County Peanut Tour Scheduled

Plans are being developed for the first annual Eastland County Peanut Tour scheduled for Tuesday, September 8th according to County Agricultural Agent J. M. Cooper, who is planning the affair.

All demonstration farms to be visited during the day affair will be in the Gorman area Cooper said. It will be to farms that have planted the new variety—Starr, named after W. B. Starr, veteran peanut grower of the Seranton Community in the western part of Eastland County.

Those participating will see the new peanuts growing by the side of other varieties including the Argentinus, Spante, Dixie Spanish, Haskins No. 1, and the regular Spanish, Cooper said.

The Starr variety was developed at the Stephenville Agricultural Experiment Station after twelve years of research by B. C. Langley, Stephenville. He has accepted an invitation to be on the tour.

The tour will start from the Brown Jug Cafe in Gorman at 9 a.m. Tuesday. Farms to be visited include Albert Taylor, D. B. Warren, Royal Hampton, Odie Rodgers, Claud Fuller, J. L. Butler, Junior Jackson, Bill Andry, Mitchell Campbell, Glenn Justice and Gaslon Warren.

The group will eat lunch in Gorman.

This is the process that the Farm Bureau has developed to make it possible for farmers everywhere, who produce any kind of commodity, any place, to meet, study, debate, decide and rally around a sound solution to their problems, he said.

Campbell urged every Farm Bureau member to review what Farm Bureau is for and against, select the issues they are interested in, and study the solution that will be good long term goals for agriculture.

The issues may be presented at the policy development committee meeting or to the policy chairman. Policies will be voted on by the entire county at the annual convention in October.

MOURNING DOVE - WHITE-WINGED DOVE Open Seasons 1961

MOURNING DOVES: Daily bag limit—15. Possession limit—not to exceed 30.

WHITE-WINGED DOVES: Daily bag limit—10. Possession limit—10.

NOTE: When both mourning doves and white-winged doves are possessed—Possession limit—20, in the aggregate, and not more than 10 may be white-winged doves.



SPECIAL NOTE: Unlawful to take white-winged doves or chachalacas south of U.S. Highway 83, formerly State Highway 4, in southern tip of Texas, marked on map as "Game Sanctuary," and the Big Bend National Park in Brewster County.

SHOTGUNS: Must be plugged permanently to three-shell capacity, may not be larger than 10 gauge. Hunting doves with rifles prohibited.

SHOOTING HOURS: Mourning doves, 12 noon to sunset—except in areas having white-wing season, where the shooting hours will be from 2 p.m. to sunset on September 8, 9 and 10 (consecutive days) only. White-winged doves, in season, 2 p.m. to sunset.

The family maintained a ranch home at Gordon as well as a home in Odessa. Since 1950 he had devoted his time to real estate development and ranching.


