

Mavettes To Trip To Nacadoches



Chamber To Decide On **Channel 5 Action**

The board of directors for the Eastland Chamber of Commerce will decide the next course of action in the continuing "Channel 9 vs. Channel 5"

directors attempted Monday to reason with KRBC-TV General Manager Bill Terry asking that the station rescind (or not pursue) its request to the Federal Communications Com mision regarding KXAS-TV duplication on the Southern Television Cable in Eastland.

Terry contended Monday that he and his station are simply attempting to follow the FCC rules on protecting stations from duplication.

The small group of directors will report to the general board at the next chamber meeting, to be held Thursday noon, November 20, at the Ramada Inn.

The Chamber is acting at the request of several citizens and steps be taken to permit the cable company to continue to carry both KRBC-TV and, KXAS-TV. (both NBC affiliates: as the cable customers are accustomed to in Eastland.

Other avenues were discussed at a special called meeting of the board last week, and the first effort was the small group visit with the KRBC manage ment. Mr. Terry agreed to come to Eastland to meet with the

group rather than the group going to Abilene. The Abilene station is asking

that Southern Cable "turn off" Channel 5 (KXAS) whenever there is duplicating NBC programs being carried over KRBC. Southern contends that the carriage of both NBC channels insures the Eastland subscribers of good NBC reception. There are times when bad weather in West Texas causes Channel 9 out of Monahans to co-channel with Abilene's channel 9 making for a bad reception, it is reported.

Further, Eastland is presently in the Fort Worth weather section, and the Abilene station rarely mentions Eastland weather, it was pointed out.

The KXAS Fort Worth station carries Ranger baseball coverage in season, and its news reporting is appreciated in Eastland.

During the private Monday conference. Terry was asked repeatedly if he could show actual figures of how his station was being hurt economically by having duplicated NBC coverage in Eastland and he said that he could not.

Television station viewing audience is measured by an system which reportedly projects the number of viewers these surveys reveal. Terry said that the rating companies send

Veterans Day At Lions Club

special way Tuesday by embers of the Eastland Lions Club who heard one of their favorite members tell of his unique World War II and Korean War experiences as a Marine.

Veteran Marine Sgt. James Reid, four years in the Pacific and two years in Korea, remembered that, like many others, he first heard of Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1941, when the Japanese pulled the surprise attack on the Hawaiian

Islands. His most unique experience was that exactly nine weeks later, he arrived at Pearl Harbor as a young Marine to begin pulling guard duty, after a short five-week basic training period.

Veterans Day was marked in He recalled that he left Dallas on a troop train on Dec. 30, arrived in San Diego soon afterwards to be issued one pair of coveralls (which he wore for five weeks with one washing) and a Springfield rifle. Basic training consisted of 4 a.m. to 10 p.m. training, seven days a week for five weeks. He was

> Getting picked for guard duty at the end of basic prevented a Marine Corps liberty in San Diego, and a quick ship ride to Pearl Harbor and a last straggling Japanese plane straffed the island the day they arrived so, he went on immediate guard duty there: four hours on and eight off for what turned out to

Reid was told by Admiral Nimitz late one night that he had better wake up or the corporal of the guard might sack

Even though he "knew better" he volunteered for an effort called Project Camouflage and sailed with the fleet for the Marshall Islands, getting his first introduction to Tokyo Rose and her radio propaganda.

After helping with the Marshall Island efforts he returned without scratch or harm, only to get off a bus at Treasure Island and be hit by a taxi cab. He wasn't hurt but it proved quite a'

It was here that he enjoyed his first liberty from a Marine Corps installation--after three years as a Marine

He told briefly about being recalled for the Korean "police action", and explained that the could understand young men's feelings about such as Vietnam where there was "war there" but no "war here"


