WEATHER - GUESSERS are seeing this weekend as time for the really good rains. It's Eastland County Livestock Show time, and surely that'll do it. Charles Hutto, FFA man, reports it was bitter cold at last Saturday's fine Eastland show, as do the track team followers and coaches who report it raw at recent meets. It looks as though most tender plants and buds may have made it so far, with just a bit of nipping...but it's a long time until Easter, third Sunday in April. Either way it's always a good time to be out at the county stock show to boost the 4-H and FFA young people who really deserve our support.

ENGLISH LITERATURE instructors might consider this when they find it difficult to relate the creativeness and the sparkling chat - chat of the early English coffee houses, from which sprang the classics of Johnson, Boswell, et al.; there is a modern - day counterpart. Almost as rich, and certainly more contemporary are the late afternoon coffee breaks in Eastland's various waterholes. Amid many refills, there's really unbelievable stimulating banter, surely not unlike that which was prevalent in the early gatherings. This is true for men, and guesses are that the beauty parlor settings are the same for the womenfolk. At one recent men's discussion, the topic was on the fine points of characterization, motivation and screen writing of a currently popular novel and television adaptation. Sam Johnson would have been proud.

IF THERE'S not an old saying about it not hurting much to lose what you're not getting, there should be. Take revenue sharing, for instance, and from what you hear, there's a good chance the federal government may indeed take it back. And if so, there's this silver lining, at least for Eastland: we'd be losing less than most. We're getting less and always have. According to State Comptroller Bob Bullock's figures, Eastland's revenue sharing funds amount to 15.1 percent of its total tax revenue. By comparison, the county government revenue sharing money is 26.3 percent of its total tax dollars; Carbon, 38.2; Cisco, 27.5; Gorman, 18.6; Ranger, 37.2; and Rising Star, 24.5. If you wonder why the various differences, best check with Bullock because it's a COMPLICATED formula that's used to determine how much comes back. Hereabouts, most agree that revenue sharing has worked pretty good, and that it should be continued. Don't think there's anybody who'd hazard a guess as to what could come from Congress now though.

outstanding skills in showing their animals. Three showmanship trophies will be awarded by the Eastland Auction Company to top

showmen in the market animal classes. The Eastland County Farm Bureau will award five showmanship trophies in the Breeding classes.

There will be four herdsman awards given to 4-H Clubs and FFA Chapters who do the best job of keeping stalls, pens and aisles clean. The Eastland County Farmers Union will sponsor these.

The WS Cattle Company will present a trophy to the exhibitor of the Champion Steer.

The Mike Farnsworth Memorial trophy will be presented to the owner of the champion Angus heifer by the Farnsworth Angus Ranch.

The Ferguson Time Shop will give a trophy to the most cooperative showman of the show.

The concession stand will be operated by the county 4-H Adult leaders association. They invite the public to come to the concession building for meals. They will be serving barbecue lunches, hamburgers, coffee, cold drinks and baked goods.

Businesses and individuals purchased advertisements in

the show catalogue. This is the method used to provide prize money for the exhibitors. Merchants and individuals are encouraged to attend the sale and purchase prize winning animals at premium prices Saturday night.

Another method of raising money to pay expenses of the stock show is the selling of one dollar membership cards to individuals. The association is hoping to sell 600 memberships. Two names will be drawn from these membership cards at the sale Saturday night and each of these two people will receive a one half dressed beef. The Rust Processing Plant is processing the beef as a contribution to the stock show.

