Please understand that I am not in any way speaking for the commission, nor am I apologizing or defending the commission's position; I simply believe that'l can explain the members' thinking on the matter of opposing the state commission.

Simply stated, I believe the commission's first thought is that any control passed to the state and/or national government is control lost forever into the sea of swirling bureaucracy which plagues our country

As an alternative to a state commission, I believe it is the commission's feeling that local

rates can best be regulated locally, recognizing that there will be times when expert advice will be needed in certain decisions. The local commission in working with the Texas Municipal League, and the state legislature is hopeful that some sort of state expertise might be available to local cities in their rate-making decisions.

It appears that the state legislature now in the middle of its present term may or may not come up with a state commission bill, or it may come up with provisions which would make this expert counsel available to small cities.

And of course, it's possible that such machinery already exists in a system of working with the state attorney general's department and other existing offices to provide what Mr. Beil and the commission all

The fairest utility rates possible while allowing the utility companies a profit in keeping with a healthy business

lately that the regulation of utilities in Texas is ineffective. Advocates of a state utility commission are saying that since nearly all states have commissions, Texas must be illserved by local regulation. They say that rates would be lower if utilities were centrallycontrolled. But these beliefs are simply not true when viewed in the light ofall of the available

There's been a lot of talk

climate

facts.

Typical bill comparisons show that the cost of residential electricity sold by investorowned utilities in Texas is comparable to every state that surrounds us--New Mexico, Oklahoma, Arkansas and Louisiana--and in many cases lower. These states have comparable labor costs, comparable climate, comparable fuel availability--yet their rates are higher--and every one of these states has a state utility

They say that smaller cities don't regulate effectively and that rural areas aren't regulated at all. They say that rates in these areas are especially high. But the facts are that rates in the smaller cities and towns in Texas, served by investor owned electric utilities, are as low--and in many cases lower-than those in comparable areas in surrounding commission

Some companies do charge their rurual costomers more than they charge city dwellers. In the most extreme case, rural residents pay a maximum of \$1.25 per month more for electricity than urban residents served by the same company. But this difference is due to higher service costs -- a state commission could not change basic economic realities. Incidentally, no investor-owned electric utility in Texas has ever raised rural rates when it was not part of a general rate increase--approved by cities also served.

In Texas, we now have local regulation of rates and services. This regulation is carried out by local people--who are also customers--and who are, therefore, much better prepared to judge the quality and cost of service provided. The local company is responsive to local needs and everything it does is open to these local elected officials. It's a lot easier for a citizen to express his views to a local city council than to be heard before one commission in the state capitol that has to listen to people from all over the

Let's face it, the track record of state utility commissions has not been very good. They've gotten into every aspect of the utility's business. They've substituted bureaucracy for management. They control financing, accounting, advertising, plant siting, rate structures,

cannot create any new fuel supplies. A state commission cannot reduce construction costs. Nor can it make additional construction funds available. It can't stop inflation. In short, it cannot solve any of the major problems which are causing rates to rise. A state commission can, however, create and intensify many unnecessary problems. The results speak for themselves. Local regulation does work, and works well. Our rates are low, our service good. Sure, Texas is one of the few states that leaves regulation of utilities to the local people. But, Texas has traditionally been a leader, not a follower. And in any objective analysis of comparison between the adequacy and cost of utility service in our state and the average of other states with state commissions, Texas is ahead. Why should we take a backward step just to be




