Big Game Hunters Have Good Chance for an Elk This

Hunters holding elk licenses may hunt antiered eik during the regular big game season in Colorado's great elk hunting areas. It is required only that they hold an elk license—and that they check carefully to make sure season and area are open for elk hunting, and that the elk they shoot has antiers.

Complete information on all elk and other big game hunting in Colorado, regulations and detailed color maps will be available without cost from the Game and Fish department, 1530 Sherman St., Denver 1, from big game licensing agencies, or from Regional Game and Fish managers' offices.
