Approximately 105 4-Hers, parents and interested adults attended this meeting.

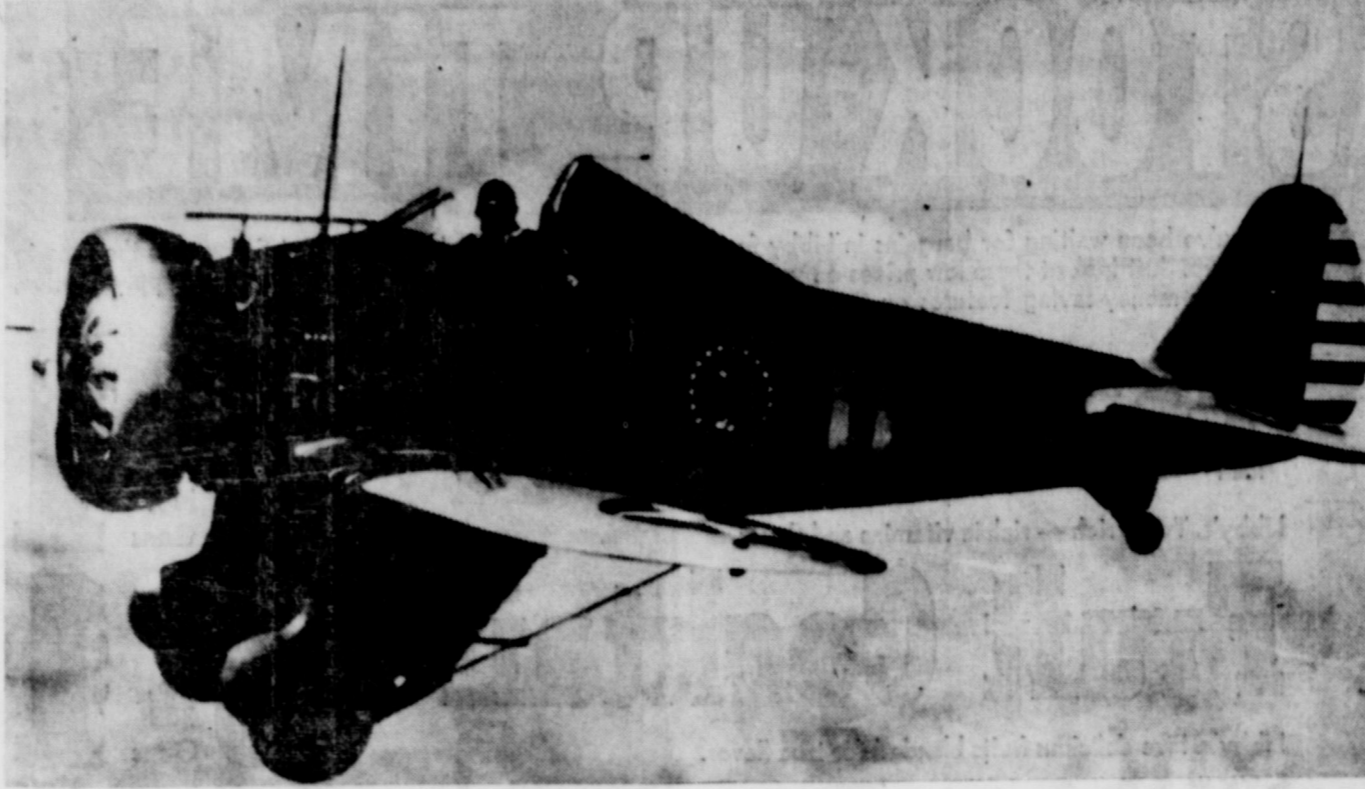

Army Reservists To Be Released From Active Duty

FORT POLK, La.—Some 530 recalled Army reservists assigned to the 49th Armored Division and other units training here are eligible to be released soon from active duty, Maj. Gen. Harley B. West, Division and Post Commander, announced Wednesday.

Those affected by the early release, approximately 50 officers and 480 enlisted men, are to be processed out of their units under a recent Army regulation providing for separations of men who meet certain specified conditions, notably that they have completed five years of honorable active and reserve service.

