## Rev. A. B. Lightfoot To Conduct Revival

The Rev. A. B. Lightfoot who spoke in Eastland last fall, will be the speaker at a revival at First Baptist Church here which begins Sunday.

Born in Coleman County, the pastor graduated from Hardin Simmons University and attended Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary.

He pastored in Colorado City, Fort Worth and Big Lake. He was superintendent of Missions for the Permian Basin Baptist Assoc. for three years before accepting the Odessa parsonate.

His church sent him on a 20,000 mile tour of the Holy Land last year, where he visited ten different countries, and retraced the path of Paul and the four apostles of Jesus, photographing all these areas.

He is an avid photographer and amateur musician as well as being a much sought after dinner speaker.

The public has been invited by First Baptist Pastor Rev. Haston Brewer to attend the revival services.

Sunday services will be at 11 a.m. and 7:30 p.m. and weekly services at 10 a.m. and 7:30 p.m.

Sam Beam III, church music director, will be in charge of the music for the revival.

## Francis J. Brock Assigned Panama Banyan Tree III

Captain Francis J. Brock, son of Mrs. Wills L. Brock, 300 N. Ammerman, Eastland, is assigned to a United States Air Force unit participating in Exercise Banyan Tree III which will continue in Panama through early March. The joint training maneuver for air and ground forces is designed to develop the combat readiness of units participating.

Forces for the exercise are from the U. S. Caribbean Command, the new unified U. S. Strike Command and from combat and support units of U. S. based major air commands.

Captain Brock is an aircraft commander permanently assigned to a unit of the Tactical Air Command at Pope AFB, N. C. He will return there upon completion of the exercise.

The captain, a graduate of Eastland High School, received his B. S. degree from Texas A & M, and his M.S. degree from Texas Technological College. He entered the service in April 1951.

He and his wife, the former Betty D. Murphy of Eastland, have two children, Kyle and David.

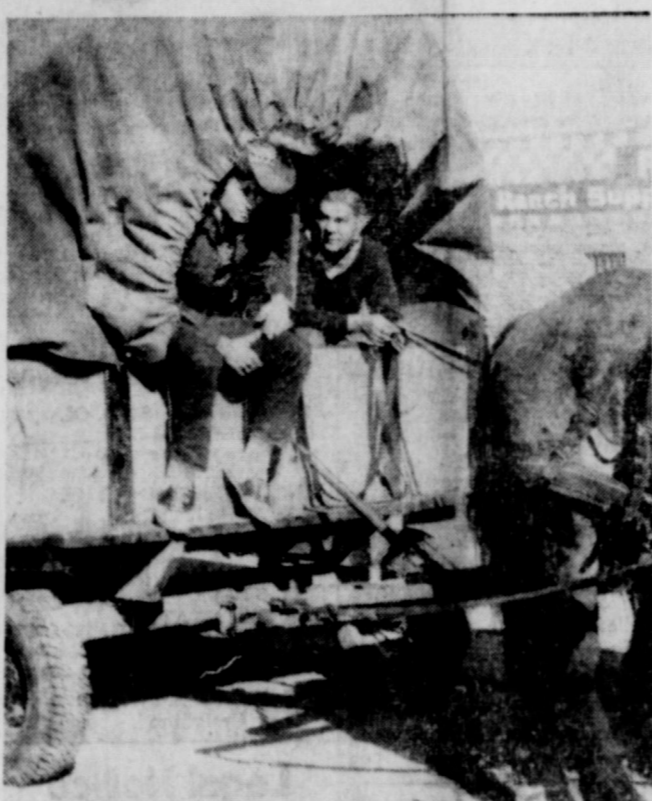
## Jaycees To Consider 'Miss Texas'

## Covered Wagon Family Passes Here Tuesday

The Leon Gillis family, composed of Mr. and Mrs. Gillis, Lee Ann (17), Alan Dale (16), Carol Lynn (15), Barbara Gail (13), Janet Kay (9), and George (6 1/2), traveling by covered wagon, from coast to coast, arrived in Eastland Tuesday afternoon, drew a great deal of attention, and moved on westward.

The family started their unique trip in Sept. 26, 1961 from Providence Forge, Va. They plan to travel to California, a distance of some 3,000 miles, in their homemade covered wagon in approximately seven months.

The family sleeps in the wagon or alongside in the sleeping bags.

Gillis said that the trip was a dream of the entire family for many years before they actually got underway. He explained that the educational opportunities of the trip are many and feels that the children will never forget their experiences.

Their average approximately 20 miles a day, but have traveled as high as 35 miles in one day. The children are taught their lessons by Mrs. Gillis while enroute.

The family agrees that they have encountered hardships along the way, but would not trade the experience for anything.

Gillis remarked that the main purpose of the trip is to slow down from the fast pace of modern life, and see the country as our forefathers saw it. He said that they are still using the same term of horses and that they are in good condition. One problem is keeping shoes on the horses, he said.

Over 2 million other 4-Hers join Eastland County 4-H Club members this week in celebrating National 4-H Club Week.

The 4-H Clubs organization is designed to help develop girls and boys through different subject matter and leadership activities. At the 40th National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago, Ill., Nov. 27, 1961 Raymond C. Firestone made the following statement: "There is no substitute for individual initiative and I know of no organization that provides more opportunity for the application of talents and the exercising of desire for personal advancement. It is true that some of the personal advantages that occur from 4-H Club work are not easily measured, but they are more important in your lives than your material achievements. I am referring to 4-H specifically as a builder of character, integrity, determination, understanding and consideration of others. Because you work to win, 4-H is competitive, but at the same time you learn to be cooperative.

