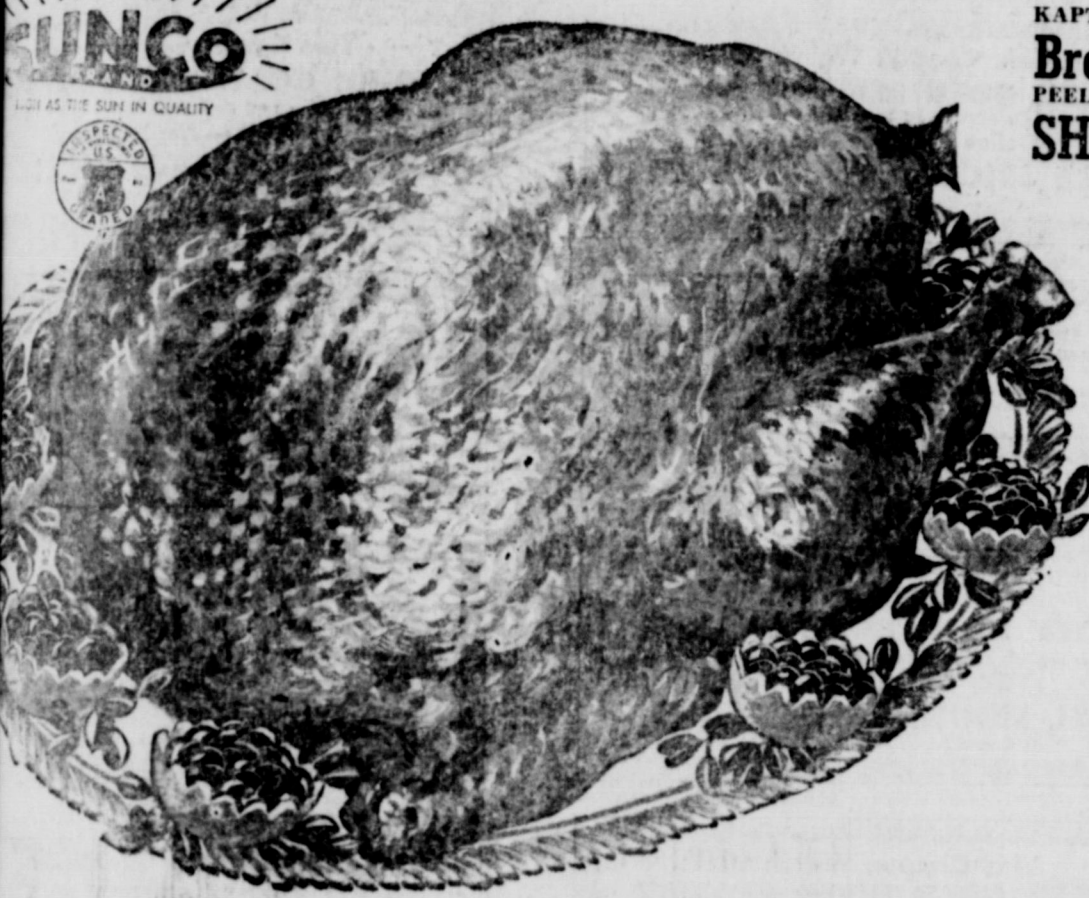

SOCIALIZED MEDICINE IS DISCUSSED AT LEAGUE

Dr. H. J. Bulgerin described the effects of socialized medicine on economy and on people in a speech to the Civic League and Garden Club in their 3 p. m. meeting Wednesday in the Woman's Club. He said that there will be a great push for socialized medicine during the next year and its main argument will be "political as well as a national emergency." The program speech was a part of "Operation Home-town," a nationwide effort by the medical profession to present the facts concerning government interference in the practice of medicine. He compared the trend here toward socialized medicine to the unsuccessful "English Health Service" and said that the Medical Association hopes to at least hold it at the present level. He said in ten years the proposed medicare bill could be twice as expensive as our present defense budget, as well as leading to governmental control of a great many things. During the informal tribute, Members Jim Horton and Earl Bender, both long-time members, recalled days gone by when Mr. Pipkin was extremely active in the club

Both remembered that he was faithful in attendance and support of the club as well as all other civic endeavors.