Only reservists who were recalled from a Ready Reserve control group (a "paper" outfit) and assigned to an active Army unit will be considered eligible for release. Their Ready Reserve obligations must have been satisfactorily completed prior to Oct. 1, 1961.

There must be no record in the soldiers' files showing they signed for additional Ready Reserve time after Oct. 2, 1960.

Members of units when units were mobilized, such as the 49th Armored Division, will remain with their units until the entire unit is de-activated.

The length of time to process out the individuals under consideration for early release is not expected to take over one week.

Senior officers at Fort Polk have received no official word as to when their units will be sent home from active Federal service.

There have, however, been indications that release might come prior to the end of the maximum one year specified in mobilization orders.

There are some 22,000 National Guardsmen and Army Reservists training at this southwestern Louisiana military center. The majority were called to active duty on Oct. 1, 1961.

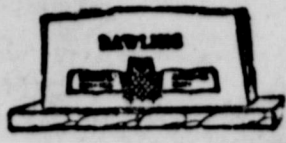

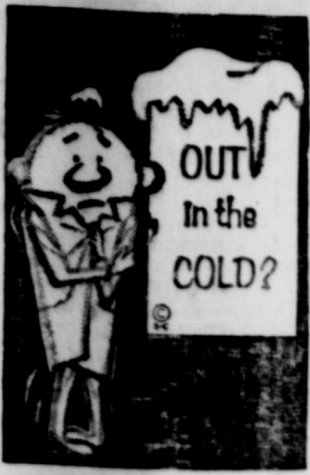

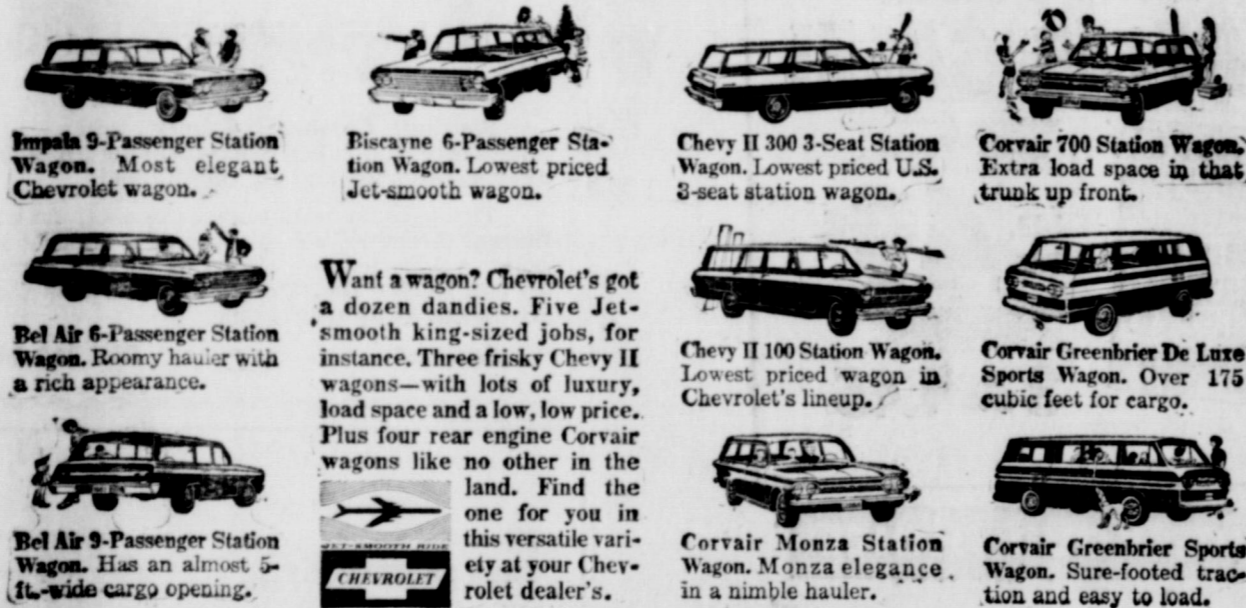