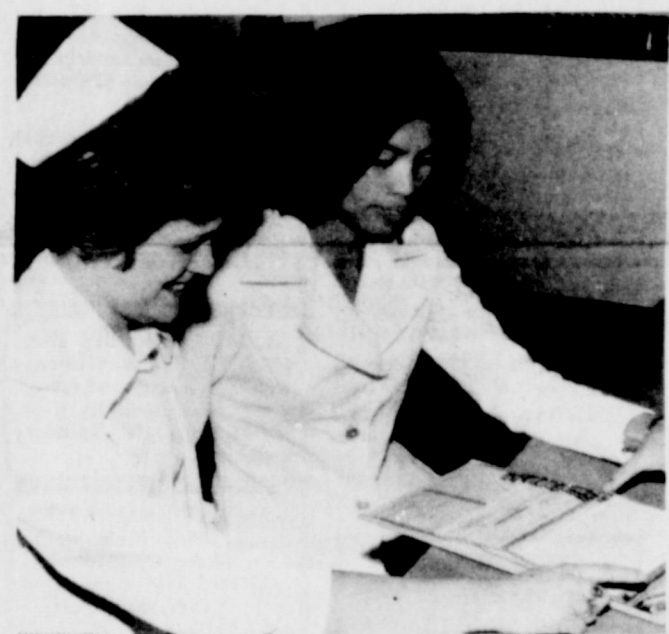

Bright Hopes For Renovation Of Fireman's Hall

Bright hopes for the renovation of Fireman's Hall at Eastland City Park are the most exciting prospects resulting from a regular City Commission meeting at City Hall this week.

O.L. Rodgers requested permission to renovate the lower portion of the old building on Park Hill and turn it into a recreation center and snack bar. He was given permission and six months free rent with the added stipulation that he would be given an additional six months at the end of that period to renovate the upper floor, if upon inspection the Commission is pleased with his first six months work.

Mr. Rodgers proposed to establish an entertainment center suitable for all ages, and has had experience in operating this type of business in Waco.

In other business, the commission granted permission to James Farmer to irrigate up to 24 acre feet of water from Lake Eastland at \$8 per foot for the next five years, subject to approval by the Texas Water Control Commission. The agreement will be similar to those handled at Lake Leon.

J.D. May requested sewer and water service to a ten-acre tract which he stated that he plans to subdivide and annex, south of Crestwood. He is superintendent at Texas Railway Car in Ranger and reported that 28 families from that firm now live in Eastland, and an additional 50 people are expected to be added to the payroll there soon, with a good chance that many will consider living in Eastland.

The ten acre tract was bought out of a 50 acre tract owned by Mike Collins.

Mr. May was asked if he was familiar with the city's new sub-division ordinance which sets out guidelines in annexing sub-divisions. He was to pick up a copy of the ordinance Tuesday morning.

The City voted to join the Small City Association at a cost of \$50 a year to join in a lobbying effort in behalf of the small towns in the state and nation.

Fire Chief Jack Graham appeared and with the commission, it was agreed that the city would buy ten small call-talk radios for use by firemen to replace the totally inadequate telephone system. The city will further loan the firemen one-half of the second ten, and pay back the amount advanced. The radio units will also remain the property of the Volunteer Fire Dept.

"I have some wonderful help. This year Mary Vaught, who is new on our costume crew, has already made some beautiful and difficult things—the king's crown, especially, and she is working on the coats of mail for the sentries."

"Mrs. John Schlittler of Rising Star has made the costumes for Hamlet, who will be played by her son Craig Campbell."

"Others who are working members of the crew are Myrtle Thompson, Sherry Phillips, Billie Bradley and Nettie Wilson."

Mrs. Pierson, Mrs. Phillips, and Mrs. Bradley are actresses as well as costumers and have been in a number of productions.

