A course remains open for the purchaser who wants to cover himself for the entire price of the home. He should, at the time of application for the required 'mortgage policy', check with his attorney about simultaneously obtainig an 'owner's policy.' The 'owner's policy,' in contrast to the 'mortgage policy,' protects the home buyer as long as he owns the property. In many instances, it also protects an owner even after he sells, if he has a warranted title.

Owners of higher - priced homes usually take out both title policies. Thus, they purchase peace of mind on their substantial equity instead of trying to 'save' a few dollars, a false economy which may later invite trouble.
