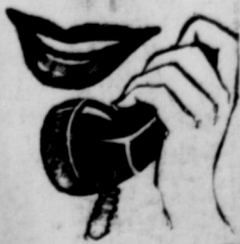

In re: Water Board to Lift Permits of Two Lake Docks, Sept. 1st, 61.

Dear Editor:
There have been three (3) newspaper issues printer of this Eastland Telegram since Sept. 1st, and no notice or report has been made or given by the Eastland Water Board to the public of the continuation of business and the usual operations of these two commercial boat docks, Chock-A-Block Marina and the Lake Leon Lodge, at Lake Leon, which are owned solely by the owners, Dr. H. B. O'Keeffe and E. E. O'Keeffe, Lake Leon, Eastland County, Texas.

Since this serious matter has now been personally interviewed by the Attorney General, Will Wilson, Austin, the State Senator Scott Bailey, Cisco, The Board of Water Engineers, Austin, the Texas Research League, Austin, Game & Fish Commission, Austin, Texas Highway Department, Austin, and the State Editor of the Fort Worth Star Telegram, plus several more State and Public Officials who have a report of this case, it should be to the interest of this Eastland Telegram to follow through on this matter and set the records straight, as a final report is expected here of.

As in the interest and fairness to the public's convenience, these two commercial boat docks, Chock-A-Block Marina and the Lake Leon Lodge, owned and operated by Dr. H. B. O'Keeffe, and Mr. E. E. O'Keeffe, who are brothers, was legally advised to

continue their business as of Sept. 1st, 1961, and commercial boat permits were by members of the Eastland Water Board, with full attention by everyone concerned. An interview was held with F. E. O'Keeffe at his Lake Leon Lodge on Lake Leon by two members of the Water Board, H. Perry and Mrs. Charles Schlag and an interview with Dr. H. B. O'Keeffe, owner of Chock-A-Block Marina, in his office at Eastland, Texas. We trust a better, friendly relations, a better business relation and a better mutual understanding will be reached and will be maintained and continued forever because of the present and in the future.
