

REASONABLE TIME Before a contract arises someone must make an offer another must accept it. Without an offer, no acceptance; with no acceptance,

But there is ofte: a time within which you can accept the offer. And if not, the offer ends anyhow within "reasonable time" which determined by circumstances and the parties' intertions.

Smith had a set of which Brown wanted. Brown wrote and offered him \$200 for the set.

Smith didn't answer for six months, and meantime Brown bought a similar set. O:e day ps to sound policies.

Was there a contract? No, the offer had lapsed because t had not been accepted in the circumstances within a reasonable time.

There are many ways to end an offer. You may withdraw it, you may say that the offer expires at a given time, or you may die, or the other party may turn it down directly or

by making a counter offer. Here Smith had failed to accept Brown's offer within a reasonable time, which ended it just as though it had been withdrawn.

What is a reasonable time? The offer could expire in a few minutes in the stock morket or last for quite a while, depending upon what a court think is a reasonable time. But in Smith's case six

flock, according to Wakefield. Some chickens are leaders and some are followers and a bird is in for a fight if it violates its place in the order. The peck order influences the feed consumption and the sexund behavior and eventually the flock's production efficienstates Wakefield.

Chickens by habit peck their inferiors and avoid their superiors but in a large flock they may get the two mixed. Since this could prove dangerous of a social superior were attacked, chickens should not have travel into strange areas of the pen to water, feed, nest and

When birds do not have to travel more than 10 or 15 feet there is less danger of encountering social superiors and thus less tension and stress in the fleck. The pen may actually be regional divided into many peck orders and birds may never leave their own region, says Wakefield.