Mr. Bender recalled that on several occasions Mr. Pipkin had been asked to serve as president of the club, but that each time, he had declined, explaining that he could best serve under other leadership.

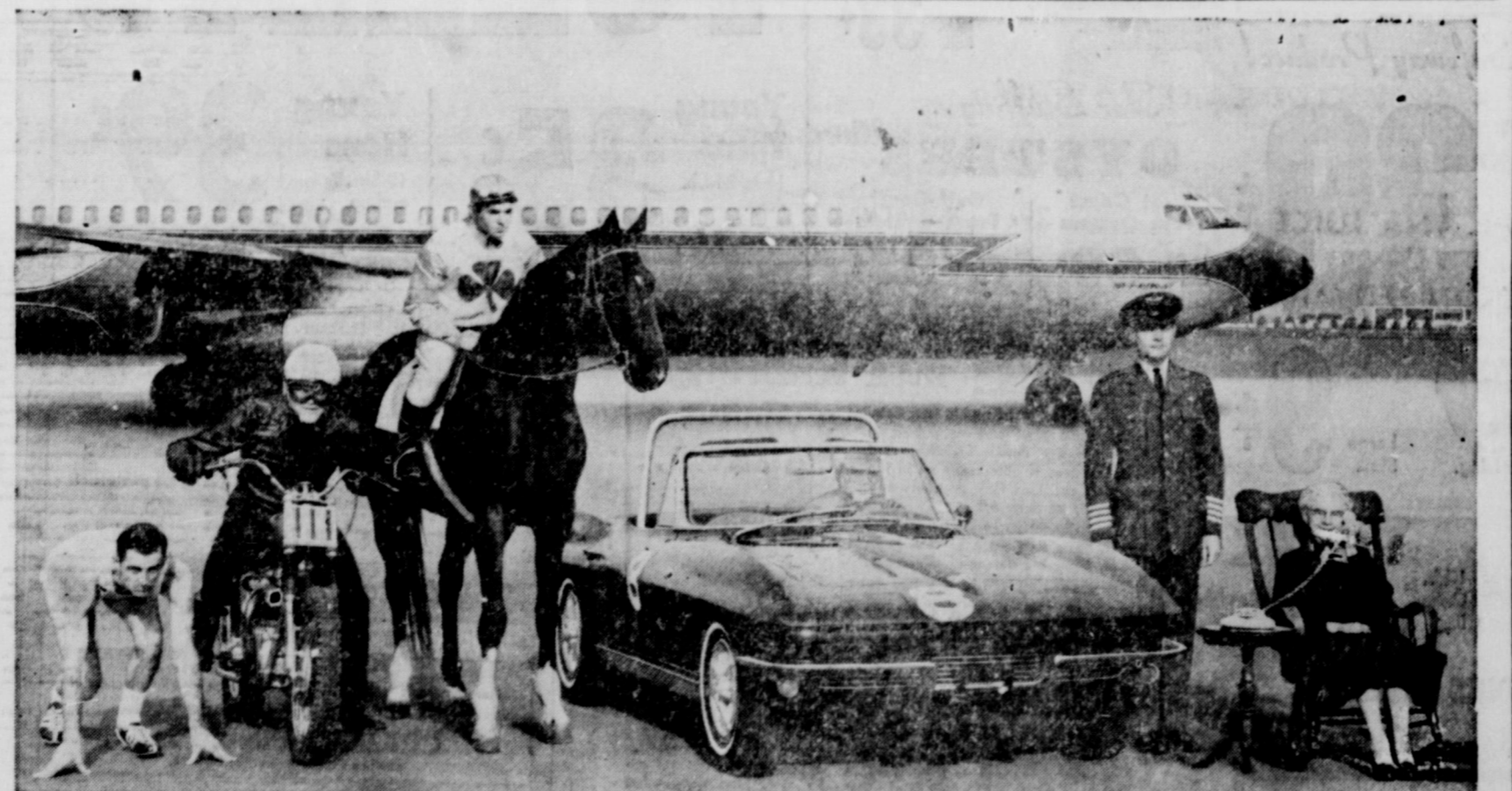

Eastlander Describes Army Missile Tour

(ED. NOTE: The following is Mr. Henry Pullman's account of his recent tour with the U. S. Army of missile facilities. Mr. Pullman delivered this as a speech for the week.)

