## Texas Rangers To Play 30 Spring Games

The Texas Rangers will play 30 spring exhibition games in 1975, with possibility that three more contest in Mexico City will be added, it was announced today by General Mgrer Dan O'Brien.

O'Brien currently is negotiating to play games with the Mexico City Reds and the Mexico City Tigers on March 7, 8 and 9. If agreement is reached on those proposed games, the Rangers also will leave a squad at Pompano Beach to play in New York Yankees on March 7 and the Atlanta Braves on March 9.

The Rangers will play 13 games at Pompano Beach, their spring headquarters in Florida, and 14 other games in Florida. They will wrap up their exhibition season with three games against the Astros at Houston on April 4, 5 and 6 prior to their season opener at Arlington Stadium against the Minnesota Twins on Tuesday, April 8.

It will be a busy spring for Manager Bill Martin and his players. Once they start playing they will have only three open dates and they would be reduced to two if games in Mexico City materialize. The Rangers will split their squad on Sunday, March 30, playing the Baltimore Orioles at Pompano Beach and the New York Yankees at Fort Lauderdale.

The Rangers will play Atlanta six times, Baltimore and Houston five times each, the New York Yankees and Montreal four times each, Kansas City three times, Los Angeles twice and Minnesota once. They will play 17 games against National League clubs and 13 games against American League rivals, but only four games against clubs in their own West Division. The SCHEDULE:

Ten Eastland County pecan growers won seventeen ribbons at the Central Texas Regional Pecan Show in Forum 303 Shopping Center in Arlington. Winners in the county pecan show competed with winners in seventeen other county shows. Pecans from our county did very well in the tough competition.

The biggest honor going to a local grower was won by Mrs. C.E. Smith of Rising Star. She received the reserve champion in-shell rosette on her entry of Apache. Mrs. Smith also won a third place ribbon on a Brake entry and third on Known Hybrid.

Dan Childress of Eastland won three ribbons at the regional show. He won first in the Barton Class, second in the Burkett class, and third in the Wichita Class.

Another big winner was James Alexander whose orchard is between Rising Star and Pioneer. He had the heaviest native pecans, but they did not place among the top three natives. It only took 49.2 pecans to weigh one pound. Alexander won first place in the Halbert Class and third in the Texas Prolific class.

J.T. Wilson of Eastland received a first place ribbon in the Choctaw class. A Rising Star grower, Rex Hudson had the first place Delmas.

J.P. McCracken of Cisco won first with his entry of Texas Prolific. The Mohawk entry which was the champion in shell pecan of the county show placed second in its class at Arlington. The entry is owned by the Church of Christ in Ranger and was the second heaviest pecans in the show. Ben Freeman of Ranger won second in the Apache class. Martin Wende of Cisco won third in the Variety Seedling class.

Mrs. J.R. Keating of Cisco won second in the contest for the smallest pecans. It took 342.8 to weigh on pound.

Congratulations to the ten growers who won ribbons at the regional pecan show. They will now compete with winners of two other regional shows for the state honors.

The champion in-shell pecan at the regional show was a Mohawk owned by Dan Marrs of Weatherford. The champion shelling pecan was a Sioux owned by Nelson Hander of Belton while the champion native was exhibited by A.E. Bingham of Temple.

