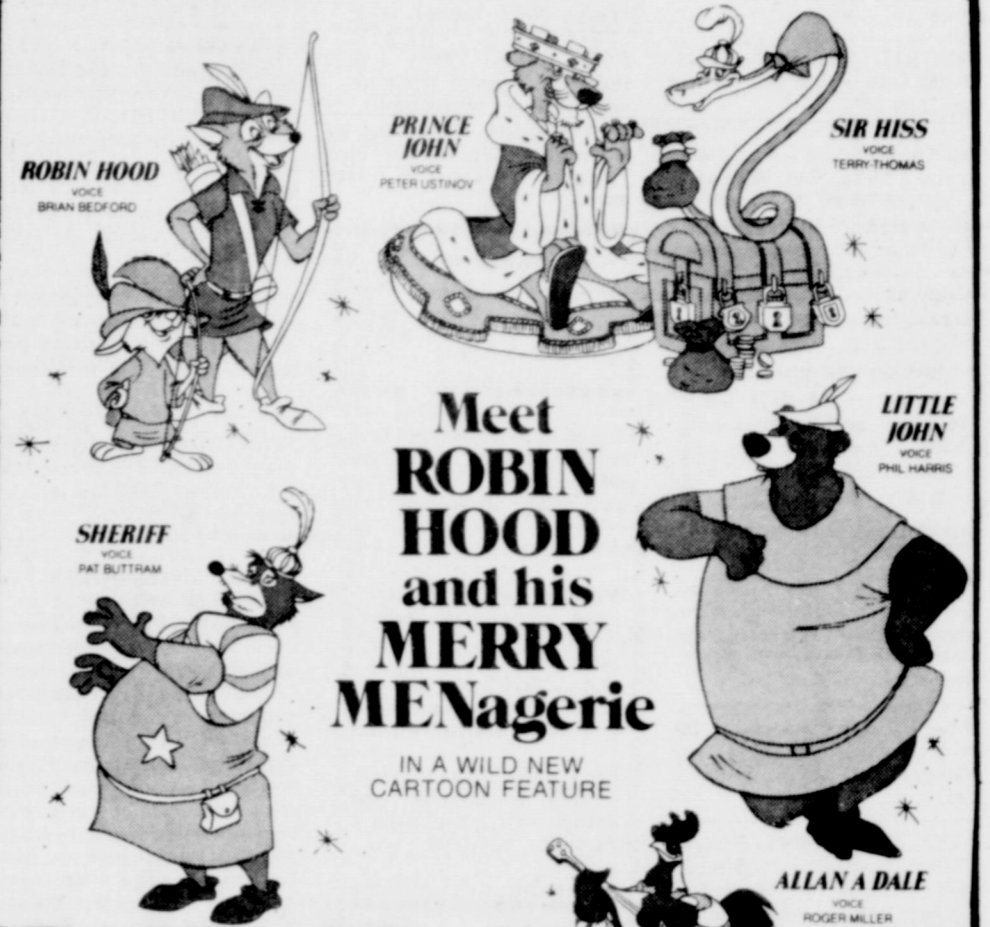

# Council Executes Work Order

Important among business conducted by the Eastland City Commission in a brief meeting this week is the execution of a work order for West-Tex Construction Co., Inc., to begin work on the city's new wastewater disposal plant.

Mayor Pro-Tem Charles Marshall presided with Commissioners H.V. O'Brien and Dale Bakker present Monday evening. Assisting City Manager Lewis Tiner and the commission in drafting the work order was Billy Jacobs of the city's engineering firm of yeatts & Decker.


