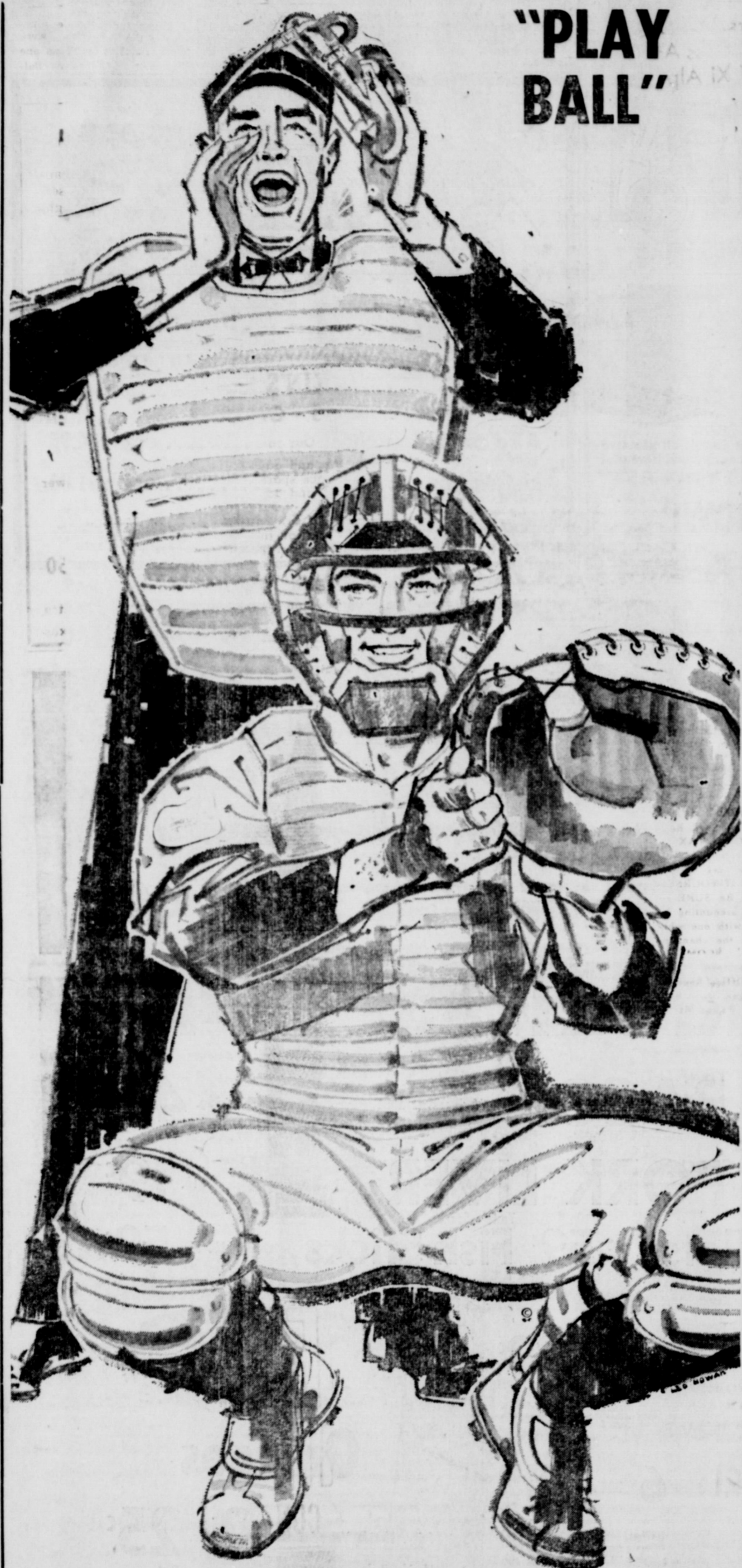

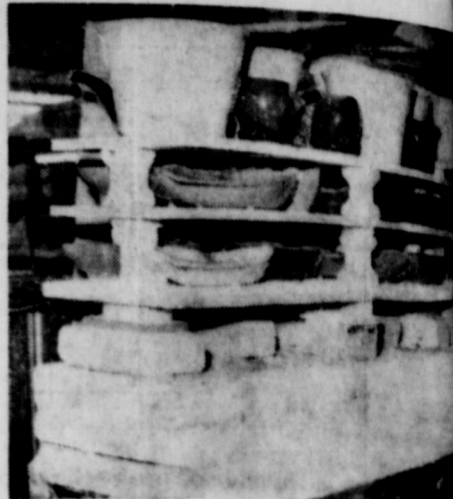
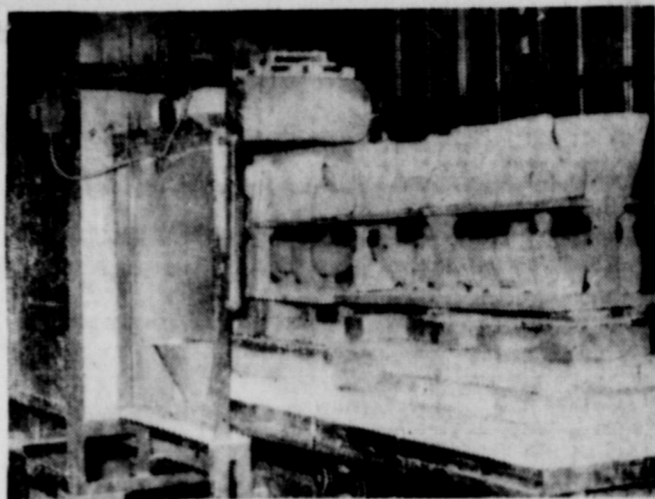

There are 21 people working here now and the monthly payroll is in excess of \$5,000. Others are being hired.

About 65 per cent of the \$1,000 a day shipments go to florists Smith says, and its a 24-hour operation.

Variety? Romco-Eastland is turning out 115 different pieces in over 300 color combinations.

Brand new lines are being developed here, and the most recent were shown at the Dallas Gift and Jewelry Show, last week, and Mr. Huston will display them at the Denver Gift Show next week.

Ordinarily it's about a 72-hour process from "pour" to finished product. Smith and Steward Kelly, plant manager of the Loveland operation who has been in Eastland assisting with the build-up here, both design and initiate the pieces.

Models of the pieces are built, and forms of plaster of paris made. From these two-piece molds are constructed, into which "slip" is poured and allowed to set. Ed Allgood is mold maker and Jimmy Little fills them.

After taking them from the molds, women trim and spooning the pieces. Some are glazed before being fired and others go directly to the kiln for firing.

It takes 18 hours for a "car-load" of pieces to go through one of the two kilns where they are exposed to temperature in excess of 2,100 degrees.

Herman Walker is kiln superintendent. In charge of decorations for the collector-item pieces are Mrs. Lavern Allgood and Mrs. Bessie Everton.

Mrs. Barbara Pogue is office manager. The organizations has retail stores in Eastland, and at Colorado Springs, Estes Park and Loveland, Colo., as well as the plants.

Four salesmen work out of Eastland. One in West Texas and New Mexico, one in Southeast Texas and Louisiana, one in northeast Texas and Louisiana and Mississippi, and one in the Dakotas and the Minneapolis area.

Romco offers ten-day delivery on any item, and Bill Moyland is shipping clerk for the Eastland operation.