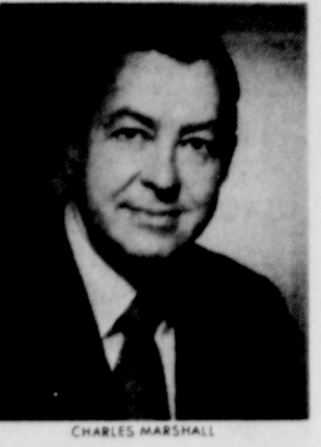

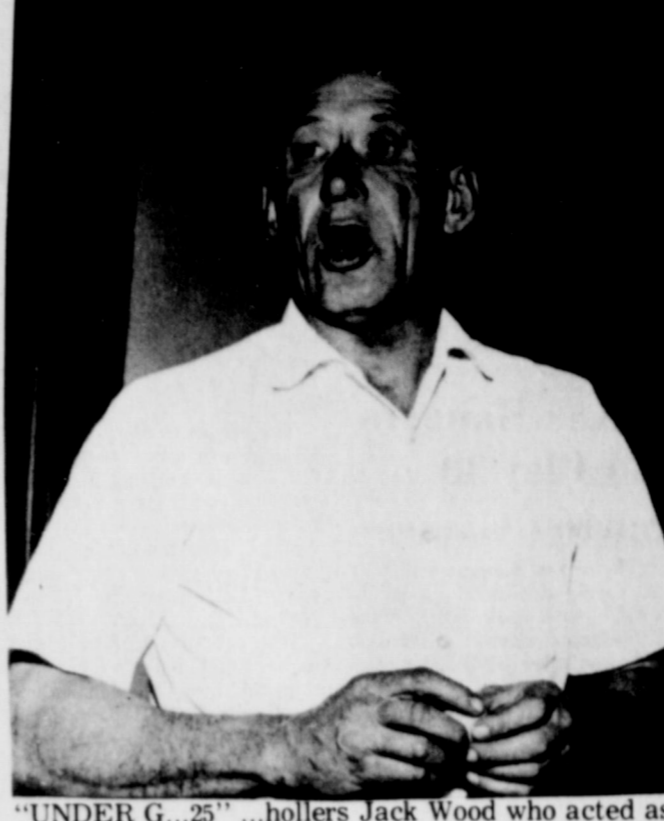

## Suggestions For "Between Holidays" Eating

COLLEGE STATION—As the holiday pace "slows" a bit, the hostess with imagination and "leftover energy" can make the week between holidays a special one—with some different ideas.

Mrs. Gwendolyn Clyatt, consumer marketing information specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System, offers these suggestions for "between-holidays" eating.

1 cup oil  
Keeps indefinitely!

**BRIGHT IDEA FOR LEFT OVER TURKEY**  
Cream the cut up turkey, add a bright touch of pimiento. Mix up waffle batter using 2 cups biscuit mix and adding a cup of whole kernel corn. In no time, creamed turkey on hot corn waffles.

**BROILED SHRIMP APPETIZERS**  
1 cup shredded sharp Cheddar cheese  
1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce  
1 1/2 oz. can shrimp, shredded  
2 tsp. cream  
1/2 cup sour cream  
2 tsp. grated onion  
Melt cheese in a saucepan over very low heat. Add cream and Worcestershire sauce and mix well. Remove from heat and add shrimp, sour cream, and grated onion. Spread on toasted bread cut in squares, diamonds, or rectangles and brown under the broiler. Serve at once topped with small pieces of pimiento if desired. Makes enough for about 2 dozen small sandwiches.

**HOT SPICED EGGNOG**  
While eggnog is readily available, take advantage of its tasty goodness and serve it as a snack with crackers or butter cookies...or for company with thinly sliced fruit cake.

To make 6 servings: combine 1 1/2 cups dairy eggnog, 1/2 cup milk, 1 stick cinnamon and one-eighth teaspoon of cloves in a saucepan. Heat just to the boiling point. Pour into cups and top with sweetened whipped cream and freshly ground nutmeg.

**EGGNOG FRENCH TOAST**  
A toast to the hostess who serves "Eggnog French Toast" She dips baker's raisin bread slices in dairy eggnog and skillet fires them in hot shortening. What a treat for a holiday brunch.

**CHOCOLATE COATED POPCORN BALLS**  
Mix 1 cup sugar, 1/2 cup water, 1/2 cup white corn syrup, 3 Tbsp. butter or margarine and 3 squares chocolate (grated). Cook to hard ball stage (254 degrees F.). Pour over 4 quarts

of freshly popped corn and mix quickly. Butter hands and shape into balls. Wrap each ball in different colors of cellophane. Arrange balls in basket or tray for a neighborly treat.

**PEPPERED NUTS**  
Saute one pound pecan nut meats in a little butter. Add 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce a dash of Tabasco, salt and white pepper. Toast in oven at 300 F. for about 20 minutes. Serve hot.

**STAND UP HOLIDAY COOKIES**  
Cut half of one batch of sugar cookie dough into fancy shapes—trees, Santas, snowmen; cut remainder in plain circles. Bake; frost shapes and decorate. Put a spoonful of frosting in center of round cookie; let harden slightly and stand decorated cookies upright.
