## Water Rates for Summer Opposition, But Passes

Water rates are being increased and become effective July 1. The new rates had stiff opposition from one commissioner who felt that the City Commission should not pass a rate increase unless the loss was more than was expected with the costs.

At the summer water campaign issue during the past two commission elections, and topped its first hurdle Monday of this week.

The new rate increases the minimum gallonage from 3,000 to 4,000 and sets up a reducing rate per 1,000 gallons used over the minimum up to 10,000 with the cost per 1,000 only 25 cents, after that amount.

Darrell Knight, Abilene accountant, reported at the Monday night meeting that the city could lose \$300 a month during the test period, if the public doesn't increase water use.

Virgil T. Seaberry Jr. cast the one negative vote at the regular meeting, and held the commission to its "three readings", by calling a special session Monday at 5 p. m.

At that meet he explained that he was against the rate cut because it benefitted only the large water user without helping the minimum user. He also questioned Knight's estimate of possible loss, in saying that he believed the city would be changing as much as \$3,384 (and not \$300 a month, or \$900) during the three-month period.

"If the new rate had been in effect last year," Seaberry said, "the city would have lost \$1,056 in June, \$1,212 in July and \$1,115 in August."

Mayor Don Pierson, who has been among the loudest advocates of lower water rates, countered that "We don't know that the water usage figures from last year are correct, nor do we know what the weather this summer will be and we don't know, and can only hope that the people will increase their water usage."

Pierson called the rate reduction a "reasonable gamble" which could result in a more beautiful Eastland with the use of more water.

Seaberry agreed, but added that the "calculated risk is greater than \$900." A motion by Seaberry to table the matter pending further study, died for lack of a second.

Frank Deaton moved that the ordinance be passed as read, but Seaberry refused to accept Pierson's motion. Deaton's motion was also rejected.

## Lone Star Plans Two New Wells

Bids are to be asked for soon by Lone Star Producing Company for two new drilling ventures in the Cisco Northwest Field, according to a report here.

The company already has a Caddo gas discovery well in that field, complete earlier this year.

The field is located about seven miles northwest of Cisco. One of the wells to be drilled will be No. 2-B-C. C. Pippet, 800 feet from south and 1,000 feet from west lines of section 3171, TE&L Survey. It will be a 300-foot shallow sand wildcat seven miles west of Cisco and three-eighths of a mile west of the present No. 1 Pippet gasser.

The other location will be southeast of the 2-B, Lone Star plans No. 1-B, 700 feet from south and 1,167 feet from the west lines of section 3171, a 4,100-foot Ellenburger.

# Albert The Alligator Is 'Packed' for the Winter

You ordinarily wouldn't expect to find a man-eating alligator in semi-arid Eastland County, but don't be surprised on a farm near Morton Valley, north of Eastland.

Mr. and Mrs. Jeff Laughlin have been house-petting an alligator at their farm home for about eight years.

The alligator, who answers to the name of "Albert" is about eight feet long and weighs approximately 80 pounds.

He is a fast growing youngster — adding a foot in length, and ten pounds in weight for each year of age.

Albert eats about four pounds of food a week when he is eating — but he only eats four months out of the year.

The Laughlins acquired Albert from a daughter in Houston. At that time he was 14 inches long.

He eats mostly jackrabbit but will eat chickens, Mr. Laughlin said. "As time passes he should grow to a length of 14 feet, his owner says.

**JUDGE BAILEY SPEAKER AT HISTORICAL SOCIETY MEET**

By ROBERT BELL County Judge Scott Bailey was the speaker on Wednesday, May 15, in the County Courthouse at a meeting of the Eastland County Historical Society, which was dedicated to the memory of Mrs. John E. Chesley, an early Eastland County resident and a founding member of the Society, who recently died at the age of 99.

Tribute was paid to Mrs. Chesley as a person who had lived and made some of the history of Eastland County, and who had contributed much to the heritage of the area.

In his talk to the group Judge Bailey gave reports on the statewide progress of the Statewide Historical Survey program, and the progress of bills in the state legislature

which would benefit the preservation of historical sites papers.

He also spoke of the pride that the people of Texas should take in their heritage, telling of Theodore Roosevelt coming to Texas to get men for information of the Rough Riders, saying that "Cowards never started for Texas, and the weak died on the way, so that only the brave and the strong are here, and those are the kind of men I want."

In other business at the meeting the new membership cards were handed out to the members present, and it was decided to extend Founder Membership availability until organizational details were completed.

Following adjournment, there was informal discussion of

county history and folklore, including the Woodson ghost, and a ghost that was seen by the father of Mrs. George Blackwell of Gorman. Everyone agreed that it was an interesting meeting.

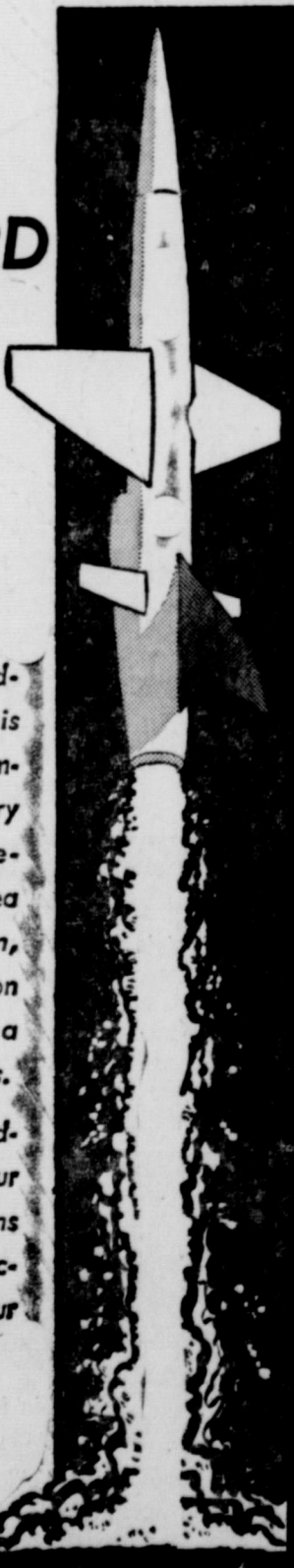

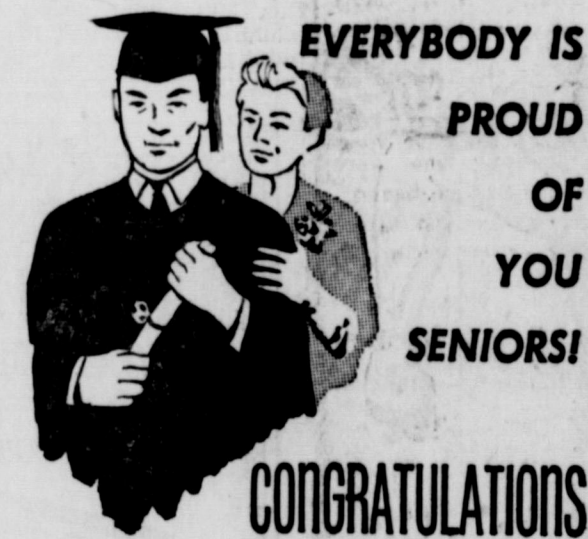