You share your interest and your activities with your fellow members. 4-H was born in America and because it has developed in accord with true American traditions, it helps embed in its members the responsibilities of good citizenship."

This type of training is going on in Eastland County and not just at the level of National 4-H Club Congress. The 76 adult 4-H leaders in Eastland County are doing a wonderful job in their respective communities in training and leading boys and girls to better living. The 800 4-H boys and girls in Eastland County are members of a wide range program which is a part of the agricultural Extension Service for young people.

These boys and girls are taught agriculture and home economic methods in a practical way. Each 4-H Club member has an individual demonstration centering in the home, on the farm, on in the community.

4-H Club members may make clothing, prepare and preserve food, raise livestock and crops, maintain health, promote safety, enjoy recreation or practice citizenship, or a variety of other tasks.

The success of 4-H Club work depends upon volunteer adult leaders. They are the key persons in every 4-H Club.

4-H Parents plus local 4-H leaders plus County Extension Agents added to interested 4-H members equals useful citizens. This is the 4-H team.

There are seven community 4-H Clubs in Eastland County where the 4-H team is at work: Nimrod, Morton Valley, Olden, Cisco, Gorman, Eastland and Desdemona.

Each has an active community 4-H Club. Most of these clubs have enough adult leaders so that every 4-H member has the opportunity to carry a 4-H project in the subject matter the member has chosen.

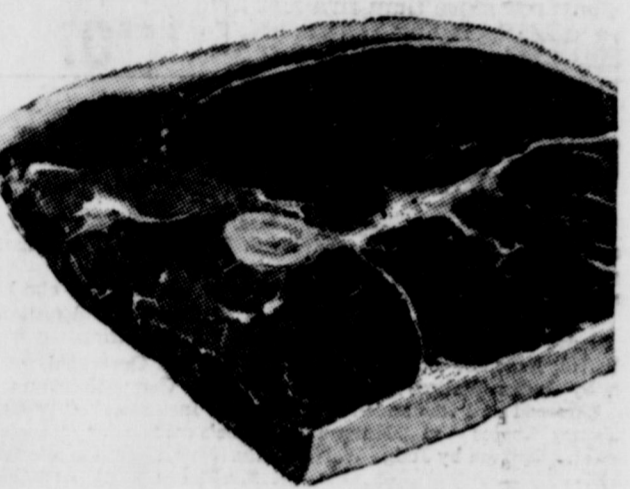

**What's the Future of 'Golden Triangle'?**

Dear Editor:  
Statistics gathered from the U. S. Census Bureau indicate that every area in the United States that had 7,500 population in 1950, grew in population. Those below 7,500 lost in population during the 1950-60 ten year period.  
The area of Ranger, Eastland, Gorman, along with the area of Olden, Carbon, and Desdemona (this can best be visualized by connecting the points together in the two groups, then superimposing them, one over the other) has a combined population of approximately 15,000.



If this force of 15,000, based on service, industry, and agriculture were bonded together, as a common market, then the area should have ability to grow as a common force . . . even more so, than an area of 7,500.

Basically the same situation, only on a much larger and more detailed and technical plane, is now taking place in Europe in the formation of the European "Common Mar-

ket". Past economic history has proven to the nations of the Free West in Europe that it is better to "pull together", than to pull-apart.

One of the basic axioms of math is . . . "Things equal to the same thing are equal to each other" . . . and, it applies this way: If the Common Market plan has proven successful between nations . . . then it should prove even more successful on a smaller and more simpler scale, if implemented.

In order to attract to our area, we must bond ourselves, our monies, our skills, our resources, our abilities and our desires.

An important facet, and an important beginning, is the consolidation of six weak, inadequate school systems into one strong, adequate system.

Then, and only then, will we have the nucleus of the "GOLDEN TRIANGLE".

Consolidation will eventually pay dividends into your bank account.

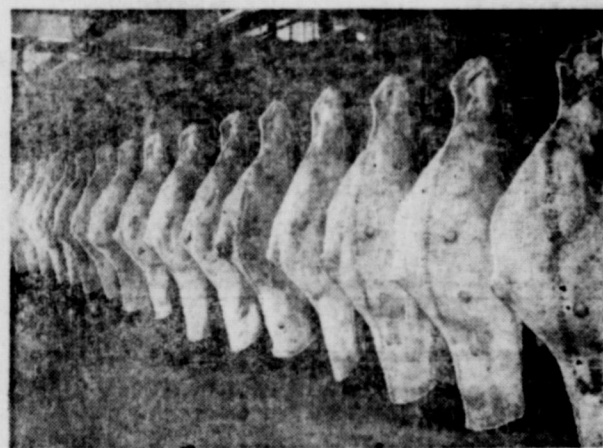

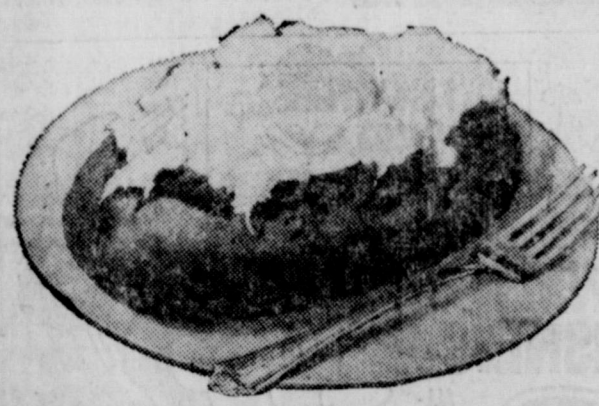