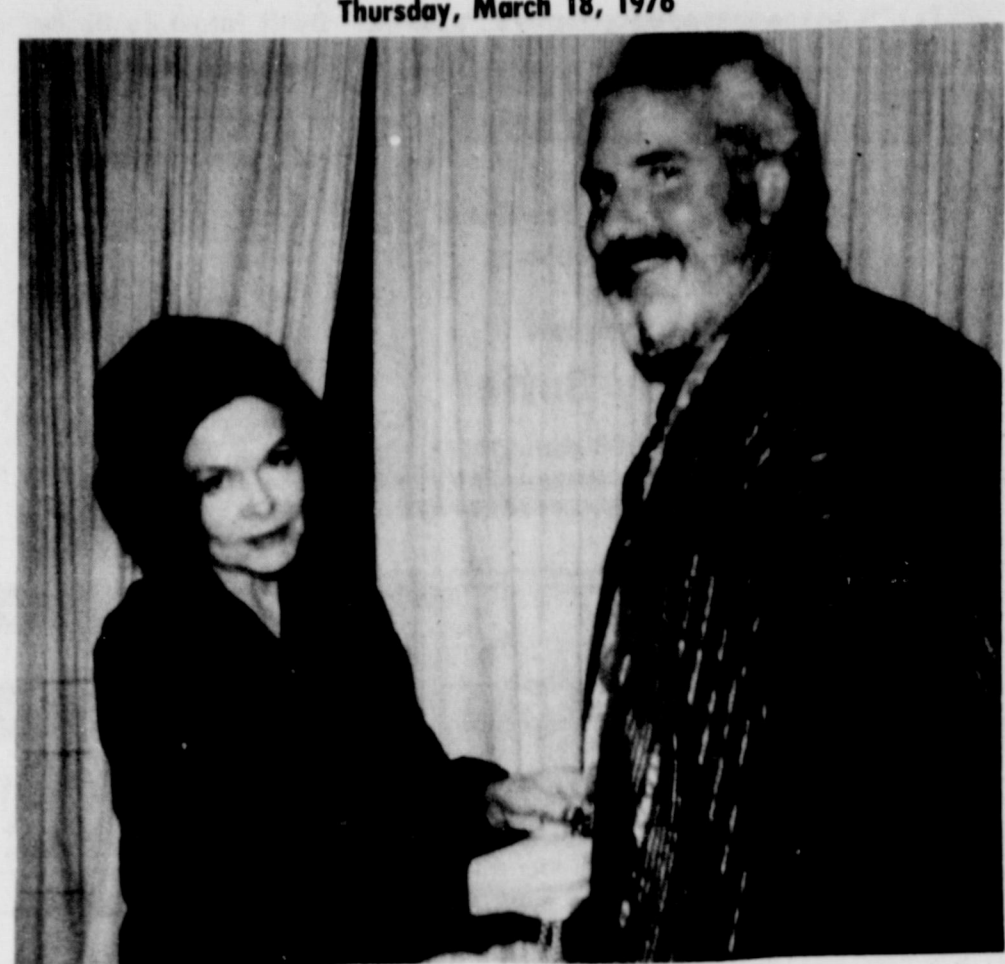

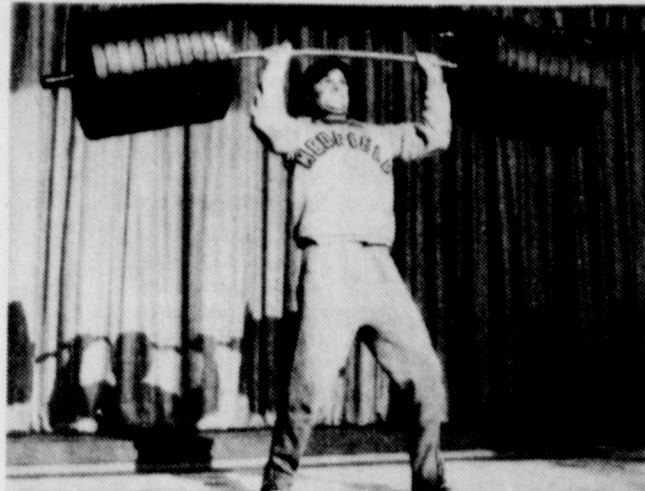

Changes that went into effect September 15, 1975, were these two that deserve special attention: 1. The designation of Channel 11 as a national calling channel, and 2. The removal of restrictions on designated station-to-station channels. You may call another licensee on any channel.

Now the only designated channels are 9, for motorists assistance and emergencies and channel 11, for calling and contact.

ELECTRICAL SAFETY

Dos 'n Don'ts

Don't... ignore appliances that are slow to heat, fuses that blow, TV that shrinks; they can be symptoms of inadequate wiring. Don't take any chances, have your wiring checked by a qualified electrician.

Don't... overload circuits or extension cords. This will overheat wiring causing insulation to bake and crack. The heat can set fire to wood or exposed wires can cause a short circuit.

Do... use extreme care working outdoors around powerlines. Ladders, pipes, pool cleaners, tree trimmers, masts, kites, and model airplane wires can cause fatal shocks.

Do... ground major appliances and make sure they have their own circuit that is properly fused.

Don't... stick objects into appliances or outlets; besides risking electrical shock, this may result in a short circuit. Also keep unused outlets and extension cords covered or capped to prevent small children from sticking objects into outlets.

Don't... hang cords over pipes, ducts, nails or hooks. Keep them away from heat and water.

Do... exercise extreme care and judgement when operating any type of outdoor electrical equipment. Always use three wire grounded cords or use double-insulated tools.
