County To Be Represented At Annual Poultry Meet

Eastland County will be represented at the annual meeting of the Texas Poultry Industry Exposition in Dallas August 28-30.

Among those from the county to attend the Exposition are Mr. and Mrs. James Ratliff and Morris Newsham of Ranger and Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Tidwell of DeSdemona. Mr. Ratliff is outgoing president of the Texas Poultry Association.

Also attending will be Mr. and Mrs. Donald Kincaid, well-known Eastland County turkey raisers who have their ranch between Eastland and Cisco. They plan to leave on the evening of August 27th and return August 30th.

Those included in the exposition which will meet at the Hotel Adolphus are the Texas Poultry Improvement Association, Texas Turkey Federation and the Texas Broiler and Egg Councils.

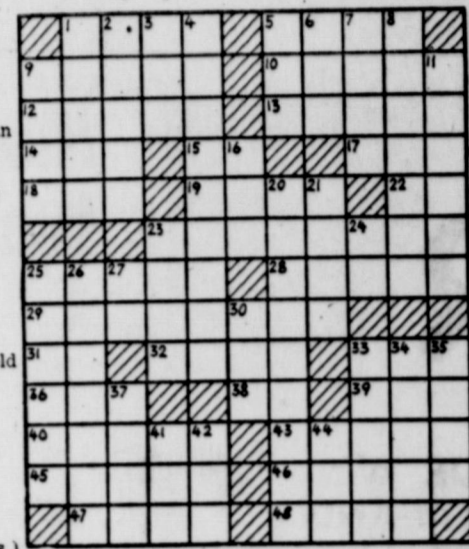
Ben Wormeli, extension poultry husbandman, said the program will emphasize changes that are taking place and those forecast for the future for the poultry industry. It's the kind of a meeting poultrymen and persons connected with related parts of the poultry industry just can't afford to miss, he added.

Speakers will include presidents of three national poultry organizations. Each will discuss topics of current interest, Wormeli said.

Rare Six Foot Plant Growing In Local Woman's Yard

Mrs. C. E. Johnson of 205 S. Walnut St. here has some unusual plants in her yard, one of which has reached a height of over six feet.

The plants, which may be seen north and near the front of the house, are known as amaranthus.

The five plants which are growing now from seeds planted in May are results of two plants bought from Poe Floral several years ago. The original plants resembled green pepper and were six to eight inches high and were purchased for 10c each.

Mrs. Johnson was told by a friend that they would grow to look like a poinsettia and bear colored leaves. The plants now look more like a cornstalk with seeds all up and down the stalk. The leaves are green up to waist high and from there bear iridescent crim-

son, pink, yellow and other colored leaves.

In February of 1960 Mrs. Johnson had 30 of the plants which were about shoulder-high and attracted many visitors. This year she planted some of the seeds from the 1960 plants which she had given a brother and he was still saving.

Mrs. Johnson's "green thumb" is not only evidenced by the rare amaranthus. A maderia potato vine which she parted near an elm tree stump after a storm in 1955 still attractively covers the stump. She is also proud of her crepe myrtles and marigolds.

The J. C. Poe's, who own and manage Poe's Floral, recently threw away several amaranthus plants because they were not selling. Perhaps they will be more in demand here after Mrs. Johnson's experience.

There are two types of amaranthus seed available—Molten Fire, an iridescent crimson (Mrs. Johnson's type) and Tri-color Splendens, yellow, red and green.
