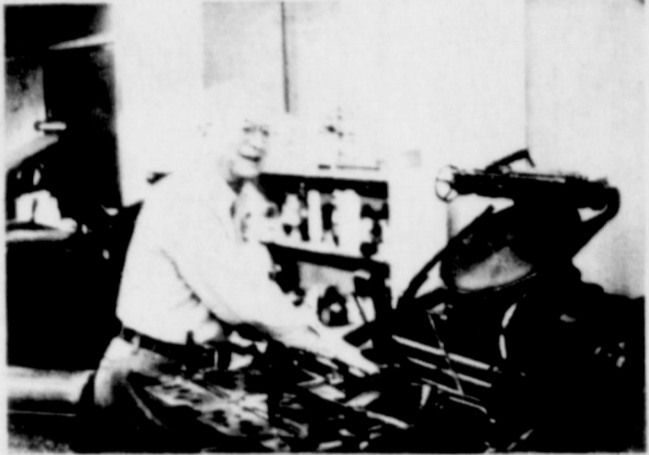

# Joe Stephen Retires XXX 1945 - 1975



Joe Stephen came to Eastland during the oil boom days from Weatherford where he worked on the Weatherford Democrat Weekly under the late R.K. Phillips.

He came to Eastland in 1919 and helped put up the shop where the laundry is now located on East Plummer Street. The shop was to be known as the Eastland Daily Oil Belt News with Joe as foreman, the late Boyce House as editor, Mrs. W.K. Jackson as society editor, and the late Walter Murray as publisher and owner. Later the paper became the Eastland Chronicle.

From there, Joe went to work for the C.D. Knight Printing Company on West Main Street where Pipkin Motor is now located.

In 1935 Joe was the victim of a hit and run driver and almost lost his left arm. When he was able to print again, he went to work for Victor Cornelius when the latter started his business in the garage at his home on East Main Street.

The late Thelma Verner and the late Glenn Graham were the other employees, making a total

of three. Later Victor moved to the building where the Texas Electric is now located. From there Victor moved to his present site where Joe worked for ten years.

In 1945 Joe went into business for himself in the same block where he stayed till he sold recently to the Olney Savings and Loan Co.

Joe is a member of the United Methodist Church, the Chamber of Commerce, the Quarterback Club, the Eastland Merchants Credit Association, the Lakeside Golf Club and the Lone Cedar Country Club.

He and his wife have two sons: Rod Stephen, who is general sales manager for the Mission Pharmaceutical Company in San Antonio, and Stan Stephen who is Executive Vice President, trust officer and director of the First Bank and Trust in Bryan.

To all his customers Joe says: "Thank you for your patronage through the years and continued prosperity."

His slogan is "Hard work never hurt NOBODY!"

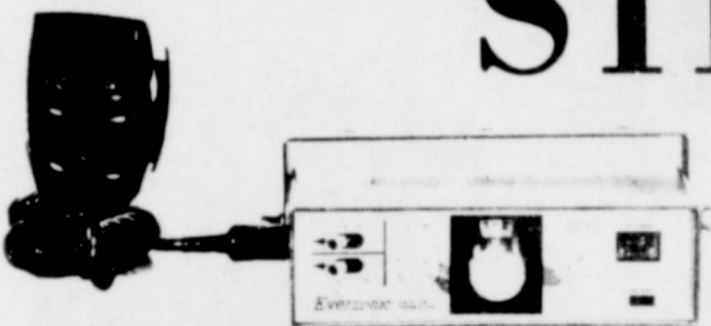

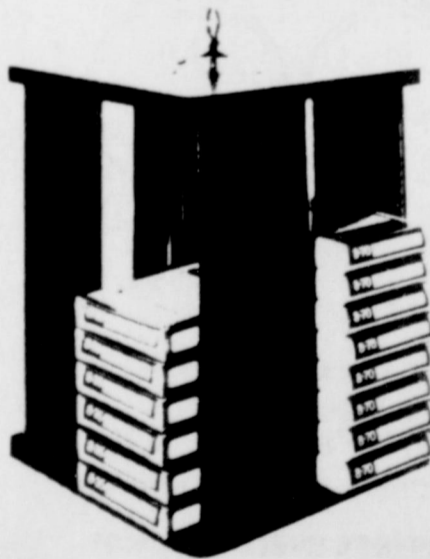

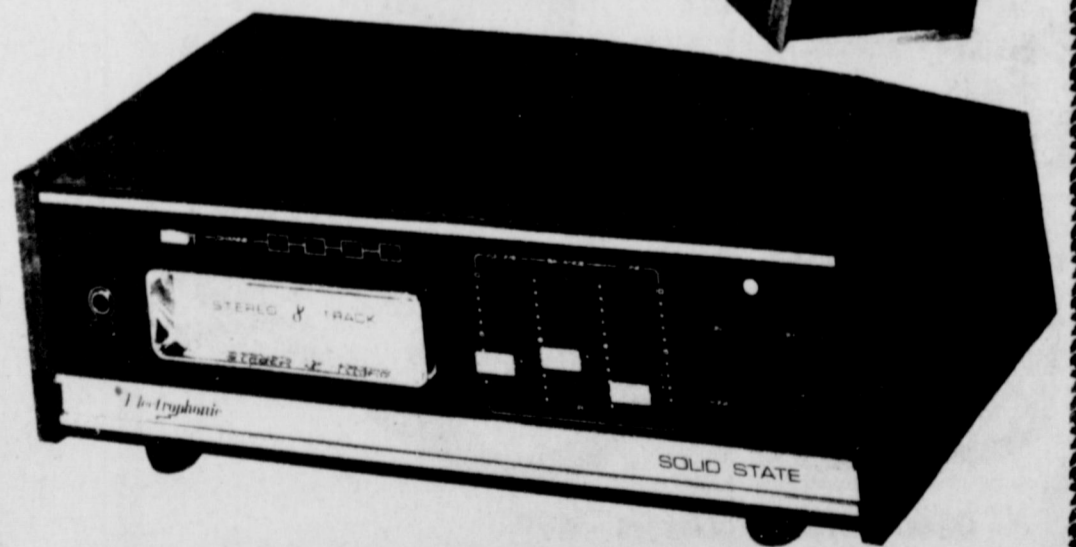