Eastland Rotary Club last week.)

By HENRY PULLMAN
I just returned from a very interesting trip which took four days and every day we saw something new and very educational — and also frightening. From my own observation with what I saw with my own eyes, and all the briefings and pictures shown us, Russia has big, heavy bombers and all kinds of missiles. I have come to the conclusion that all continents are within range of far missiles — all civilian populations too.

Despite protests, the test explosion of atomic and nuclear weapons of war continues, polluting the air and the sea, even the rainfall and the snow. Nations are willing to call a halt to the production and testing of further weapons of holocaustic destruction of humane lives only because they feel overstocked with them, or feel they have reached the ultimate weapon and no further testing is needed. Fear of radioactive fallout from nuclear explosion spreads around the globe and stirs unrest among the helpless, who feel victimized for the sake of security and to get surprises ready for the suspected enemy. The invention and making of more hideous weapons of destruction continues. With the ICBM or with the atomic or modernizing submarine equipped to hurl IRBMs from underneath the water and able to conceal itself under the polar icecaps, the splendid isolation of any continent is a thing of the past, all continents are within

range of war missiles. Our trip was sponsored by the Army Air Defense Command, and called Operation Understanding. There were 10 business men on the trip. I went to Dyess AFB Tuesday morning and met the group and Lt. Col. Thomas Duck and Capt. Samuel Newman. We had lunch at the officers club and boarded buses to take us to the airport where a C-47 waited for us. We left for Fort Bliss at 1:45 and were met by buses there and taken to private rooms at the officers barracks. We had three hours rest, and then the bus took us to Juarez. The military personnel had to change clothes because they are not allowed to wear uniforms across the border. We shopped and all had dinner at the Fiesta Night Club where a table had been reserved for us. After that the bus took us back to Fort Bliss to our rooms. It was midnight, but we didn't go to bed until three a. m. because we had a jolly lunch and we did a lot of talking.

Wednesday morning we rose at 6:30, had breakfast at the officers club and began hearing briefings on the Nike and other missile systems. We were told that there are over 50,000 officers and men in the Army Air Defense missile units, both at home and aboard. Army missiles vary in type, from fixed installations, deployed for the defense of this continent, to mobile units capable of moving with and protecting a field Army.

After lunch at club, we were taken to McGregor Firing range, some 30 miles from El Paso, and is 55 miles long and 25 miles wide. We saw six missiles fired — two Nike Hercules, two Nike Ajax and two Hawks. That evening we were at Johnson, commander. Next day we departed for White Sands Missile Range where we had briefing on Nike Zeus missile and program. The range, operated by 15,000 civilian and military personnel, is used by all branches of the services for missile testing. It is 100 miles long by 40 miles wide. Its annual payroll is \$85,000,000.

We were taken to the White Sands National Monument, comprising nearly 230 square miles, located in south, central New Mexico along U.S. Highway 70. From here we went to Holloman Air Force Base to fly to Colorado Springs, Colo. We arrived there late in the evening and it had snowed all day. From the airport, the bus took us to the famous Broadmore Ho-

tel, where rooms had been assigned for us. We had a formal dinner in the hotel restaurant that evening. Buses took us to the Army Air Defense school Friday morning for briefings and conferences. The school teaches courses varying in length from one to 54 weeks using equipment costing over \$63 million dollars. It costs \$21 million to operate the school last year. From there we went to the North American Air Defense Command Headquarters, a joint command exercising operational control of forces allocated for air defense of Canada, Alaska and the U. S. They took us to the Command Operation Center where all defenses are ready to be used 24 hours a day seven days a week. It's confronting to know they are on the job.

From the AF base, the bus took us to the Air Force Academy, one of our nation's leading academic and training institutions, located just

north of Colorado Springs. The academy, situated against a breathtaking backdrop of Rampart Range, annually has more visitors than any Colorado. There are 2,500 cadets there now. We visited the Academy museum, then were taken to the Peterson Field for departure for home station. We got back to Dyess AFB at 9 p. m. and a special car brought me back to Eastland.
